1 Section 1. Section one hundred eleven B point eleven
2 (111B.11), unnumbered paragraph one (1), Code 1975, is amended
3 to read as follows:

4 An area designated as a preserve within the system is

7 not be alienated except to another public use upon a finding
8 by the board of imperative and unavoidable public necessity

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ALIENATION OF PRESERVES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section one hundred eleven B point eleven (111B.11), unnumbered paragraph one (1), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

An area designated as a preserve within the system is hereby declared put to its highest, best, and most important use for public benefit. It shall be held in trust and shall not be alienated except to another public use upon a finding by the board of imperative and unavoidable public necessity and with the approval of the state conservation commission, the general assembly by concurrent resolution, and the governor. The board's interest or interests in any area designated as a preserve shall not be taken under the condemnation statutes of this state without such a finding of imperative and unavoidable public necessity by the board, and with the consent of the state conservation commission, the general assembly by concurrent resolution, and the governor.
