1 Section 1. Section six hundred ten point six (610.6),
2 Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

3 610.6 OATH--COMPENSATION. The members thus appointed
4 shall take and subscribe an oath to be administered by one
5 of the judges of the supreme court to faithfully and
6 impartially discharge the duties of the office, ~~and shall~~
7 ~~receive their actual and necessary expenses.~~ The members
8 shall, in addition to receiving actual and necessary expenses,
9 set the per diem compensation for themselves and the temporary
10 examiners appointed under section six hundred ten point seven
11 (610.7) of the Code at a rate not exceeding forty dollars
12 per diem for each day actually engaged in the discharge of
13 their duties. Such duties shall include the traveling to
14 and from the place of examination, the preparation and
15 conducting of examinations, and the reading of the examina-
16 tion papers. The per diem authorized under this section shall
17 be reasonably apportioned in relation to the funds appropriated
18 to the board.

19 EXPLANATION

20 This bill allows the board of law examiners to set a per
21 diem of up to forty dollars for members of the board and for
22 temporary examiners appointed to assist in conducting the
23 bar examination.

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE COMPENSATION PAID TO MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF LAW EXAMINERS AND TEMPORARY EXAMINERS APPOINTED BY THE SUPREME COURT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section six hundred ten point six (610.6), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

610.6 OATH--COMPENSATION. The members thus appointed shall take and subscribe an oath to be administered by one of the judges of the supreme court to faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of the office, ~~and shall receive their actual and necessary expenses.~~ The members shall, in addition to receiving actual and necessary expenses, set the per diem compensation for themselves and the temporary examiners appointed under section six hundred ten point seven (610.7) of the Code at a rate not exceeding forty dollars per diem for each day actually engaged in the discharge of their duties. Such duties shall include the traveling to and from the place of examination, the preparation and conducting of examinations, and the reading of the examination papers. The per diem authorized under this section shall

be reasonably apportioned in relation to the funds appropriated to the board.
