**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to the purchase of pistols, holsters, and  
 2 magazine holders by the department of public safety.  
 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Amend Senate File 201 as follows:

2 1. Page 1, line 20, by striking the words "Five  
3 hundred" and inserting the following: "Four hundred  
4 fifty".

S-3086 FILED MARCH 5, 1991

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1 Section 1. FINDINGS. The general assembly finds that to  
2 provide for the safety of highway patrol officers in an era of  
3 increasing rates of serious and violent crime it is necessary  
4 to replace the revolver and cross-draw holster currently in  
5 use by the highway patrol with a semiautomatic pistol and  
6 strong-side security holster.

7 Sec. 2. DEFINITIONS. As used in this Act, unless the  
8 context otherwise requires:

9 1. "Cross-draw holster" means a holster worn on the side  
10 of the officer opposite the officer's dominant shooting hand.

11 2. "Dominant shooting hand" means the hand with which the  
12 officer primarily shoots.

13 3. "Strong-side security holster" means a holster worn on  
14 the side of the officer's dominant shooting hand and which  
15 contains devices which impede the unauthorized removal of the  
16 pistol from the holster.

3066 17 Sec. 3. PURCHASE OF NEW EQUIPMENT. The department of  
18 public safety shall solicit bids for the purchase of the  
19 following:

20 1. Five hundred Smith and Wesson model 4006 .40 caliber  
21 semiautomatic pistols.

22 2. Five hundred Safariland model 070 SS III high gloss  
23 strong-side security holsters.

24 3. Five hundred Safariland model 79HS magazine holders in  
25 high gloss finish.

3066 26 Sec. 4. DISPOSITION OF REVOLVER -- PROCEEDS. The  
27 department of public safety shall offer each highway patrol  
28 officer the opportunity to purchase the revolver carried by  
29 the officer, before the purchase and deployment of the new  
30 equipment purchased pursuant to section 3 of this Act, for two  
31 hundred dollars. Revolvers not purchased by the officers may  
32 be disposed of by public sale or otherwise as directed by the  
33 department.

34 The proceeds from the sale or other disposition of the  
35 revolvers shall be used to defray the cost of purchasing the

1 equipment listed in section 3 of this Act as directed by the  
2 department.

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EXPLANATION

This bill directs the department of public safety to solicit bids for the purchase of new pistols, holsters, and magazine holders to replace the revolvers now in use by the highway patrol. In addition, the bill also directs the department to offer the revolvers to be replaced for sale to the officers of the highway patrol prior to other disposition of the revolvers, with the proceeds used to defray the cost of purchasing the new equipment.

FISCAL NOTE

A fiscal note for Senate File 201 as amended by S3086 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 201, as amended, directs the Department of Public Safety to solicit bids for the purchase of 450 new semiautomatic pistols, holsters, and magazine holders to replace the revolvers now in use by the highway patrol. The bill also directs the Department to offer the revolvers and holsters to be replaced to the patrol officers prior to disposition, with the proceeds used to defray the cost of the new equipment.

Assumptions

Estimated cost of equipment specified in bill:

1. Gun	\$400.00
2. Holster	\$68.00
3. Magazine holder	\$16.50
4. Additional clip	\$25.00
5. Night sights	\$65.00
6. Ammunition for training	\$175.00
7. Total cost of equipment	\$749.50

An estimated 200 troopers will purchase their revolvers and holsters at a cost of \$200. (Estimated revenue:  $200 \times 200 = \$40,000$ )

The remaining 250 revolvers will be traded-in at the assessed value of \$130. The holsters have no trade-in value. (Estimated revenue:  $\$130 \times 250 = \$32,500$ )

The new revolvers and equipment would be funded from the Road Use Tax Fund.

Fiscal Effect

Total cost of 450 revolvers and equipment	\$337,275
Less Recovered cost ( $\$40,000 + \$32,500$ )	<u>72,500</u>
TOTAL ADDITIONAL COST	\$264,775
