A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to expenditures for assessment appeals.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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SF 2236

1 Section 1. Section 441.16, unnumbered paragraph 9, Code
2 1981, is amended to read as follows:

3 The assessor shall not issue requisitions so as to increase
4 the total expenditures budgeted for the operation of the
5 assessor's office. However, for purposes of promoting
6 operational efficiency, the assessor ~~shall have authority~~
7 ~~to~~ may transfer funds budgeted for specific items for the
8 operation of the assessor's office from one unexpended balance
9 to another, ~~such.~~ The transfer shall not be made so as to
10 increase the total amount budgeted for the operation of the
11 office of assessor, and ~~no~~ funds shall not be used to increase
12 the salary of the assessor or the salaries of permanent deputy
13 assessors. ~~He~~ The assessor shall issue requisitions for the
14 examining board and for the board of review on order of the
15 ~~chairman~~ chairperson of each board and may issue requisitions
16 for costs and expenses incident to assessment appeals, ~~only~~
17 ~~on order of the city legal department, in the case of cities~~
18 ~~and of the county attorney in the case of counties.~~

19 EXPLANATION

20 This bill allows assessors to issue requisitions for the
21 costs and expenditures of assessment appeals, without being
22 ordered to do so by the city legal department or the county
23 attorney. This bill is effective July 1 following its enact-
24 ment.

AN ACT

TO AUTHORIZE THE IOWA NATURAL RESOURCES COUNCIL TO ENTER INTO
A CONTRACT ON BEHALF OF THE STATE WITH THE FEDERAL GOVERN-
MENT FOR STORAGE IN THE SAYLORVILLE RESERVOIR, EFFECTIVE
UPON PUBLICATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Notwithstanding section 455A.17, the Iowa
natural resources council may enter into a binding contract
on behalf of this state with the federal government for the
acquisition of storage in Saylorville reservoir for municipal
and industrial water supply if the council also enters into
binding contracts on behalf of this state with the local water
users who will benefit from the storage so that all costs
incurred by this state in its contract with the federal
government are borne by those local water users.

Sec. 2. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance,
takes effect from and after its publication in The Chariton
Leader, a newspaper published in Chariton, Iowa, and in The
