Requested by: Senator Schwengels

Prepared in regard to Senate File 118, An Act declaring the multiflora rose to be a noxious weed.

Following is the fiscal effect in dollars of the legislative proposal as required by Joint Rule 16.

Declaring multiflora rose a noxious weed as called for in S.F. 118, there would be no additional cost to the State of Iowa since the Iowa Weed Law in Chapter 317, Code of Iowa 1977, places that responsibility on the County Board of Supervisors and the County Weed Commissioners to carry out the destruction of all noxious and secondary noxious weeds. Where each owner and each person in possession or control of land does not perform that duty, the County Board of Supervisors can after due notice cause the weeds to be destroyed and recover the cost by an assessment against the tract of real estate on which the weeds were grown. The Iowa Weed Law is structured so that any additional weed problem does not cause additional expense to the State of Iowa.
