1 Section 1. Section 249D.14, Code 1987, is amended by
2 adding the following new subsection:
3 NEW SUBSECTION. 10. Adopt policies by which eligibility
4 for federal, state, and local funding is established at age
5 sixty, with preference in service delivery given to elders age
6 seventy-five or older.

7 EXPLANATION

8 This bill requires the commission of elder affairs to adopt
9 policies which establish eligibility for federal, state, and
10 local funding at age sixty and give preference in service
11 delivery to persons age seventy-five or older.

In compliance with a written request received February 19, 1988, a fiscal note for SENATE FILE 2180 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 2180 requires the Commission of Elder Affairs to adopt policies which establish eligibility for Federal, State, and Local funding at age sixty and gives preference in service delivery to persons age seventy-five and older.

Assumptions

1. Federal Law provides for service delivery to persons age sixty and older.
2. Current State Law provides for service delivery to persons age sixty-five and older.
3. Changing the State Law would make the same level of services accessible to those age sixty and over.

Fiscal Effect:

This bill has no fiscal impact.
