8 restoration of one painting and purchase of a microfilmer.

10 in the amount of \$65,152 allows for the continuation of current  
11 programs and adds one historical planner and one Secretary  
12 I. The state appropriation to this division is matched with  
13 federal funds on a 50-50 basis.

14 Funds appropriated to the division of the state historical  
15 society in the amount of \$324,163 allow for the continuation  
16 of current programs and adds no new positions.

17 Funds are appropriated for Montauk Governor's Mansion in  
18 the amount of \$34,988 for operating expenses for the following  
19 purposes: one site administrator; one guide with clerical  
20 skills; two guides per season; \$22,000 for fringe benefits  
21 and support of employees; printing and publishing of highway  
22 signs, brochures, and advertising; artifact processing,  
23 restoration, and conservation; and equipment and supplies.

24 The sum of \$12,750 is provided for capital improvements

funds in the general fund of the state an amount necessary to pay the reasonable expense incurred under this subsection.
