A BILL FOR

1 An Act providing for public grants and public education relating
2 to adolescent pregnancy prevention and services by
3 establishing a task force on adolescent pregnancy prevention
4 and services, providing for pilot project grants relating to
5 adolescent pregnancy prevention and services, and establishing
6 a local advisory committee to public school boards regarding
7 the inclusion or exclusion of human growth and development
8 instruction in the school curriculum.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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SF 219

1 Section 1. This Act may be cited as the "Adolescent
2 Pregnancy Prevention, Pregnancy Care, and Parenting Services
3 Act."

4 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 234A.1 ADOLESCENT PREGNANCY TASK
5 FORCE.

6 1. A task force on adolescent pregnancy prevention and
7 services is established. The task force is composed of the
8 following voting members:

9 a. The lieutenant governor or the lieutenant governor's
10 designee.

11 b. One member of the senate appointed by the majority
12 leader of the senate and one member of the senate appointed by
13 the minority leader of the senate.

14 c. One member of the house of representatives appointed by
15 the speaker of the house and one member of the house of
16 representatives appointed by the minority leader of the house.

17 d. Four state government employees, appointed by the
18 legislative council, one from each of the following
19 departments: the department of education, the department of
20 human rights, the department of human services, and the Iowa
21 department of public health.

22 e. Seven to fourteen public members, with one or two from
23 each of the following seven categories, appointed by the
24 legislative council, with expertise in the area of adolescent
25 pregnancy prevention or the provision of services to pregnant
26 adolescents or adolescent parents:

27 (1) Health care professionals.

28 (2) Psychologists or social workers.

29 (3) Family planning service workers.

30 (4) Educators, including both public school teachers and
31 administrators.

32 (5) Service providers for adolescents.

33 (6) Job training and counseling workers.

34 (7) Adolescent parents or adolescent peer counselors.

35 2. The legislative council shall designate a chairperson

1 or co-chairpersons. The task force shall meet at the call of
2 the chairperson or co-chairpersons or ten task force members.
3 The public members appointed by the legislative council shall
4 be paid their actual and necessary expenses pursuant to
5 section 2.12. The lieutenant governor shall be reimbursed and
6 compensated as provided in section 2.10, and the legislative
7 members shall be reimbursed and compensated as provided in
8 section 2.44.

9 3. The task force shall:

10 a. Assess the need for adolescent pregnancy prevention and
11 services programs in Iowa.

12 b. Inventory existing programs and services relating to
13 adolescent pregnancy prevention and services.

14 c. Investigate alternative funding sources relating to
15 adolescent pregnancy prevention and services.

16 d. Investigate existing and needed maternity care health
17 benefit coverages for pregnant adolescents.

18 e. Make legislative recommendations to the legislative
19 council and issue a final report to the general assembly by
20 January 1, 1988 regarding adolescent pregnancy prevention and
21 services.

22 4. The legislative council shall authorize the legislative
23 service bureau and the legislative fiscal bureau to provide
24 assistance to the task force, and may authorize the use of
25 funds available to the legislative council to pay the expenses
26 of the task force.

27 5. As used in this section, "adolescent" means a person
28 under eighteen years of age or a person in attendance at an
29 accredited school pursuing a course of study leading to a high
30 school diploma, or its equivalent.

31 Sec. 3. PREGNANCY PREVENTION AND SERVICES GRANTS.

32 The commissioner of human services, the director of the
33 department of education, the director of the department of
34 human rights, and the director of public health, or their
35 designees, shall jointly designate, award, and administer

1 grants, which may be awarded to public school corporations,
2 adolescent service providers, and nonprofit organizations
3 involved in adolescent issues for two-year pilot projects
4 targeted toward those areas of the state with the highest
5 incidence of adolescent pregnancy, from one or more of the
6 following programmatic areas:

- 7 1. Pregnancy prevention programs for adolescents and
8 workshops for parents of adolescents to improve parent-child
9 communications regarding human sexuality.
- 10 2. Communications media campaigns to discourage adolescent
11 sexual activity and to encourage the assumption of
12 responsibility by adolescents, both male and female, for their
13 sexual activity and for parenting.
- 14 3. Residential facilities for pregnant adolescents and
15 adolescent parents in need of shelter.
- 16 4. Early pregnancy detection for adolescents and prenatal
17 services and adoption counseling for pregnant adolescents.
- 18 5. Child care and case management services provided to
19 adolescent parents, both male and female, for a predetermined
20 fee under purchase-of-service contracts, which include child
21 care services, instruction in child development and parenting
22 skills, support services for completion of school and for job
23 training and placement, and other personal services.
- 24 6. Teacher training, including transportation costs and
25 workshop, conference, and course work expenses, designed to
26 improve the teaching of components of the human growth and de-
27 velopment curricula in grades kindergarten through twelve. A
28 preference shall be given for the funding of teacher training
29 grant projects which would qualify participating teachers for
30 continuing education unit credits.

