1 Section 1. IOWA STATE FAIRGROUNDS -- CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS
2 -- APPROPRIATION.

3 1. The general assembly finds and declares the following:

4 a. The Iowa state fair, one hundred and thirty-four years
5 old, has been recognized around the country as a premiere
6 showcase of agricultural products, foods, and crafts
7 reflecting Iowa's heritage, manufactured goods and equipment,
8 technology, and family entertainment.

9 b. The facilities at the fairgrounds are used to host a
10 variety of important events, shows, and competitions,
11 including the Iowa state fair which has been located at the
12 fairgrounds for one hundred two years.

13 c. The state intends over the next ten years to invest
14 thirty million (30,000,000) dollars on capital improvements to
15 preserve the fairgrounds as a premiere site of the Iowa state
16 fair and other events.

17 2. There is appropriated from the general fund of the
18 state to the department of agriculture and land stewardship,
19 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1989, and ending June
20 30, 1990, five million (5,000,000) dollars, or so much thereof
21 as is necessary, to be used by the Iowa state fair board for
22 capital improvements to the Iowa state fairgrounds, or
23 property administered by the Iowa state fair board, including
24 but not limited to the construction, erection, or repair of
25 buildings, streets, railways, or other facilities, and the
26 purchase or repair and maintenance of equipment or vehicles.

27 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unobligated or unencumbered
28 funds appropriated by this section for the fiscal year
29 beginning July 1, 1989, and ending June 30, 1990, remaining on
30 June 30, 1993, shall revert to the general fund of the state
31 on September 30, 1993. However, if the projects for which
32 these funds are appropriated are completed prior to June 30,
33 1993, the remaining unobligated or unencumbered funds shall
34 revert to the general fund of the state on September 30
35 following the end of the fiscal year in which the projects are

EXPLANATION

This bill declares that the state fairgrounds are important to Iowa and declares an intention by the state to invest \$30,000,000 in capital improvements in the fairgrounds over the next ten years. There is appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1989, \$5,000,000 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship to be used for capital improvements to the fairgrounds and property administered by the fair board.

FISCAL NOTE

A fiscal note for SENATE FILE 172 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 172 declares that the State Fairgrounds are important to Iowa and declares an intention by the State to invest \$30,000,000 in capital improvements in the Fairgrounds over the next ten years. This bill provides an appropriation of \$5,000,000 for FY 1990 to the Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship to be used for capital improvements to the Fairgrounds and property administered by the Fair Board.

The capital projects are ranked according to the following priorities:

1. Mandated Requirements - either by legislation or city requirements
2. Safety of the fairgoer - hazardous conditions
3. Renovation, maintenance, and repair - to stop facility deterioration

CAPITAL PROJECTS

1. \$182,000 Sanitary Landfill;
2. \$500,000 Wooden seats and understructure of the Livestock Pavillion;
3. \$850,000 Grandstand structural concrete repairs;
4. \$836,000 Varied Industries Building floor and drainage system repairs;
5. \$200,000 Horse Barn repairs to the east brick entrance;
6. \$776,888 Concrete and asphalt walkway repairs;
7. \$250,000 Livestock wash racks and sewer system repairs
8. \$712,488 Miscellaneous roof replacement for the Sheep Barn, Horse Barn, and the Administration Building;
9. \$342,624 Miscellaneous tuck pointing for the Sheep Barn, Swine Barn, Horse Barn, Cattle Barn, Administration Building, Varied Industries Building, and the Grandstand;
10. \$350,000 Structural steel, wood repair, and painting for the Administration Building, Varied Industries Building, Sheep Barn, and the Swine Barn.

The Governor has included \$2,500,000 of these capital projects as priority eight on his capitals contingency list for FY 1990. This list of capital projects are to be funded in order of priority from one-half of any revenues in excess of those projected by the Revenue Estimating Conference. There are \$23.9 million worth of capitals on the prioritized list prior to those for the State Fair.
