1 An Act relating to and making appropriations to agencies,
2 institutions, commissions, departments, and boards
3 responsible for education programs in this state.
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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S.F. 214

1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund
2 of the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1977 and
3 ending June 30, 1978, except as otherwise provided for in
4 this section, the following sums, or so much thereof as may
5 be necessary, to be used by the following agencies for the
6 purposes designated:

4 priating funds pursuant to section six (6) of this Act is
5 to provide additional funds, if needed, during the 1978 Ses-
6 sion of the general assembly for the purchase of fuel and
7 electricity if the costs for fuel and electricity will exceed
8 thirteen million nine thousand (13,009,000) dollars for 1977-
9 78. Any funds remaining which are in excess of such estimated
10 fuel and electricity costs during 1977-78 may be used for
11 other purposes such as maintenance, equipment, and

5 EXPLANATION

6 Section 1.

7 Iowa Commission for the Blind

8 The \$724,900 appropriation provides funding for 114 full-
9 time equivalent positions plus support costs.

10 Bonus Board

11 The \$40,000 appropriation funds the war orphans' educa-
12 tional aid at the anticipated usage level. Any unused moneys
13 from this appropriation will revert.

14 The \$30,000 appropriation for salaries and support is for
15 the six-month period July 1, 1977 to December 31, 1977. It
16 is intended that the bonus board will cease at the end of
17 this six-month period. Separate legislation is anticipated
18 regarding the restructuring of this agency for other purposes.

19 Department of General Services--ETV

20 The \$3,792,500 appropriated includes funds necessary for
21 the new transmitter installations scheduled to come on line.
22 Three segments--Administration, Programming, and Technical-
23 -have been separately addressed in reaching the appropriation
24 level, but have been appropriated in one figure to give the
25 agency maximum operational flexibility.

26 Section 2.

27 Higher Education Facilities Commission

28 The \$204,200 appropriation provides funding for 12 full-
29 time equivalent positions plus support costs.

30 Tuition Grant Program

31 The \$500,000 appropriation is in addition to the \$10,000,000
32 standing limited funds available for this program.

33 Section 3.

34 Optometric Assistance Program

35 The \$60,000 appropriation is directed to continue this

1 program for the students starting in 1976 and provides another
2 \$30,000 for the 1977 class under the same rules as found in
3 the Code for the 1976 class. Provisions for payment of funds
4 includes delivery of specific financial audits to the
5 legislative fiscal bureau.

6 Section 4.

7 College of Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery Subvention

8 This provision of financial assistance or support to assist
9 an enterprise deemed advantageous to the public includes
10 funding for each of three classes at a level of \$400,000.
11 Provisions for payment of this subvention include delivery
12 of specific financial audits to the legislative fiscal bureau.

13 Section 5

14 Department of Public Instruction

15 1. To fund the following areas for salaries and support
16 costs with changes in nonstate funds taken into account at
17 department estimates.

- 18 a. General Office Administration.
- 19 b. Vocational Education Administration.
- 20 c. Professional Teaching Practices Commission.

21 2. To continue funding the following areas at the cur-
22 rent level.

- 23 a. Migrant Education.
- 24 b. Vocational Youth Organization Fund.

26 3. To fund the following areas at levels anticipated by
27 departments. Any unspent funds will revert.

32 the Governor's recommended levels.

4 Section 6.

5 Board of Regents

6 Funds are appropriated to the state board of regents and
7 institutions under the jurisdiction of the board in amounts
8 to fund all operational salaries at the current level of
9 operation plus \$2,000,000 allocated from the \$2,900,000
10 appropriation for federal funds losses replacement in 1976-
11 77. An inflation factor is included for nonsalary items.
12 Changes in nonstate funds estimated for 1977-78 including
13 tuition and fee increases were included at the Governor's
14 estimates.

15 Section 7 establishes legislative intent regarding costs
16 of fuel and electricity for 1977-78. The option of use of
17 any savings for other purposes is intended to provide an
18 incentive to save on fuel costs.


