A BILL FOR

1 An Act providing additional supplementary weighting for high
2 school students enrolled in vocational or technical training
3 classes provided in merged area schools and providing an
4 effective date.

1 Section 1. Section 442.39, subsection 2, Code Supplement
2 1987, is amended to read as follows:

3 2. Pupils Except as otherwise provided in this section,
4 pupils attending classes in another school district or an a
5 merged area school, attending classes taught by a teacher who
6 is employed jointly under section 280.15, or attending classes
7 taught by a teacher who is employed by another school
8 district, are assigned a weighting of one plus and, in
9 addition, a weighting of five-tenths times the percent of the
10 pupil's school day during which the pupil attends classes in
11 another district or a merged area school, attends classes
12 taught by a teacher who is jointly employed under section
13 280.15, or attends classes taught by a teacher who is employed
14 by another school district, if the school budget review
15 committee certifies to the department of management that the
16 shared classes or teachers would otherwise not be implemented
17 without the assignment of additional weighting. However, in
18 lieu of the additional weighting of five-tenths, the school
19 budget review committee shall assign an additional weighting
20 of one-tenth as follows:

21 a. One-tenth times the percent of the pupil's school day
22 in which a pupil attends classes in another district or an a
23 merged area school, attends classes taught by a teacher who is
24 employed jointly under section 280.15, or attends classes
25 taught by a teacher who is employed by another district, in
26 districts that have a substantial number of students in any of
27 grades seven through twelve sharing more than one class or
28 teacher.

29 PARAGRAPH DIVIDED. Effective July 1, 1986, the additional
30 weighting of one-tenth may be assigned by the school budget
31 review committee for a maximum of five years, and thereafter,
32 the additional weighting of one-tenth shall not be assigned
33 under this section, but may be assigned under section 442.39A.

34 b. Eight-tenths times the percent of the pupil's school
35 day in which a pupil attends classes of vocational or

1 technical training provided under a contract between a merged
2 area school and two or more school districts each of which has
3 a certified enrollment of fewer than two thousand four hundred
4 pupils.

5 Sec. 2. This Act takes effect for the school year
6 beginning July 1, 1989.

7 EXPLANATION

8 This bill provides additional weighting of eight-tenths for
9 high school pupils enrolled in classes of vocational or
10 technical training provided under a contract between a merged
11 area school and two or more school districts with enrollments
12 of fewer than two thousand four hundred pupils. The
13 additional weighting is based upon the percent of the pupil's
14 school day that the pupil attends the vocational or technical
15 training classes.

16 The bill takes effect for the school year beginning July 1,
17 1989.
