A BILL FOR

1 An Act amending statutory provisions relating to the medical
2 assistance program by requiring the department of human
3 services to deposit certain payments in the medical
4 assistance fund and to grant certain children automatic
5 eligibility for medical assistance.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 218.78, subsection 1, Code 1985, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 1. All institutional receipts of the department of human
4 services shall be deposited in the general fund except for
5 reimbursements for services provided to another institution or
6 state agency, for receipts deposited in the revolving farm
7 fund under section 217A.70, for deposits into the medical
8 assistance fund under section 249A.11, and rentals charged to
9 employees or others for room, apartment, or house and meals,
10 which shall be available to the institutions.

11 Sec. 2. Section 249A.3, subsection 1, Code 1985, is
12 amended by adding the following new paragraph:

13 NEW PARAGRAPH. d. Is a child up to one year of age who
14 was born on or after October 1, 1984 to a woman receiving
15 medical assistance on the date of the child's birth, who
16 continues to be a member of the mother's household, and whose
17 mother continues to receive medical assistance.

18 Sec. 3. Section 249A.11, Code 1985, is amended to read as
19 follows:

20 249A.11 PAYMENT FOR PATIENT CARE SEGREGATED.

21 Each A state hospital-school ~~shall~~ or mental health
22 institute, upon receipt of any payment made under this chapter
23 for the care of any patient, shall segregate an amount equal
24 to that portion of the payment which is required by law to be
25 made from nonfederal funds. The money segregated shall be
26 deposited in the medical assistance fund of the department of
27 human services.

28 Sec. 4. Sections 218.75 and 222.93, Code 1985, are
29 repealed.

30 EXPLANATION

31 Sections 1, 3, and 4 of this Act require the segregation of
32 medical assistance funds received by state hospital-schools or
33 mental health institutes and their deposit in the medical
34 assistance fund. Duplicating language is deleted.

35 Section 2 makes a child automatically eligible for medical

1 assistance if the child's mother was eligible for medical
2 assistance at the time of the child's birth.

AN ACT

AMENDING STATUTORY PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM BY REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO DEPOSIT CERTAIN PAYMENTS IN THE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE FUND AND TO GRANT CERTAIN CHILDREN AUTOMATIC ELIGIBILITY FOR MEDICAL ASSISTANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 218.78, subsection 1, Code 1985, is amended to read as follows:

1. All institutional receipts of the department of human services shall be deposited in the general fund except for reimbursements for services provided to another institution or state agency, for receipts deposited in the revolving farm fund under section 217A.70, for deposits into the medical assistance fund under section 249A.11, and rentals charged to employees or others for room, apartment, or house and meals, which shall be available to the institutions.

Sec. 2. Section 249A.3, subsection 1, Code 1985, is amended by adding the following new paragraph:

NEW PARAGRAPH. d. Is a child up to one year of age who was born on or after October 1, 1984 to a woman receiving medical assistance on the date of the child's birth, who continues to be a member of the mother's household, and whose mother continues to receive medical assistance.

Sec. 3. Section 249A.11, Code 1985, is amended to read as follows:

249A.11 PAYMENT FOR PATIENT CARE SEGREGATED.

Each A state hospital-school shall or mental health institute, upon receipt of any payment made under this chapter for the care of any patient, shall segregate an amount equal to that portion of the payment which is required by law to be

made from nonfederal funds. The money segregated shall be deposited in the medical assistance fund of the department of human services.

Sec. 4. Sections 218.75 and 222.93, Code 1985, are repealed.
