A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations to state agencies  
2 whose responsibilities relate to public defense, public  
3 safety, transportation and law enforcement, and including  
4 allocation and use of moneys from the use tax, road use tax  
5 fund, and primary road fund, and relating to the driver's  
6 license pilot project.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 IOWA LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY

2 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of  
3 the state to the Iowa law enforcement academy for the fiscal  
4 year beginning July 1, 1994, and ending June 30, 1995, the  
5 following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be  
6 used for the purposes designated:

7 1. For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous  
8 purposes, including jailer training and technical assistance,  
9 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
10 positions:

13 2. For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous  
14 purposes to provide statewide coordination of the drug abuse  
15 resistance education (D.A.R.E.) program:

18 Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the general fund of the  
19 state to the department of public defense for the fiscal year  
20 beginning July 1, 1994, and ending June 30, 1995, the

22 used for the purposes designated:

1 a. It is the intent of the general assembly, that so much  
2 as is necessary of the appropriation in this subsection, shall  
3 be used to support federal Highway Safety Act programs.

4 b. The Iowa law enforcement academy may annually select at  
5 least five automobiles of the department of public safety,  
6 division of highway safety, uniformed force, and radio  
7 communications, prior to turning over the automobiles to the  
8 state vehicle dispatcher to be disposed of by public auction  
9 and the Iowa law enforcement academy may exchange any  
10 automobile owned by the academy for each automobile selected  
11 if the selected automobile is used in training law enforcement  
12 officers at the academy. However, any automobile exchanged by  
13 the academy shall be substituted for the selected vehicle of  
14 the department of public safety and sold by public auction  
15 with the receipts being deposited in the depreciation fund to  
16 the credit of the department of public safety, division of  
17 highway safety, uniformed force, and radio communications.

18 c. An employee of the department of public safety who

1 deputies association, the Iowa state police association, the  
2 Iowa state association of counties, and the league of Iowa

4 study to the joint appropriations subcommittee on  
5 transportation and safety by January 15, 1995.

6 Sec. 13. LEASE-PURCHASE -- BUDGET SUBMISSION. This  
7 section applies to each state agency receiving an  
8 appropriation in this Act. The departmental estimate required  
9 under section 8.23 for the fiscal period beginning July 1,  
10 1995, which includes the state agency, shall provide an  
11 itemized list indicating the nature and amount of each lease-  
12 purchase contract payment included in the estimate for  
13 proposed contracts which have not been reported by the state  
14 agency to the legislative fiscal committee of the legislative  
15 council pursuant to section 8.46 prior to the submission of  
16 the estimate. The governor shall include in the governor's  
17 budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1995, a listing  
18 indicating the nature and amount of each lease-purchase  
19 contract which was itemized in a departmental estimate in  
20 accordance with this section and is included in the governor's  
21 budget. A state agency receiving an appropriation in this Act  
22 shall not enter into a lease-purchase contract during the  
23 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1995, unless the contract was  
24 itemized in a departmental estimate and included in the  
25 governor's budget in accordance with this section.

26 Sec. 14. Section 80B.11B, Code 1993, is amended by adding  
27 the following new subsection:

28 NEW SUBSECTION. 3. The Iowa law enforcement academy may  
29 also charge an attendance fee as determined by the director of  
30 the academy and approved by the council for courses, schools,  
31 and seminars, other than the basic training course specified  
32 in subsection 2. Funds generated from attendance fees are  
33 appropriated to and shall be used at the direction of the  
34 academy to fulfill its responsibilities under this chapter.

EXPLANATION

1 The bill makes appropriations for the 1994-1995 fiscal year  
2 to the Iowa law enforcement academy, the department of public  
3 defense, the department of public safety, and the state  
4 department of transportation.

5 The bill includes specific appropriations to the six  
6 counties involved in the driver's license pilot project. In  
7 addition, the bill provides for the extension of the driver's  
8 license pilot project to June 30, 1995.

9 The Iowa law enforcement academy is required to study the  
10 feasibility of allowing persons to enroll in the academy basic  
11 training course prior to employment by a law enforcement  
12 agency.

