A BILL FOR

1 An Act establishing the method for setting salaries of certain
2 appointed, nonelected state officials and setting a salary
3 range for certain appointed, nonelected state officials
4 and designated appointed, nonelected employees of the
5 state and providing for the governor to set salaries
6 within such ranges and expanding the use of funds appro-
7 priated by the general assembly.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. The governor may establish a salary for
2 appointed nonelected persons in the executive branch of
3 government holding the position within a range provided in
4 this Act by considering among other things, whether the person
5 receiving the salary is temporary or permanent, or acting
6 full or part time, the experience of the individual in the
7 position, changes in the duties of the position, the
8 incumbent's performance of assigned duties, the availability
9 of qualified candidates for the position, and subordinates'
10 salaries.

11 The governor in establishing salaries as provided in this
12 Act shall take into consideration other employee benefits
13 which may be provided for an individual including but not
14 limited to housing.

15 The director of the commission for the blind and the secre-
16 tary of the state fair board may be furnished housing in addi-
17 tion to their salaries.

18 Sec. 2. The following annual salary ranges shall be in
19 effect for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1976 and ending
20 June 30, 1977 for the positions specified, the governor shall
21 specify the salary to be paid to the person indicated at a
22 rate within the salary ranges indicated from funds appropriated
23 by the general assembly for such purposes:

22 Sec. 3. Notwithstanding any laws of this state, the pro-
23 visions of this Act shall govern for the fiscal year 1976-
24 1977. The salary rates established by the governor under
25 this Act for the persons indicated shall be the total salary
26 paid for the persons for whom established during the fiscal
27 year 1976-1977. Any salary rates or adjustments to salaries
28 provided for by any other Act of the Sixty-sixth General
29 Assembly, 1976 Session, shall not apply to the positions
30 specified in this Act, however funds appropriated for salaries,
31 salary increases or adjustments to salaries by any other Act
32 of the Sixty-sixth General Assembly, 1976 Session, may be
33 expended to fund salaries provided for by this Act if funds
34 appropriated to the agencies represented by or employing the
35 persons holding the positions specified in this Act are

1 insufficient to pay salaries provided for in this Act.
 2 Sec. 4. The governor shall report to the legislative
 3 council the salary rates established pursuant to the provi-
 4 sions of this Act.
 5 Sec. 5. Funds appropriated by the general assembly may
 6 be used for the granting of an educational leave upon the
 7 approval of the director of the department and the governor.
 8 The state comptroller shall notify the legislative fiscal
 9 bureau of all educational leaves granted within fifteen days
 10 of the granting of the educational leave. Failure to notify
 11 the legislative fiscal bureau of an educational leave shall
 12 preclude use of funds appropriated by the general assembly
 13 for the educational leave.
