A BILL FOR

1 An Act to establish an Iowa tuition differential grant and
2 to provide for its payment from a fund established in
3 the Act.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. Chapter two hundred sixty-one (261), Code 1979,
2 is amended by adding sections two (2) through eight (8) of
3 this Act as a new division:

4 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. TUITION DIFFERENTIAL GRANT. There
5 is established the Iowa tuition differential grant to be
6 administered by the commission. The tuition differential
7 grant shall be paid to a resident of Iowa who is admitted
8 and in attendance as a full-time or half-time resident student
9 at an accredited private institution as the terms "full-time
10 resident student", "half-time resident student", and
11 "accredited private institution" are defined in section two
12 hundred sixty-one point nine (261.9) of the Code. However,
13 for the purpose of this division, "accredited private
14 institution" does not include county hospitals which operate
15 schools of nursing, and "course of study" does not include
16 a program of study leading to a degree in theology or divinity.

17 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. FUND. There is established the
18 Iowa tuition differential grant fund into which shall be
19 deposited funds appropriated for tuition differential grants
20 and from which shall be paid tuition differential grants.
21 The amount of the tuition differential grant paid to a full-
22 time resident student shall not exceed seven hundred fifty
23 dollars. The amount of the tuition differential grant paid
24 to a half-time resident student shall equal half the amount
25 which is paid to a full-time resident student. If the funds
26 in the tuition differential grant fund are insufficient to
27 pay the maximum amount authorized under this section, the
28 commission shall pay grants on a prorated basis at the
29 beginning of each quarter, semester, trimester, or term.
30 Section two hundred sixty-one point thirteen (261.13) of the
31 Code applies to the tuition differential grant.

32 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. EXTENT OF DIFFERENTIAL GRANT. A
33 full-time resident student shall receive tuition differential
34 grants for not more than eight semesters of undergraduate
35 study or the trimester or quarter equivalent. A half-time

1 resident student shall receive tuition differential grants
2 for not more than sixteen semesters of undergraduate study
3 or the trimester or quarter equivalent.

4 Sec. 5. NEW SECTION. OTHER AID. A tuition differential
5 grant paid to a resident student shall not be included by
6 the commission in determining financial need of the student
7 for receipt under this chapter of either a tuition grant or
8 a state scholarship. The state's total financial contribution
9 to a resident student during an academic year, including
10 tuition differential grant and tuition grant or state
11 scholarship, shall not exceed the amount of tuition and manda-
12 tory fees for the academic year at the accredited private
13 institution which the resident student attends.

14 Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. DUTIES. The commission shall:

15 1. Apply its rules for determining tuition and mandatory
16 fees for tuition grants to tuition differential grants.

17 2. Adopt rules for defining residence which are
18 substantially the same as rules adopted by the board of regents
19 for defining residence.

20 3. Pay tuition differential grants to the accredited
21 private institutions.

22 Sec. 7. NEW SECTION. ACCREDITED PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS.

23 Within ten days after the beginning of each quarter, semester,
24 trimester, or term, each accredited private institution shall
25 transmit to the commission a list of the names of its resident
26 full-time students and a list of the names of its resident
27 part-time students.

28 Sec. 8. NEW SECTION. IMPLEMENTATION. Tuition differential
29 grants shall be paid for resident students as follows:

30 1. First-year students enrolled during the period beginning
31 August 1, 1980 through July 31, 1981.

32 2. First and second-year students enrolled during the
33 period beginning August 1, 1981 and ending July 31, 1982.

34 3. First, second, and third-year students enrolled during
35 the period beginning August 1, 1982 and ending July 31, 1983.

1 4. First, second, third, and fourth-year students enrolled
2 after July 31, 1983.

3 EXPLANATION

4 This bill creates an Iowa tuition differential grant of
5 up to \$750 per year for all full-time (and up to \$375 for
6 all half-time) resident students attending private colleges
7 and universities in this state. It creates a fund into which
8 state appropriations for the tuition differential grants are
9 deposited and provides for prorating the grants if insufficient
10 funds are appropriated. The tuition differential grant may
11 be in addition to the tuition grant or the state scholarship.
12 The Act takes effect July first following its enactment.

Senate File 2073, An Act to establish an Iowa tuition differential grant and to provide for its payment from a fund established in the Act.

The estimated cost of this Act for each of the phase-in years is based on the present distribution of tuition grant recipients and no allowances have been made for possible fluctuations in enrollments nor for half-time students.