31 As used in this section, "adolescent" means a person under
32 eighteen years of age or a person in attendance at an
33 accredited school pursuing a course of study leading to a high
34 school diploma, or its equivalent. Pilot projects providing
35 services to an adolescent under eighteen years of age may con-

1 tinue to provide the services beyond the adolescent's
2 eighteenth birthday in accordance with guidelines adopted by
3 the four state administrators authorized to award grants under
4 this section.

5 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 279.50 HUMAN GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT
6 INSTRUCTION.

7 1. Each board of directors of a public school corporation
8 shall appoint an advisory committee composed of at least one
9 person from each of the following groups: parents, teachers,
10 school administrators, school board directors, pupils, health
11 care professionals, members of the clergy, and other residents
12 of the school district. The advisory committee shall study
13 making available to pupils in grades kindergarten through
14 twelve, instruction appropriate to the pupils' grade level,
15 age, and level of maturity, in topics related to human growth
16 and development in order to promote accurate and comprehensive
17 knowledge in this area, to foster responsible decision making,
18 based on cause and effect, and to support and enhance the ef-
19 ferts of parents to provide moral guidance to their children.
20 The advisory committee in its study shall address and make
21 recommendations on the inclusion or exclusion of each of the
22 following topics of instruction:

- 23 a. Self-esteem, responsible decision making, and personal
24 responsibility and goal setting.
- 25 b. Interpersonal relationships.
- 26 c. Discouragement of adolescent sexual activity.
- 27 d. Family life and parenting skills.
- 28 e. Human sexuality, reproduction, contraception and family
29 planning, prenatal development, childbirth, adoption, avail-
30 able prenatal and postnatal support, and male and female
31 responsibility.
- 32 f. Sex stereotypes.
- 33 g. Protective behaviors to prevent sexual abuse or sexual
34 harassment.
- 35 h. Sexually transmitted diseases, including acquired

1 immune deficiency syndrome, and their causes and prevention.
2 2. The advisory committee shall make its recommendations
3 regarding the implementation of human growth and development
4 instruction for pupils in the school district, including the
5 inclusion or exclusion of the instructional topics in
6 subsection 1, paragraphs "a" through "h", to the school board
7 at least every three years and shall file a written report
8 with the state department of education indicating the date and
9 contents of the advisory committee's recommendations to the
10 school board.

11 3. A school board may provide an instructional program in
12 human growth and development in grades kindergarten through
13 twelve. Each school board which provides an instructional
14 program in human growth and development shall annually provide
15 to a parent or guardian of any pupil enrolled in the school
16 district, upon the parent's or guardian's request, an outline
17 of the human growth and development curriculum used in the
18 pupil's grade level and information regarding the procedure
19 for inspection of the complete curriculum and instructional
20 materials, including inspection prior to their use in the
21 classroom. A pupil shall not be required to take instruction
22 in human growth and development or in the specific topics
23 under subsection 1, paragraphs "a" through "h", if the pupil's
24 parent or guardian files with the pupil's teacher or principal
25 a written request that the pupil be excused from the
26 instruction.

27 4. The state department of education shall make available
28 model human growth and development curricula for grades
29 kindergarten through twelve which shall include the
30 instructional topics in subsection 1, paragraphs "a" through
31 "h". The department of education shall distribute the model
32 curricula to each school board and to each advisory committee
33 appointed pursuant to subsection 1, and shall provide
34 technical assistance to school boards and advisory committees
35 in the use or adaptation of the curricula.

1 Sec. 5. It is the intent of the general assembly:

2 1. That the department of human services utilize a
3 percentage of the federal social services block grant moneys
4 by:

5 a. Providing adolescents with information relating to
6 confidential and voluntary reproductive health care services
7 available at reduced cost to the adolescents.

8 b. Requiring certain reproductive health care providers to
9 develop a purchase of service unit specific to the provision
10 of reproductive health care services to adolescents.

11 c. Developing service units providing referral and
12 transportation between youth service agencies and reproductive
13 health care providers.

14 An adolescent's eligibility shall not reflect the financial
15 resources of the adolescent's family.

16 2. That the Iowa department of public health utilize a
17 percentage of the federal maternal and child health block
18 grant moneys for the provision of reproductive health care,
19 including family planning services.

