**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations to state agencies  
2 whose responsibilities relate to public defense, public  
3 safety, transportation and enforcement, and including  
4 allocation and use of moneys from the use tax, road use tax  
5 fund, and primary road fund, establishing a pilot project for  
6 issuing motor vehicle licenses, and relating to Iowa law  
7 enforcement academy certification courses and providing  
8 effective dates.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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*SF 232*

1 IOWA LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY

2 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of  
3 the state to the Iowa law enforcement academy for the fiscal  
4 year beginning July 1, 1993, and ending June 30, 1994, the  
5 following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be  
6 used for the purposes designated:

7 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
8 including jailer training and technical assistance, and for  
9 not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

10 .....	\$	857,297
11 .....	FTEs	23.95

12 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC DEFENSE

13 Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the general fund of the  
14 state to the department of public defense for the fiscal year  
15 beginning July 1, 1993, and ending June 30, 1994, the  
16 following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be  
17 used for the purposes designated:

18 1. MILITARY DIVISION

19 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
20 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
21 positions:

22 .....	\$	3,710,534
23 .....	FTEs	209.26

24 When necessary, the military division is authorized to  
25 incur up to an additional \$500,000 in expenditures as long as  
26 the cash balance of the state for the fiscal year is zero or  
27 greater within 60 days after the closing of the fiscal year.

28 The department of public defense shall not eliminate any  
29 fire fighter positions at the Des Moines international airport  
30 except through attrition. The department may use funds  
31 appropriated in this lettered paragraph to fund fire fighter  
32 positions not funded under the agreement on fire fighters  
33 between the federal government, the department, and the Des  
34 Moines international airport.

35 2. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIVISION

1 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
2 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent

7 Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the general fund of the

11 used for the purposes designated:

13 including the medical examiner's office and the criminal  
14 justice information system, and for not more than the  
15 following full-time equivalent positions:

18 2. For the division of criminal investigation and bureau

26 Sec. 4. There is appropriated from the road use tax fund  
27 to the division of highway safety, uniformed force, and radio  
28 communications of the department of public safety for the  
29 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1993, and ending June 30, 1994,  
30 the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to  
31 be used for the purposes designated:

32 1. For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous  
33 purposes, including the state's contribution to the peace  
34 officers' retirement, accident, and disability system provided  
35 in chapter 97A in the amount of 18 percent of the salaries for

1 which the funds are appropriated, and for not more than the  
2 following full-time equivalent positions:

4 ..... FTEs 549.50

5 a. It is the intent of the general assembly that \$975,000  
6 of the appropriation in this subsection shall be used solely  
7 for funding 15.00 FTE positions within the state patrol. Any  
8 of the \$975,000 which remains unobligated or unencumbered on  
9 June 30, 1994, shall revert to the road use tax fund on August  
10 30, 1994.

11 b. It is the intent of the general assembly, that so much  
12 as is necessary of the appropriation in this subsection, shall  
13 support federal Highway Safety Act programs.

14 c. The Iowa law enforcement academy may annually select at  
15 least five automobiles of the department of public safety,  
16 division of highway safety, uniformed force, and radio  
17 communications, which are being turned in to the state vehicle  
18 dispatcher to be disposed of by public auction and the Iowa  
19 law enforcement academy may exchange any automobile owned by  
20 the academy for each automobile selected if the selected  
21 automobile is used in training law enforcement officers at the  
22 academy. However, any automobile exchanged by the academy  
23 shall be substituted for the selected vehicle of the  
24 department of public safety and sold by public auction with  
25 the receipts being deposited in the depreciation fund to the  
26 credit of the department of public safety, division of highway  
27 safety, uniformed force, and radio communications.

28 d. An employee of the department of public safety who  
29 retires after the effective date of this Act but prior to June

35 employee shall be given credit for the service in that prior

1 position as though it were covered by that agreement. This  
2 section shall not operate to reduce any retirement benefits an  
3 employee may have earned under other collective bargaining  
4 agreements or retirement programs.

17 c. If it is necessary for a county treasurer to hire  
18 additional employees, first priority in hiring shall be given  
19 to current employees of the state department of transportation  
20 who become unemployed due to the changes necessitated by this  
21 section.

22 d. Issuance of motor vehicle licenses by the county  
23 treasurers shall include commercial driver's licenses.

24 e. The county treasurers shall be required to offer  
25 extended hours of service to the public in those counties in  
26 which pilot projects are established.

27 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of chapters 321 and 321L  
28 which grant sole authority to the department for the issuance  
29 of motor vehicle licenses, nonoperator's identification cards,  
30 and handicapped identification devices, the county treasurer  
31 in each of the counties chosen for the pilot project shall be  
32 granted the same authority as is given to the department in  
33 relation to the issuance of motor vehicle licenses,  
34 nonoperator's identification cards, and handicapped  
35 identification devices under chapters 321 and 321L.

