A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the establishment of a preference for the
2 purchase of recycled lubricating and industrial oils by the
3 department of general services, the state board of regents,
4 the state department of transportation, and the department for
5 the blind.

1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 18.22 LUBRICATION OIL AND
2 INDUSTRIAL OIL PURCHASES.

3 The department shall do all of the following:

4 1. Revise its procedures and specifications for the
5 purchase of lubricating oil and industrial oil to eliminate
6 exclusion of recycled oils and any requirement that oils be
7 manufactured from virgin materials.

8 2. Require that purchases of lubricating oil and
9 industrial oil be made from the seller whose oil product
10 contains the greatest percentage of recycled oil, unless one
11 of the following circumstances regarding a specific oil
12 product containing recycled oil exists:

13 a. The product is not available within a reasonable period
14 of time or in quantities necessary to meet a state agency's
15 needs.

16 b. The product does not meet the performance requirements
17 or standards recommended by the equipment or vehicle
18 manufacturer, including any warranty requirements.

19 c. The product is available only at a cost greater than
20 one hundred five percent of the cost of comparable virgin oil
21 products.

22 3. Establish and maintain a preference program for
23 procuring oils containing the maximum content of recycled oil.
24 The preference program shall include but is not limited to all
25 of the following:

26 a. The inclusion of the preferences for recycled oil
27 products in publications used to solicit bids from suppliers.

28 b. The provision of a description of the recycled oil
29 procurement program at bidders' conferences.

30 c. Discussion of the preference program in lubricating oil
31 and industrial oil procurement solicitations or invitations to
32 bid.

33 d. Efforts to inform industry trade associations about the
34 preference program.

35 Sec. 2. Section 262.9, subsection 5, Code Supplement 1991,

1 is amended to read as follows:

2 5. In conjunction with the recommendations made by the
3 department of natural resources, purchase and use recycled
4 printing and writing paper, with the exception of specialized
5 paper when no recyclable product is available, in accordance
6 with the schedule established in section 18.18; establish a
7 wastepaper recycling program by January 1, 1990, for all
8 institutions governed by the board in accordance with
9 recommendations made by the department of natural resources
10 and the requirements of section 18.20; comply with, and the
11 institutions governed by the board shall also comply with the
12 recycling goal, recycling schedule, and ultimate termination
13 of purchase and use of polystyrene products for the purpose of
14 storing, packaging, or serving food for immediate consumption
15 pursuant to section 455D.16; and shall, in accordance with the
16 requirements of section 18.6, require product content
17 statements, the provision of information regarding on-site
18 review of waste management in product bidding and contract
19 procedures, and compliance with requirements regarding
20 procurement specifications; and shall comply with the
21 requirements for the purchase of lubricating oils and
22 industrial oils as established pursuant to section 18.22.

23 Sec. 3. Section 307.21, subsection 4, paragraph b, Code
24 Supplement 1991, is amended by adding the following new
25 subparagraph:

26 NEW SUBPARAGRAPH. (5) Comply with the requirements for
27 the purchase of lubricating oils and industrial oils as
28 established pursuant to section 18.22.

29 Sec. 4. Section 601L.3, Code Supplement 1991, is amended
30 by adding the following new subsection:

31 NEW SUBSECTION. 16. Comply with the requirements for the
32 purchase of lubricating oils and industrial oils as
33 established pursuant to section 18.22.

34 EXPLANATION

35 This bill requires the department of general services, the

1 state board of regents, the state department of
2 transportation, and the department for the blind to revise
3 their procedures and specifications for the purchase of
4 lubricating and industrial oils, to purchase lubricating and
5 industrial oils which include recycled oils with certain
6 exceptions, and to establish a preference program for
7 procuring oils containing the maximum content of recycled
8 oils.
