A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to registration of motor vehicles
 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. Section three hundred twenty-one point thirty
2 (321.30), Code 1975, is amended by adding the following new
3 subsection:

4 NEW SUBSECTION.

5 a. That there is a warrant outstanding for the arrest
6 of the owner of the motor vehicle out of any court located
7 within the county in which application is being made and that
8 the warrant arises out of an alleged violation of the
9 provisions of section three hundred twenty-one point two
10 hundred thirty-six (321.236), subsection one (1) of this
11 chapter, if the county supervisors of the county in which
12 application is being made have prior to the making of the
13 application adopted a resolution finding that in such county
14 lack of response of the citizens of the county to citations
15 for violations of motor vehicle laws and ordinances has become
16 a significant problem and directing the county treasurer of
17 the county which has adopted a resolution to enforce this
18 provision within such county. The action adopting the
19 resolution may be rescinded by another resolution of the board
20 of supervisors finding the problem to have significantly
21 abated and directing termination of enforcement of the first
22 resolution.

23 b. Each court in the state located in a county which has
24 adopted a resolution relating to outstanding warrants as
25 provided in paragraph a of this subsection shall, on or before
26 the fifth day of each month, submit to the county treasurer
27 of the county in which the court is located, an alphabetized
28 list of all persons against whom an arrest warrant has been
29 issued and is outstanding. It is the duty of the county
30 auditor in each county which has adopted a resolution to
31 advise the clerk of each court that a resolution relating
32 to outstanding warrants as provided in paragraph a of this
33 subsection has been approved and the effective date of the
34 resolution or of any rescission and the effective date of
35 the resolution making the rescission of the first resolu-

1 tion.

2 c. This subsection shall only apply to counties with a
3 population of fifty thousand or more.

4 EXPLANATION

5 This bill allows the county treasurer to refuse to issue
6 a license when there is an outstanding warrant against the
7 applicant for a license. It is a county option provision.

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
