### A BILL FOR

1 An Act making the one-week waiting period before the receipt  
2 of unemployment compensation benefits permanent.  
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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SF 265

1 Section 1. 1983 Iowa Acts, chapter 190, section 26, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3 SEC. 26. PROSPECTIVE REPEAL. ~~Sections 8 and~~ Section 24 of  
4 this Act ~~are~~ is prospectively repealed on January 1 of the  
5 first calendar year after December 31, 1985 for which a con-  
6 tribution rate table other than contribution rate table one is  
7 effective. ~~Section 8 is repealed for benefit claims effec-~~  
8 ~~tively filed for and after the first full week in that first~~  
9 ~~calendar year.~~ Section 24 is repealed for taxable wages for  
10 that first calendar year and subsequent calendar years.

11 EXPLANATION

12 This bill makes the one-week waiting period before receiv-  
13 ing unemployment compensation benefits permanent by repealing  
14 the prospective repeal of the waiting-period requirement.

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In compliance with a written request received February 20, 1985, a fiscal note for SENATE FILE 265 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

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Senate File 265 makes the one-week waiting period before receiving unemployment compensation benefits permanent by repealing the prospective repeal of the waiting-period requirement.

FISCAL EFFECT: Projections from the Department of Job Service are that without this bill there will be no impact on the trust fund until 1988 at the earliest. However, in order to estimate the potential impact of this bill after 1988 the department reviewed the number of claimants drawing at least one week of benefits, but not exhausting benefits, from 1977 through 1984. Had this requirement been in existence during that time the estimated savings to the unemployment trust fund would have been \$71.9 million or an average of 5.3 percent of the benefit actually paid during those same years. It is anticipated that similar savings could be expected in future years.
