### A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the use and method of allocating funds  
2 appropriated for programs administered by the Iowa  
3 commission on alcoholism and making an appropriation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

5 Section 1. Chapter twenty-seven (27), Acts of the Sixty-  
6 fourth General Assembly, First Session, is amended by adding  
7 the following new sections:

8 "Funds appropriated pursuant to section one (1), subsection  
9 two (2) of this Act for the fiscal year commencing July 1,  
10 1972 and ending June 30, 1973 shall be allocated to the  
11 following named areas in the amounts specified:

12 1. The area composed of the counties of Sioux, Cherokee,  
13 Ida, Plymouth and Woodbury an amount not exceeding \$32,148.00.

14 2. The area composed of the counties of Monona, Harrison,  
15 Pottawattamie, Crawford, and Shelby an amount not exceeding  
16 \$26,516.00.

17 3. The area composed of the counties of Pocahontas, Wright,  
18 Calhoun, Hamilton, Greene, Guthrie, Madison, Humboldt, Sac,  
19 Webster, Carroll, Audubon, and Dallas an amount not exceeding  
20 \$41,383.00.

21 4. The area composed of the counties of Lyon, Dickinson,  
22 O'Brien, Palo Alto, Osceola, Emmet, Clay and Buena Vista an  
23 amount not exceeding \$20,913.00.

24 5. The area composed of the counties of Cass, Mills,  
25 Adams, Clarke, Page, Ringgold, Adair, Montgomery, Union,

- 1 Fremont, Taylor, and Decatur an amount not exceeding \$23,167.00.  
2 6. The area composed of the counties of Boone and Story  
3 an amount not exceeding \$15,849.00.  
4 7. The area composed of the counties of Polk, Lucas,  
5 Warren, and Wayne an amount not exceeding \$58,875.00.  
6 8. The area composed of the counties of Kossuth, Worth,  
7 Howard, Cerro Gordo, Winnebago, Mitchell, Hancock, and Floyd  
8 an amount not exceeding \$26,824.00.  
9 9. The area composed of the counties of Franklin, Grundy,  
10 Tama, Hardin, and Marshall an amount not exceeding \$19,613.00.  
11 10. The area composed of the counties of Jasper, Marion,  
12 Keokuk, Wapello, Davis, Poweshiek, Mahaska, Monroe, and  
13 Appanoose an amount not exceeding \$33,809.00.  
14 11. The area composed of the counties of Winneshiek,  
15 Chickasaw, Butler, Black Hawk, Allamakee, Fayette, Bremer,  
16 and Buchanan an amount not exceeding \$48,291.00.  
17 12. The area composed of the counties of Benton, Jones,  
18 and Linn an amount not exceeding \$36,546.00.  
19 13. The area composed of the counties of Iowa, Cedar,  
20 Johnson, and Washington an amount not exceeding \$22,049.00.  
21 14. The area composed of the counties of Clayton, Dubuque,  
22 Delaware, and Jackson an amount not exceeding \$26,702.00.  
23 15. The area composed of the county of Clinton an amount  
24 not exceeding \$10,045.00.  
25 16. The area composed of the counties of Muscatine and  
26 Scott an amount not exceeding \$31,943.00.  
27 17. The area composed of the counties of Louisa, Henry,  
28 Lee, Jefferson, Van Buren, and Des Moines an amount not  
29 exceeding \$25,327.00."  
30 "No part of the appropriation provided for the treatment  
31 of alcoholism in subsection two (2) of section one (1) of  
32 this Act shall be used for salaries, support and maintenance  
33 of the commission on alcoholism, excluding individuals employed  
34 by local alcoholism or detoxification units."  
35 "There is appropriated from the general fund of the state

1 to the Iowa commission on alcoholism for the fiscal year  
2 beginning July 1, 1972 and ending June 30, 1973 the sum of  
3 twenty thousand (20,000) dollars, or so much thereof as is  
4 necessary, to be used by the Iowa commission on alcoholism  
5 to fund programs of the Harrison treatment center of Des  
6 Moines, Iowa. Funds appropriated by this section shall be  
7 in addition to any other funds which may be available to the  
8 Iowa commission on alcoholism for allocation to the Harrison  
9 treatment center."

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EXPLANATION

This bill allocates the \$500,000 appropriated to the  
Commission on Alcoholism for local alcoholism programs provided  
for under section 123A.8 of the Code and Chapter 123B of the  
Code to specified areas of the state based upon population  
and provides an appropriation of \$20,000 for allocation to  
the Harrison Treatment Center in Des Moines, Iowa.

