FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request a fiscal note for SENATE FILE 54 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17.

Senate File 54 allows prisoners of war to apply for more than one set of special Prisoners of War plates. The special plates are subject to an annual registration fee of fifteen dollars. However, only one vehicle may be registered at the special fifteen dollar registration fee. The regular annual registration fee applies to additional vehicles issued Prisoner of War plates.

FISCAL EFFECTS: Senate File 54 would not cause a significant fiscal effect. The current law would generate in FY86 \$169,900,000 and in FY87 \$178,100,000 through the RUTP registrations. The proposed Senate File 54 would generate the same amount with no change in expenditures.

1 Section 1. Section 321.34, subsection 8, Code 1985, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 8. PRISONER OF WAR PLATES. The owner of a motor vehicle
4 subject to registration under section 321.109, subsection 1,
5 light delivery truck, panel delivery truck or pickup who was a
6 prisoner of war during the second world war at any time
7 between December 7, 1941 and December 31, 1946, the Korean
8 conflict at any time between June 25, 1950 and January 31,
9 1955 or the Vietnam conflict at any time between August 5,
10 1964 and June 30, 1973, all dates inclusive, may upon written
11 application to the department, order special registration
12 plates designed by the department in co-operation with the
13 adjutant general which plates signify that the applicant was a
14 prisoner of war as defined in this subsection. ~~Each applicant~~
15 ~~applying for special registration plates under this subsection~~
16 ~~may purchase only one set of registration plates under this~~
17 ~~subsection.~~ The application is subject to approval by the
18 department, in consultation with the adjutant general, and the
19 special registration plates shall be issued to the applicant
20 in exchange for the registration plates previously issued to
21 the person. The special plates shall contain the letters
22 "POW" and three numerals ~~and shall be.~~ The special plates are
23 subject to an annual registration fee of fifteen dollars for
24 one vehicle, and the annual registration fee for additional
25 vehicles registered by an applicant under this section is the
26 regular annual registration fee for the vehicles. The
27 department shall validate the special plates in the same
28 manner as regular registration plates are validated under this
29 section at the regular applicable annual registration fee.

EXPLANATION

31 This bill allows prisoners of war to apply for more than
32 one set of special prisoner of war plates. However, only one
33 vehicle may be registered at the special fifteen dollar
34 registration fee. The regular annual registration fee applies
35 to additional vehicles issued prisoner of war plates.
