A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the establishment and operation of solid
2 waste disposal grounds.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section three hundred thirty-two point thirty-
2 one (332.31), Code 1973, is amended to read as follows:

3 332.31 NEED DETERMINED. The board of supervisors of any
4 county may determine that a public solid waste disposal ground
5 is needed in their county and may make a finding as to where
6 such disposal ground shall be located.

7 Sec. 2. Section three hundred thirty-two point thirty-
8 two (332.32), Code 1973, is amended to read as follows:

9 332.32 TAX LEVY. Said boards may within their respec-
10 tive jurisdictions make a determination of ~~which-townships~~
11 ~~of how~~ the county will be best served by such disposal ground
12 and levy a tax of not to exceed ~~one-fourth~~ one-half mill on
13 all the property ~~in-said-townships~~ outside the incorporated
14 limits of any city or town or on all taxable property within
15 a city or town if authorized by resolution of such city or
16 town council for the purpose of acquiring and maintaining
17 such disposal grounds. Such funds shall be placed in a
18 township-dump solid waste disposal fund.

19 The tax levy authorized in this section upon the taxable
20 property of a city or town shall be in addition to the maxi-
21 mum levy limitation provided for in section four hundred four
22 point two (404.2) of the Code.

23 Sec. 3. Section three hundred thirty-two point thirty-
24 three (332.33), Code 1973, is amended to read as follows:

25 332.33 RULES. The board of supervisors may make such
26 rules and regulations for the use of such disposal grounds
27 as it shall deem necessary, and may adopt and enter into
28 ~~contractual~~ agreements under chapter twenty-eight E (28E)
29 of the Code with cities and towns for the use of such dis-
30 posal grounds. Any funds derived from such agreements shall
31 be placed in the township-dump solid waste disposal fund
32 established for that purpose and none other.

33 Sec. 4. Section three hundred thirty-two point thirty-
34 four (332.34), Code 1973, is amended to read as follows:

35 332.34 CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENTS. The county boards of su-

1 supervisors may enter into contractual agreements with cities
2 and towns, or with private corporations and persons for the
3 use by residents of the county residing outside of incorpo-
4 rated cities or towns, of dumps, disposal grounds, and sani-
5 tary land fills owned or operated by cities, towns, private
6 corporations or private individuals, and that funds from the
7 township-dump solid waste disposal fund may be used for such
8 purpose. County boards of supervisors may also use funds
9 from ~~said-township~~ the solid waste disposal fund, for the
10 purpose of acquiring, constructing, operating, and maintain-
11 ing, sanitary land fills.

EXPLANATION

12
13 This bill changes the designation of the township dump
14 or public disposal ground to a solid waste disposal ground
15 and authorizes the board of supervisors to locate a disposal
16 ground in the county without regard to township jurisdictions.
17 The tax levy to support the acquisition and maintenance of
18 the disposal ground is increased from one-fourth mill to one-
19 half mill on the taxable property outside cities and towns.

20 A city or town may, by resolution of the city or town
21 council, authorize the board of supervisors to levy the one-
22 half mill on property within such city or town for the support
23 of the disposal ground.
