1 An Act relating to information identifying inert ingredients in  
2 pesticides, and providing retroactive applicability and  
3 effective dates.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 206.2, subsection 22, Code Supplement  
2 1991, is amended to read as follows:

3 22. "Poison control center" means an entity existing as  
4 part of a hospital licensed under chapter 135B which adheres  
5 ~~to-the-standards~~ is an institutional member of the American  
6 association of poison control centers.

7 Sec. 2. Section 206.12, subsection 2, paragraph c,  
8 unnumbered paragraphs 3 and 4, Code Supplement 1991, are  
9 amended to read as follows:

10 From on and after July 1, 1990, ~~to-December-31,-1991~~  
11 through June 30, 1992, the identity of an inert ingredient in  
12 a specific pesticide shall be treated as a confidential trade  
13 secret which is not subject to release under chapter 22.

14 On and after ~~January~~ July 1, 1992, the identity of an inert  
15 ingredient in a specific pesticide shall be treated as a  
16 confidential trade secret if the following two conditions are  
17 met: the registrant states, at the time of registration, that  
18 the inert ingredient is a confidential trade secret; and the  
19 registrant certifies one of the following:

20 Sec. 3. Section 206.12, subsection 2, paragraph c,  
21 subparagraph (1), Code Supplement 1991, is amended to read as  
22 follows:

23 (1) The registrant has provided to any data base system  
24 used available twenty-four hours each day every day of the  
25 year for use by a poison control center operating in this  
26 state the information required by an attending physician to  
27 treat a patient for exposure or adverse reaction to the  
28 registrant's product, including the identification of all  
29 ingredients which are toxic to humans.

30 Sec. 4. APPLICABILITY AND EFFECTIVE DATES.

31 1. Sections 206.2, subsection 22, and 206.12, subsection  
32 2, paragraph "c", as amended by this Act, are retroactively  
33 applicable to July 1, 1990. The applicability of those  
34 provisions shall require that information regarding inert  
35 ingredients received by state officials shall remain

1 confidential.

2 2. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes  
3 effect upon enactment.

4 EXPLANATION

5 This bill amends provisions in chapter 206 regulating the  
6 registration of pesticides including identification of inert  
7 ingredients contained in pesticides. Section 206.12 currently  
8 provides that an inert ingredient must be treated as a  
9 confidential trade secret until December 31, 1991. This bill  
10 extends that date to June 30, 1992. The section currently  
11 provides that after December 31, 1991, the identity of the  
12 inert ingredient is confidential if certain conditions are  
13 satisfied. One condition requires that the registrant of the  
14 pesticide provide information to a data base used by poison  
15 control centers accessed by physicians. The bill requires  
16 that the poison control center be an institutional member of  
17 the American association of poison control centers. The bill  
18 also requires that the data base system be available 24 hours  
19 each day every day of the year. The provisions of the bill  
20 are retroactively applicable to July 1, 1990, and the bill  
21 becomes effective upon enactment.