1 Sec. 13. Section 80B.11, Code 1993, is amended by adding  
2 the following new unnumbered paragraph:

3 NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. A certified course of  
4 instruction provided for under this section which occurs at a  
5 location other than at the central training facility of the  
6 Iowa law enforcement academy shall not be eliminated by the  
7 Iowa law enforcement academy.

8 Sec. 14. Section 314.21, subsection 3, paragraph b,  
9 subparagraph (1), Code 1993, is amended to read as follows:

10 (1) For the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1989, and  
11 ending June 30, ~~1993~~ 1995, fifty thousand dollars in each  
12 fiscal year to the university of northern Iowa to maintain the  
13 position of the state roadside specialist and to continue its  
14 integrated roadside vegetation management pilot program  
15 providing research, education, training, and technical  
16 assistance.

17 Sec. 15. EFFECTIVE DATES.

18 1. Sections 10 and 14 of this Act, being deemed of  
19 immediate importance, take effect upon enactment.

20 2. Section 12 of this Act takes effect January 1, 1994.

21 EXPLANATION

22 The bill appropriates funds for the 1993-1994 fiscal year  
23 to the Iowa law enforcement academy, and the departments of  
24 public defense, public safety, and transportation.

25 The bill establishes a pilot project to allow county  
26 treasurers to issue motor vehicle licenses in certain counties  
27 as determined by the state department of transportation.

28 The bill also prohibits the Iowa law enforcement academy  
29 from eliminating a law enforcement certified course taught at  
30 a location other than the Iowa law enforcement academy.

I hereby transmit Senate File 232, an act relating to and making appropriations to state agencies whose responsibilities relate to public defense, public safety, transportation and enforcement, and including allocation and use of moneys from the use tax, road use tax fund, and primary road fund, and relating to abstract fees for operating records and to registration fees for certain multipurpose vehicles and handicapped parking signs and providing effective dates.

Senate File 232 is, therefore, approved on this date with the following exceptions which I hereby disapprove.

I am unable to approve the designated portion of Section 2, subsection 1, unnumbered and unlettered paragraph 3. This provision would restrict the administrative authority of the Department of Public Defense regarding firefighter positions at the Des Moines International Airport. These positions have been reduced due to revised federal staffing standards and corresponding federal funding cuts. The Department of Public Defense must be allowed to maintain its flexibility to respond to federal directives regarding personnel.

I am unable to approve the designated portion of Section 7, subsection 1, paragraph e. This provision would unnecessarily delay an initiative by the Department of Transportation that is already well underway and has the potential of saving hundreds of thousands of dollars in road use tax funds. These funds are needed to improve the highway transportation system in the state of Iowa. Requests for proposals have already been issued and bids will be evaluated based on both the potential for cost savings and maintenance of a high quality of service.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

IOWA LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY

The department may issue a request for proposals as part of the study, but shall not award a contract for the maintenance of rest areas until the study has been reported to the general assembly. The results and recommendations from the study shall be reported to the general assembly by January 15, 1994.

Sec. 8. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the state department of transportation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1993, and ending June 30, 1994, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

Sec. 10. 1989 Iowa Acts, chapter 317, section 17, subsection 2, is amended to read as follows:

2. For the replacement of obsolete field facilities in the cities of West Union, Osage, Mount Pleasant, and Oskaloosa:

The provisions of section 8.33 do not apply to the funds appropriated by this subsection. Unencumbered or unobligated funds remaining on June 30, 1993 1995, from funds appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1989, shall revert to the fund from which appropriated on September August 30, 1993 1995.

Sec. 11. On July 1, 1993, the unencumbered and unobligated balance of moneys in the erosion control fund administered by the department of transportation which contains the accumulation of the appropriations made pursuant to section 312.2, subsections 9 and 12, Code 1989, shall be transferred to the road use tax fund created in section 312.1 for purposes of that fund.

Sec. 12. Section 8.33 shall not apply to \$700,000 of the funds appropriated to the state department of transportation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1992, and ending June 30, 1993, in 1992 Iowa Acts, chapter 1238, section 9, subsection 1, paragraph "a", for providing assistance for the restoration, conservation, improvement, and construction of railroad main lines, branch lines, switching yards, and sidings as required in section 327H.18 and for use by the railway finance authority as provided in chapter 307B, Code 1991 and Code Supplement 1991.

Sec. 13. Notwithstanding section 307.38, the Des Moines metropolitan transit authority shall be authorized to use \$55,000 of the moneys which were to be repaid to the road use tax fund in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1993, and ending June 30, 1994, pursuant to section 307.38, if the moneys are expended only for matching federal moneys granted for the purchase of new buses. If the moneys are used in accordance with this section, the loan payment amount up to \$55,000 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1993, and ending June 30,

1994, shall be repaid in the following fiscal year. However, as of June 30, 1994, if the \$55,000 has not been used to match federal moneys granted for the purchase of new buses, the moneys shall be allocated to the road use tax fund for reimbursement of the loan due under section 307.38 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1993, and ending June 30, 1994.

