A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to disposal, collection, and recycling of waste
2 oil filters.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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S.F. 471

1 Section 1. Section 455D.13, Code 1997, is amended to read
2 as follows:

3 455D.13 LAND DISPOSAL OF WASTE OIL AND OIL FILTERS
4 PROHIBITED -- COLLECTION.

5 1. A sanitary landfill shall not accept waste oil or oil
6 filters for final disposal ~~beginning July 1, 1990.~~

7 2. A person offering for sale or selling oil or oil
8 filters at retail in the state shall do the following:

9 a. Accept at the point of sale, waste oil or oil filters
10 from customers, or post notice of locations where a customer
11 may dispose of waste oil or oil filters.

12 b. Post written notice that it is unlawful to dispose of
13 waste oil and oil filters in a sanitary landfill.

14 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 455D.13A WASTE OIL FILTER
15 RECYCLING.

16 1. A person collecting waste oil filters shall post
17 written notice identifying all waste oil filter recyclers
18 servicing that collection site. Upon collection by a recycler
19 of waste oil filters from a collection site, the recycler
20 shall provide the collection site with a receipt which shall
21 include a statement identifying all end users of the recycled
22 oil filters.

23 2. All waste oil filter recyclers collecting waste oil
24 filters from a collection site in the state shall report
25 annually to the department identifying all end users of the
26 recycled oil filters.

27 EXPLANATION

28 This bill amends Code section 455D.13 to prohibit the
29 disposal of waste oil filters in a sanitary landfill.

30 The bill provides that collection sites must post a written
31 notice identifying all waste oil filter recyclers servicing
32 the collection site. The bill provides that a waste oil
33 filter recycler must provide the collection site with a
34 receipt identifying all end users of the recycled oil filters.
35 The bill provides that all waste oil filter recyclers

1 collecting waste oil filters in the state shall report
2 annually to the department identifying all end users of the
3 recycled oil filters.

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A fiscal note for Senate File 471, as amended by S-3331, is hereby submitted pursuant to Joine Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 471, as amended by S-3331, prohibits the disposal of waste oil filters in a sanitary landfill. The Bill specifies that operators are eligible for a reduction in their Underground Storage Tank insurance premium when a collection and recycling program is implemented.

BACKGROUND

To encourage the recycling of waste oil filters, collection sites must post written notice identifying oil filter recycling sites. The recycling sites will provide the collection site with a receipt identifying all end users of recycled oil filters. The recycling sites will provide a list of all end users to the Department of Natural Resources. The recycling site must meet the following conditions to receive a discount on their insurance premium:

1. The recycling site maintains a collection device for the purpose of storing waste oil filters.
2. The recycling site accepts waste oil filters from the general public.
3. The recycling site advertises that waste oil filters are accepted from the general public and the advertisement is approved by the Department of Natural Resources.
4. The recycling center registers an end user other than a sanitary landfill of the waste oil filters.

ASSUMPTIONS

The average annual premium for an underground storage tank site is \$1,165. The number of insured sites is 2,150. An eight percent reduction in the annual premium equals \$93. If 25% of the sites participated, or 538 sites, this would decrease overall premiums by \$50,000.

FISCAL IMPACT

The estimated fiscal impact of Senate File 471 would be an annual decrease of \$50,000 in the Underground Storage Tank insurance premium if 25% of the operators participated. There would be a \$100,000 decrease in premiums if 50% of the operators participated, \$150,000 if 75% participated, and \$200,000 if there was 100% participation.
