## A BILL FOR

1 An Act to allow Iowa residents sixty years of age and older  
2 to attend courses offered by state-supported institutions  
3 of higher education by paying certain costs.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 262.9, Code 1981, is amended by adding  
2 the following new subsection:

3 NEW SUBSECTION. Adopt rules which allow residents of this  
4 state sixty years of age and older to audit on a noncredit  
5 basis courses offered by an institution of higher education  
6 governed by the board by paying only the cost of record keeping  
7 and other administrative expense, not to exceed five dollars  
8 per course. This subsection applies only to courses which  
9 are not filled to their designated capacity by students for  
10 whom regular tuition and fees are paid. Institutions governed  
11 by the board may apply to the board for reimbursement for  
12 excess costs of the program from funds appropriated to the  
13 board.

14 Sec. 2. Section 280A.23, Code 1981, is amended by adding  
15 the following new subsection:

16 NEW SUBSECTION. Adopt rules which allow residents of this  
17 state sixty years of age and older to audit on a noncredit  
18 basis courses offered by the area school by paying only the  
19 cost of record keeping and other administrative expense not  
20 to exceed five dollars per course. This subsection applies  
21 only to courses which are not filled to their designated  
22 capacity by students for whom regular tuition and fees are  
23 paid. Area schools may apply to the department for  
24 reimbursement for excess costs of the program from funds  
25 appropriated to the department.

26 EXPLANATION

27 This bill requires the state board of regents and boards  
28 of directors of the area schools to adopt rules allowing Iowa  
29 residents sixty years of age and older to attend courses at  
30 the universities and area schools on a noncredit, space  
31 available basis by paying only the administrative costs not  
32 to exceed five dollars per course. The institutions may apply  
33 for reimbursement for excess costs of the program. The bill  
34 takes effect July 1 following its enactment.
