A BILL FOR

1 An Act providing for a pregnant and parenting minors program, and
2 providing an appropriation.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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S.F. 388

1 Section 1. PREGNANT AND PARENTING MINORS -- PROGRAMS.

2 1. The department of human services in cooperation with
3 the child development coordinating council, the department of
4 education, and the Iowa department of public health shall
5 adopt rules to develop and implement a pregnant and parenting
6 minors program. The rules shall establish criteria for the
7 awarding of grants and the components required of a grant
8 applicant for the pregnant and parenting minors program.

9 2. The components required of a grant applicant include,
10 but are not limited to, all of the following:

11 a. A comprehensive and multidisciplinary approach to
12 helping pregnant and parenting minors which incorporates
13 community agencies and resources.

14 b. Provision of services including, but not limited to,
15 health and mental health services, home visits, support
16 services, prenatal care, child care, parenting skills
17 development, education, advocacy, counseling, employment and
18 training referrals, housing, and case management services.

19 c. A plan for implementation which coordinates the work of
20 the recipients of Iowa healthy family program grants,
21 recipients of adolescent pregnancy prevention grants, and
22 family resource centers to the maximum extent possible.

23 d. A provision for funding of the program which provides a
24 match of one dollar by the grant recipient for every dollar
25 allocated to the program by the state.

26 3. The department shall award grants to no more than ten
27 applicants who represent service areas in the state with the
28 highest percentage of pregnancies to minors.

29 4. There is appropriated from the general fund of the
30 state to the department of human services for the fiscal year
31 beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1998, the
32 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
33 used for the purpose designated:

34 For the funding of grants for pregnant and parenting minors
35 programs as described in this Act:

2 EXPLANATION

3 This bill requires the department of human services, in
4 cooperation with the child development coordinating council,
5 the department of education, and the Iowa department of public
6 health, to adopt rules to develop and implement, through a
7 grant process, a pregnant and parenting minors program in not
8 more than 10 areas of the state which have the highest
9 percentage of pregnancies to minors. The bill provides that
10 the rules adopted are to include the criteria to be met by a
11 grant recipient including the services to be provided, the
12 requirement of a match of one dollar by the grant recipient
13 for every dollar allocated by the state, and the requirement
14 that the grant recipient implement the program through
15 coordination with family resource centers and grant recipients
16 of the Iowa healthy family program and adolescent pregnancy
17 prevention program.

18 The bill provides an appropriation of \$750,000 to the
19 department of human services for grants to not more than 10
20 programs for pregnant and parenting minors.

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**HOUSE FILE 388
FISCAL NOTE**

A fiscal note for House File 388 as amended by S-3193 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 388 provides for a 15.0% reduction in each marginal income tax rate. Currently, there are nine income tax brackets ranging from 0.40% to 9.98%. House File 388 would lower the range to 0.34% to 8.48%. The top rate, under current law and HF 388, is applied to income in excess of \$49,005.

The Bill is effective for tax years beginning on or after January 1, 1998. This fiscal note does not take into account any impact that may result from taxpayers shifting income into a future fiscal year or shifting deductions into a past fiscal year.

Amendment S-3193 reduces the 15.0% across the board reduction to a 10.0% across the board reduction. The new rate structure would range from 0.36% to 8.98%. Like the Bill, the Amendment would be effective for tax years beginning January 1, 1998.

FISCAL IMPACT

House File 388 is expected to result in a decrease in revenues to the General Fund of approximately \$156.0 million in FY 1998 and \$302.0 million in FY 1999.

House File 388 as amended by S-3193 is expected to result in a decrease in revenues to the General Fund of approximately \$103.0 million in FY 1998 and \$202.0 million in FY 1999.
