A BILL FOR

1 An Act to specify that the amount of funds retained by area  
2 education agencies for administrative expenses reimbursement  
3 under the federal-state, special education medicaid  
4 reimbursement program is to be calculated as a percentage of  
5 the federal portion of the amount reimbursed, and providing an  
6 effective date.

1 Section 1. Section 281.15, subsection 7, Code Supplement  
2 1991, is amended to read as follows:

3 7. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, all  
4 reimbursements received by the area education agencies for  
5 eligible services shall be paid annually to the treasurer of  
6 state. The area education agencies shall, after determining  
7 the administrative costs associated with the implementation of  
8 medical assistance reimbursement for the eligible services, be  
9 permitted to retain up to twenty-five percent of the federal  
10 portion of the total amount reimbursed to pay for the  
11 administrative costs. Funds received under this subsection  
12 shall not be considered or included as part of the area  
13 education agencies' budgets when calculating funds that are to  
14 be received by area education agencies during a fiscal year.  
15 Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the treasurer  
16 of state shall credit all receipts received under this  
17 subsection to the general fund of the state.

18 Sec. 2. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance,  
19 takes effect upon enactment.

EXPLANATION

21 This bill provides that the amount of funds to be retained  
22 by an area education agency, for reimbursement of the  
23 administrative costs associated with the federal-state  
24 medicaid reimbursement program, is to be calculated as a  
25 percentage of the federal portion of the total funds received  
26 by the area education agency. Area education agencies are  
27 reimbursed under the program as a result of the provision of  
28 certain special education services by the agencies. The  
29 balance of the total funds "received" is made up of certain  
30 department of human services' funds.

31 This bill takes effect upon enactment.

AN ACT

TO SPECIFY THAT THE AMOUNT OF FUNDS RETAINED BY AREA EDUCATION AGENCIES FOR ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES REIMBURSEMENT UNDER THE FEDERAL-STATE, SPECIAL EDUCATION MEDICAID REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM IS TO BE CALCULATED AS A PERCENTAGE OF THE FEDERAL PORTION OF THE AMOUNT REIMBURSED, AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 281.15, subsection 7, Code Supplement 1991, is amended to read as follows:

7. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, all reimbursements received by the area education agencies for eligible services shall be paid annually to the treasurer of state. The area education agencies shall, after determining the administrative costs associated with the implementation of medical assistance reimbursement for the eligible services, be permitted to retain up to twenty-five percent of the federal portion of the total amount reimbursed to pay for the administrative costs. Funds received under this subsection shall not be considered or included as part of the area education agencies' budgets when calculating funds that are to be received by area education agencies during a fiscal year. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the treasurer of state shall credit all receipts received under this subsection to the general fund of the state.
