A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to expenditures of moneys on state park roads,
2 county conservation parkways, and the great river road.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 111A.12 COUNTY ALLOCATION OF
2 SECONDARY ROAD FUNDS FOR COUNTY CONSERVATION PROJECTS.

3 A county board of supervisors may make available to its
4 county conservation board for the improvement, construction,
5 or reconstruction of the county conservation parkways within
6 the county any portion of the county's allotment of secondary
7 road funds as provided under section 309.93A.

8 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 309.93A COUNTY ALLOCATION OF
9 SECONDARY ROAD FUNDS FOR COUNTY CONSERVATION PARKWAY PROJECTS.

10 A county, in any year, by resolution of its board of
11 supervisors, may make available for improvement, construction,
12 or reconstruction of county conservation parkways within the
13 county any portion of its allotment of secondary road funds to
14 its county conservation board. However, the improvement,
15 construction, or reconstruction project for the county
16 conservation parkway shall be included as part of the county's
17 secondary road construction program under section 309.22 and
18 is subject to review by the department under section 309.94,
19 and subject to program operation requirements under section
20 309.96, subsection 2.

21 Sec. 3. Section 315.3, Code 1989, is amended by adding the
22 following new subsection:

23 NEW SUBSECTION. 1A. The fund is also appropriated for and
24 may be used for expenditures that are of a nonrecurring nature
25 which result in long-term improvements in state park roads,
26 county conservation parkways, or the great river road. As
27 used in this subsection, "great river road" means great river
28 road as defined in section 308.3. For purposes of sections
29 315.4 and 315.6, expenditures for great river road projects
30 may be funded from primary road projects, secondary road
31 projects, and city street projects depending upon the
32 classification of that portion of the great river road
33 involved in the project. For purposes of section 315.4, a
34 state park road project shall be deemed to be a primary road
35 project and a county conservation parkway project shall be

1 deemed to be a secondary road project. Except for subsection
2 7 of section 315.11, section 315.11 does not apply to
3 applications submitted for funds under this subsection.
4 Notwithstanding section 315.5, the department in ranking
5 applications for funds shall only consider the proportion of
6 political subdivision matching funds to be provided, if any,
7 the proportion of private contributions to be provided, if
8 any, and the level of need.

9 Sec. 4. Section 315.3, subsection 2, Code 1989, is amended
10 to read as follows:

11 2. The fund is also appropriated and shall be used for the
12 reimbursement or payment to cities or counties of all or part
13 of the interest and principal on general obligation bonds
14 issued by cities or counties for the purpose of financing
15 approved road and street projects meeting the requirements of
16 subsection 1 or 1A.

17 EXPLANATION

18 This bill allows a county to make available to its county
19 conservation board, for improvement, construction, or
20 reconstruction of county conservation parkways within the
21 county, any portion of its allotment of secondary road funds.
22 The money may be made available to the county conservation
23 board by a resolution of the county board of supervisors.
24 However, the project must be included as part of the county's
25 secondary road construction program under section 309.22 and
26 is subject to review by the state department of transportation
27 under section 309.94 and is subject to program operations
28 requirements under section 309.96, subsection 2.

29 This bill also allows RISE moneys to be used for
30 expenditures that are of a nonrecurring nature which result in
31 long-term improvements in state park roads, county
32 conservation parkways, or the great river road.
