FISCAL NOTE

A fiscal note for Senate File 2250 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 2250 relates to the salaries paid to chaplains employed in state institutions. If a chaplain employed in a state institution is not furnished a residence by the state, 25 percent of the chaplain's salary would be considered to be an amount paid to the chaplain in lieu of furnishing a residence.

Senate File 2250 creates no additional cost to the state. However, if part of the salary were to be deemed tax-exempt, this could result in less revenue generated from income taxes. However, this loss of revenue is not anticipated to be significant.
