A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the establishment of tuition rates for
2 school districts.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. Section two hundred eighty-two point twenty-
2 four (282.24), unnumbered paragraph one (1), Code 1979, is
3 amended to read as follows:

4 There is established a maximum tuition fee to be charged
5 for students, elementary or high school, residing within
6 another school district or corporation. That fee ~~shall be~~
7 is the state cost per pupil as computed in section 442.8 or
8 the district cost per pupil of the receiving district as
9 computed in section 442.9, subsection 1, paragraph "a",
10 whichever is the ~~lesser~~ greater amount.

11 EXPLANATION

12 This bill allows school districts to compute tuition on
13 the basis of the receiving district's district cost per pupil
14 or state cost whichever is greater. The bill, if enacted,
15 will be effective July 1, 1979.

1 Amend Senate File 107 as follows:

2 1. Page 1, by inserting before line 1 the
3 following:

4 "Section 1. Chapter two hundred eighty-two (282),
5 Code 1979, is amended by adding the following new
6 section:

7 NEW SECTION. TUITION FOR PARENT OR GUARDIAN.

8 Notwithstanding sections two hundred eighty-two point
9 one (282.1) and two hundred eighty-two point twenty-
10 four (282.24) of the Code, the tuition fee for a pupil
11 who attends a public school outside the pupil's
12 district of residence and for which the pupil's parent,
13 guardian or custodian pays the tuition is equal to
14 the amount of foundation property tax computed on
15 a per pupil in weighted enrollment basis for the
16 budget year for the district of attendance plus the
17 amount of additional property tax computed on a per
18 pupil in weighted enrollment basis for the budget
19 year for the district of attendance as computed by
20 the state comptroller. If the district of attendance
21 of the pupil is raising an additional enrichment
22 amount under sections four hundred forty-two point
23 fourteen (442.14) through four hundred forty-two point
24 twenty (442.20) of the Code, the parent shall also
25 pay an amount equal to the additional enrichment
26 amount per pupil in weighted enrollment for the budget
27 year. Weighted enrollment and budget year mean
28 weighted enrollment and budget year as defined in
29 chapter four hundred forty-two (442) of the Code."

30 2. Page 1, by inserting after line 10 the
31 following:

32 "Sec. ____ . Section four hundred forty-two point
33 four (442.4), subsection one (1), unnumbered paragraph
34 one (1), Code 1979, is amended to read as follows:

35 Basic enrollment for the budget year beginning
36 July 1, 1979 and each subsequent budget year is
37 determined by adding the resident pupils who were
38 enrolled on the second Friday of September in the
39 base year in public elementary and secondary schools
40 of the district and, resident pupils in public
41 elementary and secondary schools in another district
42 or state for which tuition is paid by the district,
43 and nonresident pupils enrolled in public elementary
44 and secondary schools of the district for which tuition
45 is paid by the parent, guardian, or custodian. For
46 the school year beginning July 1, 1975, and each
47 succeeding school year, pupils enrolled in
48 prekindergarten programs other than special education
49 programs are not included in basic enrollment.

50 . Sec. ____ . Section four hundred forty-two point

1 nine (442.9), subsection one (1), paragraph b, Code
2 1979, is amended to read as follows:

3 b. The district cost for the budget year is equal
4 to the district cost per pupil for the budget year
5 multiplied by the weighted enrollment, plus the
6 additional district cost allocated to the district
7 under section 442.27 to fund media services and
8 educational services provided through the area
9 education agency, minus the tuition fee paid to the
10 district by a parent, guardian, or custodian under
11 section one (1) of this Act. A school district may
12 not increase its district cost for the budget year
13 except to the extent that an excess tax levy is
14 authorized by the school budget review committee as
15 provided in section 442.13.

16 Sec. ____ . Section four hundred forty-two point
17 fourteen (442.14), subsection one (1), Code 1979,
18 is amended to read as follows:

19 1. For the budget year beginning July 1, 1979,
20 and each succeeding school year, if a school board
21 wishes to spend more than the amount permitted under
22 sections 442.1 to 442.13, and the school board has
23 not attempted by resolution to raise an additional
24 enrichment amount for that budget year, the school
25 board may raise an additional enrichment amount not
26 to exceed ten percent of the state cost per pupil
27 multiplied by the adjusted enrollment in the district
28 minus pupils for which the parent, guardian, or
29 custodian has paid a tuition fee under section one
30 (1) of this Act, as provided in this section. However,
31 the additional enrichment amount may be used only
32 for educational research, curriculum maintenance or
33 development, or innovative programs.

34 Sec. ____ . Section four hundred forty-two point
35 fifteen (442.15), unnumbered paragraph one (1), Code
36 1979, is amended to read as follows:

37 If a majority of those voting in an election
38 approves raising the additional enrichment amount
39 under section 442.14 and this section, the board shall
40 certify to the state comptroller that the required
41 procedures have been carried out, and the state
42 comptroller shall establish the amount of additional
43 enrichment property tax to be levied and the amount
44 of school district income surtax to be imposed for
45 each school year for which the additional enrichment
46 amount is authorized. The state comptroller shall
47 determine these amounts based upon the most recent
48 figures available for the district's valuation of
49 taxable property, individual state income tax paid,
50 and adjusted enrollment in the district minus pupils

1 for which the parent, guardian, or custodian has paid
2 a tuition fee under section one (1) of this Act, and
3 shall certify to the district's county auditor the
4 amount of enrichment property tax, and to the director
5 of revenue the amount of school district income surtax
6 to be imposed."

7 3. By numbering and renumbering sections and
8 correcting internal references as necessary in
9 accordance with this amendment."
