A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the salaries of employees of juvenile
2 courts.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section two hundred thirty-one point eight
2 (231.8), unnumbered paragraphs one (1), two (2) and four (4),
3 Code 1975, are amended to read as follows:

4 The judge designated as judge of the juvenile court in
5 any county, or where there is more than one judge designated
6 such judges acting jointly, may appoint such probation officers
7 as may be necessary to carry out the work of the court. In
8 counties where more than one officer is appointed one of such
9 officers shall be designated as chief probation officer.

10 The salaries of such officers shall be fixed by the judge
11 or judges making the appointments ~~but-in-no-case-shall-the~~
12 ~~salary-of-a-chief-probation-officer-exceed-sixteen-thousand~~
13 ~~dollars-per-year-nor-shall-the-salary-of-a-deputy-probation~~
14 ~~officer-exceed-fourteen-thousand-dollars-per-year.~~

15 Probation officers may be appointed to serve two or more
16 counties. The salaries of such officers and their deputies,
17 if any, shall be fixed by the judges of the judicial district
18 who are designated juvenile court judges for such counties
19 and such salaries and the expenses of the probation offices
20 shall be prorated among the counties served in such proportion
21 as may be determined by said judges who shall in making such
22 determination, consider the volume of work in the several
23 counties. ~~Such-officers-may-be-paid-not-to-exceed-fourteen~~
24 ~~thousand-dollars-per-year.~~

25 Such secretarial and , clerical, and other help as may
26 be needed in the administration of any probation office may
27 be appointed by the judge or judges of the juvenile court
28 ~~who-may-fix-their-salaries,-subject-to-the-approval-of-the~~
29 ~~board-of-supervisors,-at-not-more-than-nine-thousand-dollars~~
30 ~~per-year.~~

31 Sec. 2. Section two hundred thirty-one point eight (231.8),
32 Code 1975, is amended by adding the following new unnumbered
33 paragraph:

34 NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. The salaries of all employees
35 of the juvenile courts shall be fixed by the juvenile court

1 judges within minimum and maximum limits prescribed by the
2 supreme court pursuant to section six hundred eighty-four
3 point twenty-one (684.21) of the Code. For the purpose of
4 accomplishing such limits the supreme court may appoint an
5 advisory salary committee which shall include three juvenile
6 court judges, three probation officers and such other members
7 as may be deemed necessary in order to effect adequate and
8 uniform salaries in the several juvenile courts of the state.

9 EXPLANATION

10 This bill eliminates the statutory limitations on salaries
11 of juvenile court employees, and requires that the respective
12 judges of juvenile court establish those salaries within
13 limits prescribed by the supreme court. This bill differs
14 from LSB 1393 in that this bill does not provide for a
15 temporary statutory increase in salary ceilings.
