A BILL FOR

1 An Act to establish a community education program.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. TITLE. This Act shall be known
2 and may be cited as the "Iowa community education act".

3 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. PURPOSE. It is the purpose of this
4 Act to provide educational, recreational, cultural, and other
5 community services and programs through the establishment
6 of the concept of community education with the community
7 school serving as the center for such activity. In cooperation
8 with other community agencies and groups, it is the purpose
9 of the community education act to mobilize community resources
10 to solve identified community concerns and to promote a more
11 efficient and expanded use of existing school buildings and
12 equipment, to provide leadership in working with other
13 entities, to mobilize the human and financial resources of
14 a community, and to provide a wide range of opportunities
15 for all socio-economic, ethnic, and age groups. A related
16 purpose of this Act is to develop a sense of community in
17 which the citizenry cooperates with the school and community
18 agencies and groups to resolve their school and community
19 concerns and to recognize that the schools belong to the
20 people, and that as the entity located in every neighborhood,
21 the schools are available for use by the community day and
22 night, year-round or any time when the programming will not
23 interfere with the elementary and secondary program.

24 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. DEFINITIONS. As used in this Act
25 unless the context otherwise requires:

26 1. "Community education" means a life-long education
27 process concerning itself with every facet that affects the
28 well-being of all citizens within a given community. It
29 extends the role of the school from one of teaching children
30 through an elementary and secondary program to one of providing
31 for citizen participation in identifying the wants, needs,
32 and concerns of the neighborhood community and coordinating
33 all educational, recreational, and cultural opportunities
34 within the community with community education being the
35 catalyst for providing for citizen participation in the

1 development and implementation of programs toward the goal
2 of improving the entire community.

3 Community education energizes people to strive for the
4 achievement of determined goals and stimulates capable persons
5 to assume leadership responsibilities. It welcomes and works
6 with all groups, it draws no lines. It is the one institution
7 in the entire community that has the opportunity to reach
8 all people and groups and to gain their cooperation.

9 2. "Community school" means any elementary or secondary
10 school.

11 3. "Community" means the area located within the boundaries
12 of the local school district.

13 4. "State consultant" means the state community education
14 consultant.

15 5. "Department" means the department of public instruction.

16 6. "State advisory council" means the council established
17 by section six (6) of this Act.

18 7. "Director" means the local community school director
19 who assumes responsibility for making the process function
20 effectively.

21 8. "District-wide advisory council" means a broadly-
22 representative group of persons selected from the entire
23 school district with at least one representative from each
24 of the local advisory councils after they are formed.

25 9. "Local advisory council" means a broadly-representative
26 group of persons living within the attendance boundaries of
27 an individual neighborhood school.

28 10. "Board" means the local board of directors of school
29 districts.

30 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. STATE CONSULTANT. State consultant
31 of community education shall serve district and local advisory
32 councils in accordance with rules promulgated by the
33 superintendent of public instruction and in compliance with
34 public law 93-380.

35 Sec. 5. NEW SECTION. LOCAL DIRECTOR. The local community

1 education director shall:

2 1. Serve as staff person to district-wide and local
3 advisory councils.

4 2. Promote, publicize, and interpret the community
5 education programs to the schools and community.

6 3. Facilitate community needs and resources after adequate
7 assessment.

8 4. Seek ideas, promote people involvement in the process,
9 and open lines of communication and coordination.

10 5. Stimulate planning to meet needs.

11 6. Schedule community-use hours available in school-plant
12 facilities and related equipment and coordinates such use
13 with building principals or designated representatives.

14 7. Prepare the community education budget in concert and
15 with approval of the district-wide advisory council, and
16 administers the budget after final approval by the board of
17 directors.

18 Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. STATE ADVISORY COUNCIL.

19 1. The state advisory council is established consisting
20 of nine members appointed by the state board of public
21 instruction for three-year terms. The purpose of the community
22 school advisory council is to promote educational,
23 recreational, cultural and other community services through
24 the maximum use of school facilities. The state council shall
25 consist of members who are broadly representative of the
26 educational, cultural, and social entites of the state.
27 Members shall be appointed from various geographic locations
28 throughout the state and shall represent various socio-
29 economic, ethnic, and age groups. Terms of office shall
30 commence on July first of the year in which the appointment
31 is made and shall continue until a successor is appointed
32 and qualifies. However, for the initial council, three members
33 shall be appointed for three-year terms, three members for
34 two-year terms, and three members for one-year terms.
35 Vacancies occurring on the state council shall be filled for

1 the unexpired term in the same manner as the original
2 appointment.

3 2. The members of the state council shall serve without
4 compensation, but shall be reimbursed for actual expenses
5 and travel incurred while the member is on official business
6 of the state council.

