1 Section 1. Section 281.2, subsection 1, Code 1991, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 1. "Children requiring special education" means persons
4 under twenty-one years of age, including children under five
5 years of age, who are handicapped in obtaining an education
6 because of a head injury, autism, behavioral disorder, or
7 physical, mental, communication or learning disabilities-or
8 who-are-behaviorally-disordered disability, as defined by the
9 rules of the department of education.

10 EXPLANATION

11 This bill includes children who are handicapped in
12 obtaining an education because of a head injury or autism in
13 the definition of children requiring special education,
14 enabling these children to receive the same educational
15 services as those children who are otherwise handicapped in
16 obtaining an education because of physical, mental,
17 communication, or learning disabilities or who are
18 behaviorally disordered.

19 This bill may include a state mandate as defined in section
20 25B.3.

Senate File 2158 includes children who are handicapped in obtaining an education because of a head injury or autism in the definition of children requiring special education, enabling these children to receive the same educational services as those children who are otherwise handicapped in obtaining an education because of physical, mental, communication, or learning disabilities or who are behaviorally disordered.

Assumptions:

1. The populations delineated in this bill are currently being served by the Department of Education in other categories.
2. This legislation will conform the state laws to the reauthorization of Public Law 94-142 (PL 94-142).

Fiscal Effect:

Senate File 2158 is estimated to have no fiscal effect on either the State General Fund or local school district budgets.