20 EXPLANATION

21 This bill establishes a state task force to study the need
22 for and availability of adolescent pregnancy prevention and
23 services programs in the state, and to make recommendations to
24 the legislative council and the general assembly regarding
25 adolescent pregnancy prevention and services. The bill
26 establishes adolescent pregnancy prevention and services
27 grants, to be awarded for two-year pilot projects in those
28 areas of the state with the highest incidence of adolescent
29 pregnancy, specifically for adolescent pregnancy prevention
30 programs and parent workshops, for communications media
31 campaigns encouraging adolescent responsibility, for
32 residential facilities for pregnant adolescents and adolescent
33 parents in need of shelter, for early pregnancy detection,
34 prenatal services, and adoption counseling, for child care and
35 case management services for adolescent parents, and for

1 teacher training.

2 The bill requires public school boards to establish local
3 advisory committees to study and make recommendations on the
4 inclusion or exclusion of human growth and development in-
5 struction in all grades. The school board may or may not pro-
6 vide such instruction. The state department of education is
7 required to develop model human growth and development cur-
8 ricula for grades kindergarten through twelve for distribution
9 to the local school boards and advisory committees.

10 The bill encourages the use of federal block grant funds
11 for certain services relating to reproductive health care.

FISCAL NOTE

REQUESTED BY REPRESENTATIVE HESTER

In compliance with a written request received March 27, 1987, a fiscal note for SENATE FILE 219 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the legislature upon request.

Senate File 219 establishes a task force on adolescent pregnancy prevention and services, provides for pilot project grants relating to adolescent pregnancy prevention and services, establishes a local advisory committee on public school boards regarding the inclusion or exclusion of human growth and development instruction in schools, and directs the department of education to make model human growth and development curricula available to school districts and local advisory committees.

No money is appropriated in this bill.

Section 1: This section names the act and has no fiscal effect.

Section 2: This section establishes a task force on pregnancy prevention and services. The composition of its voting members is established. Compensation and reimbursement procedures are established. The legislative council may authorize the use of available legislative council funds to pay for the task force's expenses.

ASSUMPTIONS

1. The lieutenant governor, four legislators, four state agency representatives, and fourteen public members compose the membership of public members compose the membership of the task force.
2. The lieutenant governor receives \$100 per day (\$50 per day compensation and \$40 for expenses); each legislator receives \$40 per day plus expenses; each public member is reimbursed for their expenses.
3. The work of the task force will require two meetings monthly and will be completed by January, 1988 (12 meetings total).
4. Staff support for the task force will be provided as in-kind support by the legislative council and state agency representatives.

FISCAL EFFECT

It is estimated that \$18,600 would be needed to cover the costs of the task force. This results from the following:

Section 3: This section requires the deputy director of human services, and the directors of the department of education, the department of human resources, and the department of public health, or their designees, jointly prepare a

administer grants for two year pilot projects. Potential grant recipients may be public school corporations, adolescent service providers, and nonprofit organizations involved in adolescent issues. Those areas of the state with the highest incidence of teenage pregnancy should be targeted. Fundable programs should address teenage pregnancy prevention, sexual abstinence, early pregnancy detection, or shelter services. Other fundable programs include child care and case management services, or teacher training, including transportation costs and workshop, conference and course work expenses.

ASSUMPTIONS

1. Only one of the four agencies would administer the funds.

FISCAL EFFECT:

The estimated yearly cost for administration is \$48,000. A breakdown of this cost is provided below:

Full-time Project Manager	\$34,000
Half-time Secretary	9,000
Travel	5,000
Total	\$48,000

Section 4: This section requires each school board of directors to appoint a local advisory committee. Each committee is to study making available to K-12 students instruction in topics related to human growth and development. Each committee is to make recommendations and report at least once every three years to its local school board. A written copy of this report must be filed with the department of education.

K-12 school boards are given the option of providing an instructional program in human growth and development. Parents may request an outline of the course material. Pupils are not required to take the course if their parents or guardian ask in writing that the child be excused.

The department of education is required to distribute model human growth and development curricula to all school boards and local advisory committees. The department of education is also required to assist in the use or adaptation of the curricula.

ASSUMPTIONS

1. The department of education will also be administering the grants.
2. A full-time project manager will be able to administer the grants as well as disseminate model curricula. Thus, additional project manager salary costs will not be needed.
3. A full-time instead of a half-time secretary would be needed, adding another \$9,000 to the \$48,000 cost estimate for administration derived in the previous section.