2 the Senate, as follows:

3 1. By striking everything after the enacting  
4 clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:  
5 "Section 1. Chapter one hundred thirty-one (131),  
6 section fifty-three (53), subsection three (3), Acts  
7 of the Sixty-fourth General Assembly, First Session,  
8 is amended by striking the subsection and inserting  
9 in lieu thereof the following:

10 3. The treasurer of state shall semiannually dis-  
11 tribute a sum of money equal to ten percent of the  
12 gross sales made by the state liquor stores in amounts  
13 as follows:

14 a. Nine percent thereof to the cities and towns of  
15 the state. Such amount shall be distributed to the  
16 cities and towns of the state in proportion to the  
17 population that each incorporated city or town bears  
18 to the total population of all incorporated cities and  
19 towns of the state as computed by the latest federal  
20 census. A city or town may have one special federal  
21 census taken each decade, and the population figure  
22 thus obtained shall be used in apportioning amounts  
23 under this subsection beginning the calendar years  
24 following the year in which the special census is cer-  
25 tified by the secretary of state. Such apportionment  
26 shall be made semiannually as of July first and Janu-  
27 ary first of each year. Warrants for the same shall  
28 be issued by the state comptroller upon certification  
29 of the treasurer of state and mailed to the city clerk  
30 of each incorporated city and town of the state and  
31 shall be made payable to such incorporated city or town  
32 and shall be subject to expenditure under the direction  
33 of the city council or other governing bodies of such  
34 incorporated city or town for any lawful municipal  
35 purpose. It shall be a lawful municipal purpose for  
36 cities and towns to allocate a portion of the above  
37 funds for the purpose of financing the activities of a  
38 city or town commission or committee on alcoholism,  
39 such commission or committee to be appointed by the  
40 mayor or by the council or both. The commission or  
41 committee may use any funds so allocated for the treat-  
42 ment, rehabilitation, and education of alcoholics in  
43 Iowa.

44 b. One percent thereof shall be allocated and paid  
45 quarterly to each county treasurer of those counties  
46 which participate in alcohol rehabilitation programs  
47 by agreement with the alcoholism service center for  
48 their area, and of those counties which have approval  
49 of the Iowa commission on alcoholism for the imple-  
50 mentation of alcoholic procedures and services.

51 The funds shall be distributed in an amount deter-  
52 mined by dividing the total population of each county  
53 by the total population of the state according to the  
54 latest federal decennial census.

55 c. Revenues allocated and paid pursuant to the pro-  
56 visions of paragraph b of this subsection shall be used  
57 for the following purposes:

58 (1) The rehabilitation of alcoholics pursuant to  
59 the provisions of chapter one hundred twenty-three B  
60 (123B) of the Code.

61 (2) The implementation of new alcoholic treatment  
62 procedures and services, pursuant to the provision of  
63 chapter one hundred twenty-three B (123B) of the Code.

64 The expenditure of funds by county boards of super-  
65 visors shall be reviewed by the Iowa commission on  
66 alcoholism.

67 d. The provisions of section eight point thirty-  
68 three (8.33) of the Code shall apply to the funds dis-  
69 tributed pursuant to paragraph a of this subsection,  
70 and such funds shall revert to the general fund of the  
71 state.

72 Sec. 2. The effective date of this Act shall be  
73 July 1, 1973."

3 "Sec. 2. Chapter one hundred thirty-one (131),  
4 section fifty-three (53), Acts of the Sixty-fourth  
5 General Assembly, First Session, is amended by adding  
6 the following new subsection:

7 a. There is appropriated to the Iowa commission  
8 on alcoholism, established in chapter one hundred  
9 twenty-three A (123A) of the Code, from the beer and  
10 liquor control fund a sum of money equal to three  
11 percent of the net profit from the sale of alcoholic  
12 liquors and beer and from the issuance of permits  
13 and licenses. When the state comptroller transfers  
14 moneys from the beer and liquor control fund to the  
15 general fund pursuant to subsection two (2) of this  
16 section, he shall transfer the moneys provided in  
17 this subsection to the Iowa commission on alcoholism.

18 b. The Iowa commission on alcoholism shall dis-  
19 tribute the moneys provided in this subsection to  
20 those counties which participate in programs approved  
21 by the commission for the treatment and rehabilitation  
22 of alcoholics, pursuant to the provisions of chapter  
23 one hundred twenty-three B (123B) of the Code. The  
24 moneys shall be distributed on a per capita basis in  
25 the proportion that the population of each eligible  
26 county is to the population of all eligible counties in  
27 the state, according to the latest federal decennial  
28 census. The moneys shall be paid quarterly to the  
29 county treasurers of each eligible county, and the  
30 board of supervisors of each eligible county shall  
31 submit an annual statement showing the expenditures  
32 of the funds, for review by the Iowa commission on  
33 alcoholism.

34 c. The provisions of section eight point thirty-  
35 three (8.33) of the Code apply to the moneys appro-  
36 priated in this subsection, except that unencumbered  
37 or unobligated balances shall revert to the general  
38 fund of the state.

39 d. The provisions of this subsection shall be-  
40 come effective July 1, 1973."