13 The bill authorizes the Iowa law enforcement academy to  
14 charge attendance fees for courses, schools, and seminars.  
15 These fees are to be used by the academy for its required  
16 needs.

x I hereby transmit Senate File 2217, an act relating to and making appropriations to state agencies whose responsibilities relate to public defense, public safety, transportation and law enforcement, and including allocation and use of moneys from the use tax, road use tax fund, and primary road fund, and relating to the driver's license pilot project.

Senate File 2217 is, therefore, approved on this date with the following exceptions which I hereby disapprove.

I am unable to approve the item designated as Section 4, subsection 1, paragraph d, in its entirety. This provision limits the authority of the Department of Public Safety to make decisions regarding lodging of peace officers in training. The department should retain full authority to make such decisions, particularly when it results in substantial cost savings to Iowa taxpayers.

I am unable to approve the item designated as Section 13, in its entirety. This provision restricts executive branch agencies in their ability to enter into lease-purchase agreements. While additional review and oversight of lease-purchase contracting by state agencies may be worthwhile, sufficient flexibility must be provided to allow agencies to respond to situations which cannot be planned, e.g. emergencies and new federal requirements.

For the above reasons, I hereby respectfully disapprove these items in accordance with Amendment IV of the Amendments of 1968 to the Constitution of the State of Iowa. All other items in Senate File 2217 are hereby approved as of this date.

Sec. 10. Notwithstanding section 8.33 and the reversion provisions in 1991 Iowa Acts, chapter 268, section 507, the unencumbered or unobligated funds remaining on June 30, 1994, from the appropriation for grading and resurfacing the east parking lot at the Ames complex shall not revert but shall be available for expenditure for the same purposes until June 30, 1998, and any unencumbered or unobligated funds remaining on June 30, 1998, shall revert to the fund from which appropriated on August 30, 1998.

Sec. 11. DRIVER'S LICENSE PILOT PROJECT. The driver's license pilot project implemented in accordance with 1993 Iowa Acts, chapter 169, section 14, is extended until June 30, 1995.

Sec. 12. LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY STUDY. The director of the Iowa law enforcement academy shall study the feasibility of allowing persons to enroll in the academy basic training course prior to employment by a law enforcement agency. The director shall seek input from the Iowa state sheriffs and deputies association, the Iowa state police association, community colleges and higher education institutions offering police science courses, the Iowa state association of counties, and the league of Iowa municipalities. The director shall report the results of the study to the joint appropriations subcommittee on transportation and safety by January 15, 1995.

Sec. 13. LEASE-PURCHASE -- BUDGET SUBMISSION. This section applies to each state agency receiving an appropriation in this Act. The departmental estimate required under section 8.23 for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1995, which includes the state agency, shall provide an itemized list indicating the nature and amount of each lease-

purchase contract payment included in the estimate for proposed contracts which have not been reported by the state agency to the legislative fiscal committee of the legislative council pursuant to section 8.46 prior to the submission of the estimate. The governor shall include in the governor's budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1995, a listing indicating the nature and amount of each lease-purchase contract which was itemized in a departmental estimate in accordance with this section and is included in the governor's budget. A state agency receiving an appropriation in this Act shall not enter into a lease-purchase contract during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1995, unless the contract was itemized in a departmental estimate and included in the governor's budget in accordance with this section.

Sec. 14. The legislative council is requested to authorize an interim study committee to study the issue of transferring the motor vehicle enforcement officers from the state department of transportation to the department of public safety, as well as the issue of whether or not those motor vehicle enforcement officers should have all the powers and duties of other peace officers defined in section 801.4.

Sec. 15. SALE OF REAL PROPERTY -- PREFERENCES. The state department of transportation shall include veterans organizations chartered by the congress of the United States in any preference granted to a state agency, city, county, school district, or other public authority, for the sale of real property by the state department of transportation prior to July 1, 1995.

Sec. 16. Section 35C.1, subsection 2, Code 1993, is amended by adding the following new unnumbered paragraph:

NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. The department of personnel shall inform the agency to which the person is seeking employment of the person's military service as specified in subsection 1.

Sec. 17. Section 80B.11B, Code 1993, is amended by adding the following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 3. The Iowa law enforcement academy may also charge an attendance fee as determined by the director of the academy and approved by the council for courses, schools, and seminars, other than the basic training course specified in subsection 2. Funds generated from attendance fees are appropriated to and shall be used at the direction of the academy to fulfill its responsibilities under this chapter.
