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1 Section 1. Section 467A.4, subsection 4, paragraph b, Code
2 Supplement 1987, is amended to read as follows:

3 b. To take notice of each district's long-range resource

6 informed of the activities and experience of all other
7 districts, and to facilitate an interchange of advice and

32 This bill requires soil and water conservation districts to
33 develop a comprehensive long-range soil and water resource
34 conservation plan for the district, with assistance from
35 several agencies including the division of soil conservation

2 Iowa cooperative extension service. The plan is filed with
3 the division as part of a state soil and conservation plan
4 after review by the division and approval by the state soil
5 conservation committee.

In compliance with a written request received January 19, 1988, a fiscal note for SENATE FILE 2051 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 2051 relates to the development of soil and water resource conservation plans by soil and water conservation districts and the Division of Soil Conservation of the Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship.

FISCAL EFFECT

The Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship estimates that Senate File 2051 will have a fiscal effect of \$539,500 for FY 1989. This includes \$425,000 in salaries for 11 FTE and \$114,500 in support costs. The fiscal effect for FY 1990 is \$1,074,000, including \$925,000 for 28 FTE and \$149,000 for support costs. The fiscal effect for FY 1991 is the same as for FY 1990.

ASSUMPTIONS

Creates a three year program to establish 12 field offices throughout the State. Seven field offices will be created in the first year and five additional offices will be created in year two.

FY 1989: Seven field offices will be created; 10 professional staff will be hired (7 field office coordinators & 3 central office staff), 1 clerical staff for central office; rent for seven field offices; travel for 6 FTE; office equipment purchases (13 typewriters & 15 laptop computers); \$500 supplies.
FY 1990: All twelve field offices will be established; 15 professional staff (12 field office coordinators & 3 central staff), 13 clerical staff (one for each office); rent for 12 field offices; travel for 15 FTE; \$2,000 supplies.

- Professional staff x \$40,000 per year
- Clerical staff x \$25,000 per year
- Travel expenses per FTE = \$5,000 per year
- Office rent = \$6,000 per year
- Office equipment = 13 typewriters and 15 laptop computers

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF SOIL AND WATER RESOURCE
CONSERVATION PLANS BY SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICTS
AND THE DIVISION OF SOIL CONSERVATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 467A.4, subsection 4, paragraph b, Code Supplement 1987, is amended to read as follows:

b. To take notice of each district's long-range resource conservation plan established under section 467A.4, in order to keep the commissioners of each of the several districts informed of the activities and experience of all other districts, and to facilitate an interchange of advice and experience between such districts and co-operation between them.

Sec. 2. Section 467A.4, subsection 4, paragraphs g and h, Code Supplement 1987, are amended by striking the paragraphs and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

g. To assist each soil and water conservation district in developing a district soil and water resource conservation plan as provided under section 467A.7. The plan shall be developed according to rules adopted by the division to preserve and protect the public interest in the soil and water resources of this state for future generations and for this purpose to encourage, promote, facilitate, and where such public interest requires, to mandate the conservation and proper control of and use of the soil and water resources of this state, by measures including, but not limited to, the control of floods, the control of erosion by water or by wind, the preservation of the quality of water for its optimum use

for agricultural, irrigation, recreational, industrial, and domestic purposes, all of which shall be presumed to be conducive to the public health, convenience, and welfare, both present and future.

h. To file the district soil and water resource conservation plans as part of a state soil and water resource conservation plan. The state plan shall contain on a statewide basis the information required for a district plan under this section.

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a. The district plan shall contain a comprehensive long-range assessment of soil and surface water resources in the district consistent with rules approved by the committee under section 467A.4. In developing the plan the district may receive technical support from the United States department of agriculture's soil conservation service and the county board of supervisors in the county where the district is located. The division and the Iowa cooperative extension service in agriculture and home economics may provide technical support to the district. The support may include, but is not limited to, the following: assessing the condition of soil and surface water in the district, including an evaluation of the type, amount, and quality of soil and water, the threat of soil erosion and erosion, floodwater, and sediment damages, and necessary preventative and control measures; developing methods to maintain or improve soil and water condition; and cooperating with other state and federal agencies to carry out this support.

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the committee approves the district plan and after the administrator of the division signs the district plan. The commissioners shall provide notice of the filing and may provide a copy of the approved district plan to the county board of supervisors in the county where the district is located.
