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10 EXPLANATION

11 This bill provides that attorneys appointed to represent
12 indigent persons pursuant to section 331.777 are not court
13 employees and that the judicial department has no supervisory
14 power over public defender offices established pursuant to
15 section 331.776.

Senate File 2100 provides that attorneys appointed to represent indigent persons are not court employees and that the judicial department has no supervisory power over public defender offices established pursuant to section 331.776.

FISCAL EFFECT: This bill has no fiscal effect; it clarifies the fact that employees of public defender offices will not be employed by the Judicial Department. They will remain employees of the counties, who will in turn be reimbursed by the Judicial Department with appropriated funds
