## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act increasing fees for permits to carry weapons.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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S.F. 195

1 Section 1. Chapter one thousand two hundred forty-five  
2 (1245), Acts of the Sixty-sixth General Assembly, 1976 Session,  
3 chapter one (1), section two thousand four hundred ten (2410),  
4 is amended to read as follows:

5 SEC. 2410. NEW SECTION. ISSUANCE OF PERMIT. Applications  
6 for permits to carry weapons shall be made to the sheriff  
7 of the county in which the applicant resides. Applications  
8 from persons who are nonresidents of the state, or whose need  
9 to go armed arises out of employment by the state, shall be  
10 made to the commissioner of public safety. In either case,  
11 the issuance of the permit shall be by and at the discretion  
12 of the sheriff or commissioner, who shall, before issuing  
13 the permit, determine that the requirements of sections two  
14 thousand four hundred five (2405) through two thousand four  
15 hundred nine (2409), inclusive, of this division have been  
16 satisfied. However, the training program requirements in  
17 sections two thousand four hundred seven (2407) of this  
18 division may be waived for renewal permits. The issuing  
19 officer shall collect a fee of ~~three~~ five dollars, except  
20 from a duly appointed peace officer, for each permit issued.  
21 Renewal permits shall be issued for a fee of ~~one-dollar~~ two  
22 dollars. The issuing officer shall notify the commissioner  
23 of public safety of the issuance of any permit at least monthly  
24 and forward to the commissioner an amount equal to two dollars  
25 for each permit issued and one dollar for each renewal permit  
26 issued. All such fees received by the commissioner shall  
27 be paid to the treasurer of state and deposited in the  
28 operating account of the department of public safety to offset  
29 the cost of administering this division. Any unspent balance  
30 as of June thirtieth of each year shall revert to the general  
31 fund as provided by section eight point thirty-three (8.33)  
32 of the Code.

33 Sec. 2. This Act is effective on the date set forth in  
34 chapter one thousand two hundred forty-five (1245), Acts of  
35 the Sixty-sixth General Assembly, 1976 Session, chapter four

1 (4), section five hundred twenty-nine (529).

2 EXPLANATION

3 This bill increases the fee for a permit to carry weapons  
4 from \$3 to \$5 with \$2 of that going to the Department of  
5 Public Safety to defray costs. The bill also increases the  
6 fee for a renewal permit from \$1 to \$2 with \$1 of that going  
7 to the Department of Public Safety.

Prepared in regard to Senate File 195, An Act increasing  
fees for permits to carry weapons.

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Following is the fiscal effect in dollars of the legislative  
proposal as required by Joint Rule 16.

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S.F. 195 increases the fee for a permit to carry weapons from \$3 to  
\$5 with \$2 of that going to the Department of Public Safety to defray  
costs S.F. 195 would also increase the fee for a renewal permit from  
\$1 to \$2 with \$1 of that going to the Department of Public Safety.

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First year income will be approximately \$56,000 (28,000 permits x \$2).  
First year expense includes forms for all permits issued by commissioner  
and sheriffs and for all weapons purchased.

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Net fiscal effect -- this income is expected to offset the above  
expenses.

AN ACT

INCREASING FEES FOR PERMITS TO CARRY WEAPONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Chapter one thousand two hundred forty-five (1245), Acts of the Sixty-sixth General Assembly, 1976 Session, chapter one (1), section two thousand four hundred ten (2410), is amended to read as follows:

SEC. 2410. NEW SECTION. ISSUANCE OF PERMIT. Applications for permits to carry weapons shall be made to the sheriff of the county in which the applicant resides. Applications from persons who are nonresidents of the state, or whose need to go armed arises out of employment by the state, shall be made to the commissioner of public safety. In either case, the issuance of the permit shall be by and at the discretion of the sheriff or commissioner, who shall, before issuing the permit, determine that the requirements of sections two thousand four hundred five (2405) through two thousand four hundred nine (2409), inclusive, of this division have been satisfied. However, the training program requirements in section two thousand four hundred seven (2407) of this division may be waived for renewal permits. The issuing officer shall collect a fee of three five dollars, except from a duly appointed peace officer, for each permit issued. Renewal permits shall be issued for a fee of one-dollar two dollars. The issuing officer shall notify the commissioner of public safety of the issuance of any permit at least monthly and forward to the commissioner an amount equal to two dollars for each permit issued and one dollar for each renewal permit issued. All such fees received by the commissioner shall be paid to the treasurer of state and deposited in the operating account of the department of public safety to offset

the cost of administering this division. Any unspent balance as of June thirtieth of each year shall revert to the general fund as provided by section eight point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code.

Sec. 2. This Act is effective on the date set forth in chapter one thousand two hundred forty-five (1245), Acts of the Sixty-sixth General Assembly, 1976 Session, chapter four (4), section five hundred twenty-nine (529).