Sec. 14. ISSUANCE OF MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSES BY COUNTY TREASURERS -- PILOT PROJECT.

1. One pilot project shall be established to allow the county treasurers' offices in certain counties to issue motor vehicle licenses, nonoperator's identification cards, and handicapped identification devices. The state department of transportation shall determine the counties to be involved in the project on the basis of the area covered by one of the department's driver's licensing teams.

2. The state department of transportation shall work in conjunction with the county treasurers of the affected counties and with a representative of the Iowa state county treasurers' association to facilitate and implement the transfer of licensing duties and responsibilities to the counties in accordance with all of the following:

a. The department shall retain all administrative authority over licensing functions which shall include administrative procedures relating to cancellation, revocation, or suspension of licenses, including administrative hearings and appeals and training.

b. The department shall provide the county treasurer's office in each of the counties with all of the supplies, materials, and equipment necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.

c. If it is necessary for a county treasurer to hire additional employees, first priority in hiring shall be given to current employees of the state department of transportation who become unemployed due to the changes necessitated by this section.

d. Issuance of motor vehicle licenses by the county treasurers shall include commercial driver's licenses.

e. The county treasurers shall be required to offer extended hours of service to the public in those counties in which pilot projects are established.

3. Notwithstanding the provisions of chapters 321 and 321L which grant sole authority to the department for the issuance of motor vehicle licenses, nonoperator's identification cards, and handicapped identification devices, the county treasurer in each of the counties chosen for the pilot project shall be granted the same authority as is given to the department in relation to the issuance of motor vehicle licenses, nonoperator's identification cards, and handicapped identification devices under chapters 321 and 321L.

Sec. 15. Section 80B.11, Code 1993, is amended by adding the following new unnumbered paragraph:

NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. A certified course of instruction provided for under this section which occurs at a location other than at the central training facility of the Iowa law enforcement academy shall not be eliminated by the Iowa law enforcement academy.

Sec. 16. Section 314.21, subsection 3, paragraph b, subparagraph (1), Code 1993, is amended to read as follows:

(1) For the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1989, and ending June 30, ~~1993~~ 1995, fifty thousand dollars in each fiscal year to the university of northern Iowa to maintain the position of the state roadside specialist and to continue its integrated roadside vegetation management pilot program providing research, education, training, and technical assistance.

Sec. 17. Section 321.109, subsection 1, unnumbered paragraph 2, Code 1993, is amended by striking the unnumbered paragraph and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

The annual registration fee for a multipurpose vehicle with handicapped registration plates issued under section 321.34, subsection 7, with a handicapped identification sticker

affixed to the registration plates under section 321L.2, subsection 3, or whose owner or a member of the owner's household has been issued a permanent handicapped identification device under section 321L.3, subsection 1, shall be seventy-five dollars for the first through fifth model years and shall be fifty-five dollars for each model year thereafter.

Sec. 18. Section 321.124, subsection 3, paragraph h, subparagraph (6), Code 1993, is amended by striking the subparagraph and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

(6) The annual registration fee for a vehicle with handicapped registration plates issued under section 321.34, subsection 7, with a handicapped identification sticker affixed to the registration plates under section 321L.2, subsection 3, or whose owner or a member of the owner's household has been issued a permanent handicapped identification device under section 321L.3, subsection 1, shall be seventy-five dollars for the first through fifth model years and shall be fifty-five dollars for each model year thereafter.

Sec. 19. Section 321A.3, subsection 1, Code 1993, is amended to read as follows:

1. The department shall upon request furnish any person a certified abstract of the operating record of a person subject to chapter 321, 321J, or this chapter. The abstract shall also fully designate the motor vehicles, if any, registered in the name of the person. If there is no record of a conviction of the person having violated any law relating to the operation of a motor vehicle or of any injury or damage caused by the person, the department shall so certify. A fee of five dollars shall be paid for each abstract except by for state, county, or city or officials, court officials, public transit officials, or other officials of a political subdivision of the state. The department shall transfer the moneys collected under this section to the treasurer of state who shall credit to the general fund all moneys collected.

Sec. 20. Section 321L.6, subsection 3, Code 1993, is amended to read as follows:

3. The handicapped parking sign ~~may~~ shall include a sign stating that the fine for improperly using the handicapped parking space ~~provided under section 321B.47, subsection 2~~ is fifty dollars.

Sec. 21. EFFECTIVE DATES.

1. Sections 10 and 16 of this Act, being deemed of immediate importance, take effect upon enactment.

2. Section 14 of this Act takes effect January 1, 1994.
