A BILL FOR

1 An Act authorizing the use of computer data storage systems
2 for the collection, storage, and retrieval of intelligence
3 data, providing for restrictions on access to these
4 computer data storage systems, and requiring the adoption
5 of rules for authorization to access a computer data
6 storage system containing intelligence data.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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S. 2306

1 Section 1. Section 692.8, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code
2 1983, is amended to read as follows:

3 Intelligence data contained in the files of the department
4 of public safety or a criminal justice agency ~~shall not~~ may
5 be placed within a computer data storage system, provided
6 that access to the computer data storage system is restricted
7 to authorized employees of the department or criminal justice
8 agency and the computer data storage system is not
9 interconnected with any other computer, computer system, or
10 communication facility outside of the department or agency
11 and cannot be accessed by persons outside of the department
12 or agency.

13 Sec. 2. Section 692.10, Code 1983, is amended to read
14 as follows:

15 692.10 RULES. The department shall adopt rules designed
16 to assure the security and confidentiality of all systems
17 established for the exchange of criminal history data and
18 intelligence data between criminal justice agencies and for
19 the authorization of officers or employees to access a
20 department or agency computer data storage system in which
21 criminal intelligence data is stored.

22 EXPLANATION

23 This bill allows for the use of computers and computer
24 storage systems in the collection and storage of criminal
25 intelligence data with the requirements that computer system
26 access be restricted to only authorized officers and em-
27 ployees, that the system be unconnected with any computer
28 or communication facility outside of the department or agency,
29 and that the computer be unaccessible from outside the
30 department or agency. This bill also provides for the
31 requirement that the department adopt rules for the au-
32 thorization of officers and employees to have access to
33 computers in which criminal intelligence data is stored.

34 This bill takes effect July 1 following its enactment.

AN ACT

AUTHORIZING THE USE OF COMPUTER DATA STORAGE SYSTEMS FOR THE COLLECTION, STORAGE, AND RETRIEVAL OF INTELLIGENCE DATA, PROVIDING FOR RESTRICTIONS ON ACCESS TO THESE COMPUTER DATA STORAGE SYSTEMS, AND REQUIRING THE ADOPTION OF RULES FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ACCESS A COMPUTER DATA STORAGE SYSTEM CONTAINING INTELLIGENCE DATA.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 68A.1, Code 1983, is amended to read as follows:

68A.1 PUBLIC RECORDS DEFINED. Wherever used in this chapter, "public records" includes all records, and documents, tape, or other information, stored or preserved in any medium, of or belonging to this state or any county, city, township, school corporation, political subdivision, or tax-supported district in this state, or any branch, department, board, bureau, commission, council, or committee of any of the foregoing.

Sec. 2. Section 692.8, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 1983, is amended to read as follows:

Intelligence data contained in the files of the department of public safety or a criminal justice agency shall not may be placed within a computer data storage system, provided that access to the computer data storage system is restricted to authorized employees of the department or criminal justice agency and the computer data storage system is not interconnected with any other computer, computer system, or communication facility outside of the department or agency and cannot be accessed by persons outside of the department or agency.

Sec. 3. Section 692.10, Code 1983, is amended to read as follows:

692.10 RULES. The department shall adopt rules designed to assure the security and confidentiality of all systems established for the exchange of criminal history data and intelligence data between criminal justice agencies and for the authorization of officers or employees to access a department or agency computer data storage system in which criminal intelligence data is stored.