31 1. Each board of directors of a school corporation shall
32 appoint an advisory committee composed of at least one person
33 from each of the following groups: parents, teachers, school
34 administrators, pupils, health care professionals, members of
35 the clergy, and other residents of the school district. The

1 advisory committee shall study making available to pupils in
2 grades kindergarten through twelve, instruction appropriate to
3 the pupils' grade level, age, and level of maturity, in topics
4 related to human growth and development in order to promote
5 accurate and comprehensive knowledge in this area, to foster
6 responsible decision making, based on cause and effect, and to
7 support and enhance the efforts of parents to provide moral
8 guidance to their children. The advisory committee in its
9 study shall address and make recommendations on the inclusion

- 15 d. Family life and parenting skills.

- 19 f. Sex stereotypes and protective behavior.
- 20 g. Sexually transmitted diseases and their causes and

22 2. The advisory committee shall make its recommendations

27 available at reduced cost to the adolescents.

28 b. Requiring certain reproductive health care providers to
29 develop a purchase of service unit specific to the provision
30 of reproductive health care services to adolescents.

31 c. Developing service units providing referral and
32 transportation between youth service agencies and reproductive
33 health care providers.

34 An adolescent's eligibility shall not reflect the financial
35 resources of the adolescent's family.

Dear Governor Zimmerman:

Senate File 219, "An Act providing for public grants and public education relating to adolescent pregnancy prevention and services by establishing a task force on adolescent pregnancy prevention and services, providing for pilot project grants relating to adolescent pregnancy prevention and services, and establishing a local advisory committee to public school boards regarding the inclusion or exclusion of human growth and development instruction in the school curriculum" is hereby transmitted to you in accordance with Article III, Section 16, of the Constitution of the State of Iowa.

Senate File 219 establishes a task force to be appointed by the legislative council to study the need for the availability of adolescent pregnancy prevention and services programs in the state. It also requires that the task force make recommendations on such programs to the next General Assembly.

In addition, Senate File 219 establishes an adolescent pregnancy prevention and services grant program. Also, public school boards would establish local advisory committees to make recommendations on human growth and development instruction and the state Department of Education would develop a model curriculum for that purpose.

The recent well-publicized cases of unmarried adolescent pregnancies, teen suicides, and adolescent substance abuse are all evidence of the problems faced by many teens in Iowa and throughout the country today. Public policy makers must address this problem and it is quite clear that the focus of the solution should be on education and the preservation of

the family unit. The deterioration of the family and the lack of the sense of self-worth and esteem by many teens have been determined by many experts to be among the major reasons for the rash of teen problems that our country is experiencing today.

As a result, I understand why the General Assembly took action to attempt to address the teen pregnancy issue. However, I believe that Senate File 219 approaches this problem in a narrow and inappropriate way.

For the following reasons, I, therefore, must disapprove Senate File 219.

The task force established in the bill is flawed. First of all, any effort to address teen pregnancy must be broad-based and encompass both executive and legislative branches of government as well as the wide range of individuals and views involved in this issue. The task force established in this bill is totally controlled and appointed by the legislative council -- with even the few executive branch representatives appointed by the legislative council. In addition, I am concerned that such a task force would have a narrow representation and not include representatives from organizations who are opposed to abortion and the use of contraceptives to prevent teen pregnancies.


This task force charge is too narrow. Teen pregnancy is not the only problem that teens are facing -- substance abuse and teen suicide are also all too frequent reminders of the problems faced by adolescents in our society today. I believe that the task force should focus on all of these issues. Therefore, I believe that the task force mission should be broadened to include an analysis of the symptoms and the causes for teen problems today.

Finally, I find this bill objectionable because it would not prohibit the use of grants to fund abortion and other proposed solutions to the teenage pregnancy problems which could encourage promiscuity. I believe the focus to the problem must be on the preservation of the family unit, on improving the education of our adolescents and on increasing their sense of self-worth and esteem. I will review the appropriation to be provided for the grants with these priorities in mind.

Because of the serious adolescent problems faced by youth in Iowa and across the nation today, I plan to establish, by Executive Order, a broad-based task force including representation from the legislature and the diverse organizations involved in this issue. I will ask that task force to study teen suicide, pregnancy, and substance abuse problems facing us today and develop a consensus on solutions for consideration by myself and the General Assembly in 1988. We will invite wide participation and public comment on this task force so that we can develop a set of recommendations that I find acceptable and that will appropriately address the problems faced by Iowa teens today.
