A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to legislative agencies under the direction and
2 control of the legislative council by creating a computer
3 support bureau, by providing budgeting procedures for statu-
4 tory legislative agencies, making standing appropriations
5 and making the Act effective upon publication.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 2.12, Code 1985, is amended by adding
2 the following new unnumbered paragraph:

3 NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. There is appropriated out of any
4 funds in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated such
5 sums as may be necessary for the fiscal year budgets of the
6 legislative service bureau, the legislative fiscal bureau, the
7 citizens' aide office and the computer support bureau for
8 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes to
9 carry out their statutory responsibilities. The legislative
10 service bureau, the legislative fiscal bureau, the citizens'
11 aide office and the computer support bureau shall submit their
12 proposed budgets to the legislative council not later than
13 September 1 of each year. The legislative council shall
14 review and approve the proposed budgets not later than
15 December 1 of each year. The budget approved by the
16 legislative council for each of its statutory legislative
17 agencies shall be transmitted by the legislative council to
18 the state comptroller on or before December 1 of each year for
19 the fiscal year beginning July 1 of the following year. The
20 state comptroller shall submit the approved budgets received
21 from the legislative council to the governor for inclusion in
22 the governor's proposed budget for the succeeding fiscal year.
23 The state comptroller shall issue warrants for salaries,
24 support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes upon
25 requisition by the administrative head of each statutory
26 legislative agency. If the legislative council elects to
27 change the approved budget for a legislative agency prior to
28 July 1, the legislative council shall transmit the amount of
29 the budget revision to the state comptroller prior to July 1
30 of the fiscal year.

26 miscellaneous purposes to carry out their statutory
27 responsibilities. The legislative council shall review the
28 proposed budgets of the legislative service bureau, the
29 legislative fiscal bureau, the citizens' aide office and the
30 computer support bureau as submitted to the state comptroller
31 on or about September 1, 1984 for the fiscal year beginning
32 July 1, 1985 and ending June 30, 1986. The legislative
33 council shall review and approve the proposed budgets not

35 legislative council for each of its statutory legislative

1 agencies shall be transmitted by the legislative council to
2 the state comptroller on or before June 1, 1985 for the fiscal
3 year beginning July 1, 1985 and ending June 30, 1986. The
4 state comptroller shall issue warrants for salaries, support,
5 maintenance and miscellaneous purposes upon requisition by the
6 administrative head of each statutory legislative agency. If
7 the legislative council elects to adjust the approved budget
8 for a legislative agency prior to July 1, 1985, the
9 legislative council shall notify the state comptroller of the
10 amount of the budget revision prior to July 1, 1985.

11 Sec. 11. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance,
12 takes effect from and after its publication in the Fort
13 Madison Daily Democrat, a newspaper published in Fort Madison,
14 Iowa, and in The Red Oak Express, a newspaper published in Red
15 Oak, Iowa.

16 EXPLANATION

17 The bill creates a computer support bureau. The computer
18 support bureau will operate under the direction and control of
19 the legislative council.

20 The bill also provides that the legislative service bureau,
21 the legislative fiscal bureau, the citizens' aide office and
22 the computer support bureau will be funded from a standing
23 unlimited appropriation. The budget of the legislative
24 agencies must be approved by the legislative council and
25 transmitted to the state comptroller for inclusion in the
26 governor's budget. The bill takes effect upon publication.

The legislative council shall review the proposed budgets of the legislative service bureau, the legislative fiscal bureau, the citizens' aide office and the computer support bureau as submitted to the state comptroller on or about September 1, 1984 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1985 and ending June 30, 1986. The legislative council shall review and approve the proposed budgets not later than June 1, 1985. The budget approved by the legislative council for each of its statutory legislative agencies shall be transmitted by the legislative council to the state comptroller on or before June 1, 1985 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1985 and ending June 30, 1986. The state comptroller shall issue warrants for salaries, support, maintenance and miscellaneous purposes upon requisition by the administrative head of each statutory legislative agency. If the legislative council elects to adjust the approved budget for a legislative agency prior to July 1, 1985, the legislative council shall notify the state comptroller of the amount of the budget revision prior to July 1, 1985.

Sec. 11. If this Act is enacted and becomes law and the provisions of Senate File 434, section 6, subsections 1 and 2, appropriating funds to the legislative service bureau and the legislative fiscal bureau for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1985 and ending June 30, 1986, and House File 571, section 1, subsection 3, appropriating funds to the office of citizens' aide for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1985 and ending June 30, 1986 are enacted and become law, the

provisions of Senate File 434, section 6, subsections 1 and 2, and House File 571, section 1, subsection 3, are void and section 10 of this Act shall govern budget procedures for the budgets of the legislative service bureau, the legislative fiscal bureau, and the citizens' aide office for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1985 and ending June 30, 1986.

Sec. 12. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect from and after its publication in the Fort Madison Daily Democrat, a newspaper published in Fort Madison, Iowa, and in The Red Oak Express, a newspaper published in Red Oak, Iowa.