7 3. The members of the council shall meet annually as soon
8 after July first, as possible to organize at a time and place
9 designated by the state consultant. Thereafter, meetings
10 may be called by the chairperson or a majority of members.
11 The state council shall elect a chairperson and such other
12 officers as it deems necessary. The state consultant shall
13 serve as secretary for the state council.

14 Sec. 7. NEW SECTION. DUTIES OF STATE COUNCIL. The state
15 council shall:

16 1. Establish and maintain close cooperation and
17 understanding among the various groups throughout the state
18 affected by community education programs.

19 2. Provide a forum for the discussion, development, and
20 recommendation of public policy alternatives for community
21 education programs.

22 3. Serve as a clearinghouse for information on matters
23 relating to community education programs and similar programs
24 throughout the United States.

25 4. Serve as a clearinghouse for resource persons,
26 associations, and groups of all kinds, coordinating assistance
27 to school districts which have specific needs.

28 5. Provides an annual report to the state board of public
29 instruction.

30 6. Perform other functions necessary to insure the orderly
31 and coordinated development of community school programs in
32 the state.

33 Sec. 8. NEW SECTION. DUTIES OF DISTRICT-WIDE ADVISORY
34 COUNCIL. The district-wide advisory council shall:

35 1. Provide guidance to local advisory councils, training

- 1 and orientation for community persons, evaluation and
- 2 assessment of needs and delivery systems for school districts.
- 3 2. Develop a "sense of total community" and promote
- 4 democratic thinking and action.
- 5 3. Promote meaningful involvement of total community in
- 6 the identifying, prioritizing, and resolving of school-
- 7 community concerns.
- 8 4. Serve as an advocate of community education and foster
- 9 community cooperation.
- 10 5. Provide an annual budget recommendation and annual
- 11 report to the local board of education.
- 12 6. Mobilize available human and financial resources of
- 13 the community to meet needs, interests, and concerns of people
- 14 in the total community.
- 15 7. Make school facilities and resources available to all
- 16 age groups from the total community, day and night, year
- 17 round.
- 18 8. Facilitate the assessment of community-wide needs with
- 19 the understanding that local advisory councils will manage
- 20 their own assessments of needs.
- 21 9. Provide support and act as a resource group for local
- 22 advisory councils and the community education director.
- 23 10. Help plan and recommend a community education budget
- 24 for approval by the local board of education.
- 25 11. Recommend to board regulations, guidelines, and fees,
- 26 if any, for facility useage.
- 27 12. Define short and long-range community education goals
- 28 and objectives.
- 29 13. Communicate through inquiring, informing, suggesting,
- 30 recommending and evaluating community education for the
- 31 community.
- 32 14. Cooperate with other agencies and organizations
- 33 including the merged area schools toward common goals.
- 34 15. Perform the functions of the local advisory council
- 35 in the event that the board determines that the size of the

1 district does not warrant the establishment of a local advisory
2 council.

3 Sec. 9. NEW SECTION. DUTIES OF LOCAL ADVISORY COUNCIL.

4 The local advisory council shall:

5 1. Determine needs and priorities and provide programs
6 to serve the needs of the community located within the
7 attendance boundaries of an individual school.

8 2. Provide programming which is available to any community
9 resident.

10 3. Promote meaningful involvement of the total neighborhood
11 community in its identification and resolution of school and
12 community concerns.

13 4. Mobilize available human and financial resources of
14 the community to meet the wants and needs in that neighborhood
15 community.

16 5. Use existing programs and community resources for
17 delivery of services whenever feasible.

18 6. Use funds as allocated by district-wide advisory council
19 after budget approval by board.

20 7. Evaluate the success of programs in meeting needs,
21 interests, and concerns and in resolving responsible needs
22 and concerns.

23 Sec. 10. NEW SECTION. ESTABLISHMENT OF PROGRAM.

24 1. The board of directors of a local school district may
25 establish a community education program for schools in the
26 district and provide for the general supervision of the
27 program. The board shall provide funding pursuant to chapter
28 three hundred (300) of the Code. The program which recognizes
29 that the schools belong to the people and which shall be
30 centered in the schools may include but shall not be limited
31 to the use of the school facilities day and night, year round
32 including weekends and regular school vacation periods for
33 educational, recreational, cultural, and other community
34 services and programs for all age, ethnic, and socio-economic
35 groups residing in the community.

1 2. If a community education program is established, the
2 board shall appoint a community education director who shall
3 have professional training in the field of community education
4 or comparable experience.

5 3. Upon establishment of a community education program,
6 the board shall provide for the selection of a district-wide
7 advisory council which shall be responsible to the board and
8 shall cooperate with and assist the board and the local
9 community education director. The board shall also provide
10 for the selection of local advisory councils.

