6 EXPLANATION

7 This bill provides that the college aid commission
8 transmits the appropriate amount of the grant to each
9 qualified student of the college of osteopathic medicine and
10 surgery rather than channeling the funds for the subvention
11 program for resident students at the college of osteopathic
12 medicine and surgery through the college for dissemination
13 purposes.

14 The bill also amends chapter 1246 of the 1986 Iowa Acts or
15 H.F. 2484, the enacted appropriations Act, to require that
16 each student declared eligible for the subvention program in
17 the 1987 fiscal year, receives a grant of three thousand
18 dollars for each semester from funds appropriated for the
19 program by the 1986 General Assembly. This section of the
20 bill takes effect upon enactment. The remainder of the bill
21 takes effect July 1, 1987.
