3 by adding the following new paragraph:

4 NEW PARAGRAPH. Prazepam.

5 EXPLANATION

6 This bill will add to schedule IV of the Uniform Controlled
7 Substances Act (section 204.210 of the Code) prazepam, a
8 substance which has been similarly controlled by federal
9 authorities. Pursuant to the federal action, this substance
10 has been temporarily added to schedule IV by the State Board
11 of Pharmacy Examiners in accordance with section 204.201(4).
12 That temporary control will expire sixty days after the
13 convening of the 1978 Session of the General Assembly.
