A BILL FOR

1 An Act to establish a forest lands hunting stamp for the
2 taking of deer and wild turkey, dedicate the proceeds
3 from sales of the stamps and subject violators to a
4 penalty.

1 Section 1. Chapter 110, Code 1985, is amended by adding
2 the following new section:

3 NEW SECTION. FOREST LANDS STAMP.

4 A person required to have a hunting license for turkey or
5 deer in Iowa shall not hunt unless the person carries a valid
6 forest lands stamp signed in ink with the person's signature
7 across the face of the stamp. This section does not apply to
8 residents who are permanently disabled or who are younger than
9 sixteen years or older than sixty-five years of age. Forest
10 lands stamps shall be administered in the same manner as
11 hunting and trapping licenses except that all revenues derived
12 from the sale of the forest lands stamps shall be used within
13 the state of Iowa for deer and turkey habitat development and
14 shall be deposited in the state fish and game protection fund.
15 The revenues may be used for the matching of federal funds.
16 The revenues and any matching funds shall be used for the ac-
17 quisition of habitat suitable for forest dwelling wildlife,
18 leasing of habitat suitable for forest dwelling wildlife, or
19 obtaining of easements from willing sellers for the use of
20 habitat suitable for forest dwelling wildlife. In addition,
21 revenues may be used for the development and enhancement of
22 habitat suitable for forest dwelling wildlife. Notwith-
23 standing the exemptions provided by section 427.1, land
24 acquired with the revenues and matching federal funds is
25 subject to the full consolidated levy of property taxes which
26 shall be paid from those revenues.

27 Sec. 2. Section 110.1, subsection 7, Code 1985, is amended
28 by adding the following new lettered paragraph:

29 NEW LETTERED PARAGRAPH. n. Forest land stamp ... \$5.00

30 EXPLANATION

31 This bill establishes a forest lands stamp with a fee of \$5
32 which is required for the hunting of deer and turkey by those
33 required to have licenses. The funds from the sale of stamps
34 is dedicated to the development of deer and turkey habitat in
35 Iowa.

FISCAL NOTE

REQUESTED BY SENATOR RODGERS

In compliance with a written request a fiscal note for SENATE FILE 30 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17.

Senate File 30 establishes a forest land hunting stamp with a fee of \$5 to be required for the hunting of deer and turkey by those required to have hunting licenses. All revenue derived from the sale of the forest lands stamps shall be deposited in the state fish and game protection fund and used within the state of Iowa for deer and turkey habitat development.

FISCAL EFFECT: According to the table below, revenue from the sale of forest lands stamps is expected to total \$75,000 in FY86 and \$450,000 in FY87. These revenue estimates are based on 1983 actual sales of deer and turkey licenses. Support expenditures refer to the cost of printing the stamps. The capital outlay amounts shown below indicate the balance to be directed toward deer and turkey habitat development.
