A BILL FOR

1 An Act setting the salary rate for designated state officials.
2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. The salary rates specified in this section
2 shall be in effect for the fiscal biennium commencing July
3 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1977 and for each fiscal year
4 after the fiscal year ending June 30, 1977 the salary rate
5 shall be the same as the rate commencing July 1, 1976 until
6 otherwise provided by the general assembly. Salaries provided
7 for in this section shall be paid from funds appropriated
8 to the department or office specified in this section, and
9 pursuant to any Act of the general assembly making such an
10 appropriation.

11 The following annual salary rates shall be paid to the
12 person holding the position indicated from funds appropriated
13 by the general assembly for such purpose:

28 Sec. 2. Section two point ten (2.10), subsections one
29 (1), two (2), and three (3), Code 1975, are amended to read
30 as follows:

31 1. Every member of the general assembly except the speaker
32 of the house and majority and minority floor leaders of the
33 senate and house shall receive an annual salary of ~~eight~~
34 thousand seven thousand six hundred dollars for each year
35 while serving as a member of the general assembly. The

1 majority and minority floor leaders of the senate and house
2 shall receive an annual salary of ~~nine-thousand-five-hundred~~
3 nine thousand twenty-five dollars for each year while serving
4 in such capacity. In addition, each such member shall receive
5 the sum of twenty dollars per day for expenses of office,
6 except travel, for each day the general assembly is in session
7 commencing with the first day of a legislative session and
8 ending with the day of final adjournment of each legislative
9 session as indicated by the journals of the house and senate.
10 However, members from Polk county shall receive ten dollars
11 per day. Travel expenses shall be paid at the rate established
12 by section 79.9 for actual travel in going to and returning
13 from the seat of government by the nearest traveled route
14 for not more than one time per week during a legislative
15 session. However, any increase from time to time in the
16 mileage rate established by section 79.9 shall not become
17 effective for members of the general assembly until the
18 convening of the next general assembly following the session
19 in which the increase is adopted; and this provision shall
20 prevail over any inconsistent provision of any present or
21 future statute.

22 2. The lieutenant governor shall receive an annual salary
23 of ~~twelve-thousand~~ eleven thousand four hundred dollars.
24 Personal expense and travel allowances shall be the same for
25 the lieutenant governor as for a senator.

26 The lieutenant governor while performing administrative
27 duties of the office of lieutenant governor when the general
28 assembly is not in session or serving as the president of
29 the senate during special sessions of the general assembly
30 shall receive sixty dollars per diem and reimbursement for
31 expenses incurred in performing such duties pursuant to the
32 appropriation made by the general assembly.

33 3. The speaker of the house shall receive an annual salary
34 of ~~twelve-thousand~~ eleven thousand four hundred dollars for
35 each year while serving as the speaker of the house. Expense

1 and travel allowances shall be the same for the speaker of
2 the house as provided for other members of the general
3 assembly.

4 EXPLANATION

5 This bill decreases the salaries of elected state officials
6 currently earning \$20,000 or more annually by ten percent
7 and provides a five percent decrease in salary for those
8 elected state officials currently earning less than \$20,000
9 annually.

FISCAL NOTE

Date Prepared: February 17, 1975
Requested by: Senator Schwengels
Prepared in regard to Senate File 191 - An Act
relating to setting the salary rate for
designated state officials. Following is the
fiscal effect in dollars of the legislative
proposal as required by Joint Rule 16.

Senate File 191 decreases the salaries of
elected officials currently earning \$20,000
or more annually by ten percent and provides
a five percent decrease in salary for those
elected state officials currently earning
less than \$20,000 annually.

It is estimated that there would be an
annual savings of approximately \$77,300.
