Prepared in regard to Senate File 1189, An Act prohibiting full-time state employees from receiving per diem in addition to the compensation from their employing agency for service on committees, boards, commissions or similar duty.

Following is the fiscal effect in dollars of the legislative proposal as required by Joint Rule 16.

Currently, any per diem for such employee is not paid. If it were to be paid in accordance with the Attorney General's opinion of September 12, 1975, the cost is estimated to be between \$75,000 and \$100,000 per year.

If Senate File 1189 is passed, there would be an apparent saving to the state of \$25,000 to \$100,000 per year.

1 Section 1. Section seventy-nine point one (79.1), unnum-  
2 bered paragraph one (1), Code 1975, as amended by Acts of  
3 the Sixty-sixth General Assembly, 1975 Session, chapter ninety  
4 (90), section fourteen (14), is amended to read as follows:

5 Salaries specifically provided for in an appropriation  
6 Act of the general assembly shall be in lieu of existing  
7 statutory salaries, for the positions provided for in any  
8 such Act, and all salaries, including longevity where  
9 applicable by express provision in the Code, shall be paid  
10 according to the provisions of this Act and shall be in full  
11 compensation of all services, ~~except-as-otherwise-expressly~~  
12 provided including any service on committees, boards,  
13 commissions or similar duty for Iowa government, except for  
14 members of the general assembly. All employees of the state  
15 including highway maintenance employees of the state department  
16 of transportation shall earn two weeks' vacation per year  
17 during the first year of employment and through the fourth  
18 year of employment, and three weeks' vacation per year during  
19 the fifth and through the eleventh year of employment, and  
20 four weeks' vacation per year during the twelfth year and  
21 all subsequent years of employment, with pay. One week  
22 vacation shall be equal to the number of hours in the  
23 employee's normal work week. Vacation allowances shall be  
24 accrued according to the provisions of this Act as provided  
25 by the rules of the Iowa merit employment department. Said  
26 vacations shall be granted at the discretion and convenience  
27 of the head of the department, agency or commission, except  
28 that in no case may an employee be granted vacation in excess  
29 of the amount earned by him. In the event that the employment  
30 of an employee of the state is terminated the provisions of  
31 this Act relating to such termination shall apply.

32 EXPLANATION

33 This bill amends chapter ninety of the Acts of the Sixty-  
34 sixth General Assembly, 1975 Session, to provide that full-  
35 time state employees are prohibited from receiving per diem

1 in addition to the compensation from their employing agency  
2 for service on committees, boards, commissions or similar  
3 duty for Iowa government. The bill further provides that  
4 members of the general assembly shall not be subject to the  
5 provisions of this Act.

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