11 4. The board shall receive an annual report and budget
12 recommendation from the district-wide advisory council and
13 may request supplementary reports as needed.

14 5. The school districts may cooperate with merged area
15 schools and area education agencies in providing community
16 education programs.

17 6. The board may use opportunities available under public
18 law 93-380.

19 7. The board may approve cooperation and pooling of funds
20 with other school districts.

21 Sec. 11. NEW SECTION. FUNDING OF COMMUNITY EDUCATION
22 CONCEPT. Residents of the affected school district shall
23 determine if community education will function in their
24 community by providing for funding pursuant to chapter three
25 hundred (300) of the Code.

26 Sec. 12. Section two hundred eighty-five point one (285.1),
27 subsection twenty-one (21), Code 1977, is amended to read
28 as follows:

29 21. Boards in districts operating buses may in their
30 discretion transport senior citizens, children, and handicapped
31 and other persons and groups, who are not otherwise entitled
32 to free transportation, and shall collect the pro rata cost
33 of transportation. Transportation under this subsection shall
34 not be provided when the school bus is being used to transport
35 pupils to or from school unless the board determines that

1 such transportation is desirable and will not interfere with
2 or delay the transportation of pupils.

3 Sec. 13. Section two hundred eighty-five point ten
4 (285.10), subsection nine (9), Code 1977, is amended to read
5 as follows:

6 9. In the discretion of the board, furnish a school bus
7 and services of a qualified driver to an organization of,
8 or sponsoring activities for, senior citizens, children, or
9 handicapped or other persons and groups in this state. The
10 board shall charge and collect an amount sufficient to
11 reimburse all costs of furnishing the bus and driver except
12 when the bus is used for transporting pupils to and from
13 extracurricular activities sponsored by the school. A school
14 bus shall be used as provided in this subsection only at times
15 when it is not needed for transportation of pupils.

16 Sec. 14. Section two hundred ninety-seven point nine
17 (297.9), Code 1977, is amended to read as follows:

18 297.9 USE FOR OTHER THAN SCHOOL PURPOSES. The board of
19 directors of any school district may authorize the use of
20 any schoolhouse and its grounds within such district for the
21 purpose of meetings of granges, lodges, agricultural societies,
22 and similar rural secret orders and societies, for parent-
23 teacher associations, for community recreational activities,
24 for community education programs, election purposes, other
25 meetings of public interest, public forums and similar
26 community purposes; provided, however, that the board may
27 not grant such permission to any organization known or believed
28 to hold views that are in conflict with the republican form
29 of government as set forth in the Constitution of the United
30 States; ~~and-for-election-purposes,-and-for-other-meetings~~
31 ~~of-public-interest,~~ provided that such use shall in no way
32 interfere with school activities; such use to be for such
33 compensation and upon such terms and conditions as may be
34 fixed by said board for the proper protection of the
35 schoolhouse and the property belonging therein, including

1 that of pupils, except that in the case of community education
2 programs, any compensation necessary for programs provided
3 specifically by community education and not those provided
4 through community education by other agencies or organizations
5 shall be compensated from the funding provided for community
6 education programs.

7 Sec. 15. Section three hundred point one (300.1), Code
8 1977, is amended to read as follows:

9 300.1 ESTABLISHMENT--MAINTENANCE--SUPERVISION. Boards
10 of ~~school~~ directors in school districts containing or contained
11 in any city are hereby authorized to establish and maintain
12 for children and adults in the public school buildings and
13 on the public school grounds under the custody and management
14 of such boards, public recreation places and playgrounds and
15 necessary accommodations for same, without charge to the
16 residents of said school district; also to co-operate with
17 the commissioners or boards having the custody and management
18 in such cities of public parks and public buildings and grounds
19 of whatever sort, and, by making arrangements satisfactory
20 to such boards controlling public parks and grounds, to provide
21 for the supervision, instruction, and oversight necessary
22 to carry on public educational and recreational activities,
23 as described in this section in buildings and upon grounds

Requested by: Senator Joan Orr

In compliance with a written request received February 9, 1978, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for Senate File 2087, pursuant to Joint Rule 16. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau, to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 2087, An Act to establish a community education program.

This proposal establishes a community education program in local school districts. The program would use local school facilities and be administered by a local director with the assistance of neighborhood and district advisory councils. The bill also establishes a state consultant and advisory council for community education. The program would be funded through use of the existing levy for public recreation and playgrounds.

Each district would be required to vote to use the levy allowed in Chapter 300 of the Code for this purpose. At present, only 10 districts are using this levy.

The cost to the state for a state advisory council is (\$6,586). A state consultant on community education is on the staff at present.
