### SENATE FILE 170 FISCAL NOTE

Date Prepared: February 7, 1975  
Requested by: Representative Husak - Senator Priebe  
Prepared in regard to Senate File 170 - An Act  
relating to the disposition of snowmobile registration  
fees. Following is the fiscal effect in dollars of the  
legislative proposal as required by Joint Rule 16.

Senate File 170 provides that 80% of the revenue from  
registration of snowmobiles shall be credited to the  
county conservation fund and the remaining 20% of such  
revenue shall be credited to the state conservation  
fund.

It is estimated that approximately \$270,000 was collected  
in 1974 from the registration of snowmobiles.

County conservation fund - \$216,000 (approx.)  
State conservation fund - 54,000 (approx.)

LEGISLATIVE FISCAL DIRECTOR

1 Section 1. Section three hundred twenty-one G point seven  
2 (321G.7), Code 1975, is amended by striking the section and  
3 inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4 321G.7 DISPOSITION OF FEES. The fees collected from the  
5 registration of snowmobiles shall be allocated as follows:

6 1. Eighty percent of the revenue from the fees shall be  
7 forwarded by the county recorder to the county treasurer who  
8 shall place such money in the county conservation fund. If  
9 a county has no county conservation board, such revenue shall  
10 be credited to the general fund of the county and expended  
11 by the board of supervisors for county conservation purposes  
12 only.

13 2. The remaining twenty percent of the revenue from the  
14 fees shall be forwarded by the county treasurer to the  
15 treasurer of state who shall credit such money to the state  
16 conservation fund.

17 EXPLANATION

18 The bill provides that eighty percent of the revenue from  
19 registration of snowmobiles shall be credited to the county  
20 conservation fund and the remaining twenty percent of such  
21 revenue shall be credited to the state conservation fund.  
22 If a county has no county conservation board, the county's  
23 share of the revenue shall be credited to the general fund  
24 of the county and used for conservation purposes.
