Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the state comptroller for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1976 and ending June 30, 1977 the sum of three thousand five hundred (3,500) dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the purpose of providing funds for the publication of a current edition of the booklet "Tax Levies, Expenditures, and Budgets".
