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1 Section 1. Section 139.9, subsection 2, Code 1997, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 2. a. A person shall not be enrolled in any licensed
4 child care center, elementary or secondary school in Iowa

6 pertussis, tetanus, poliomyelitis, rubeola, and rubella.

7 b. Evidence of adequate immunization against haemophilus

16 Sec. 2. HEPATITIS TYPE B -- PLAN. The Iowa department of
17 public health shall develop a plan for protecting Iowans
18 against hepatitis type B and requiring that minor children be
19 adequately immunized against hepatitis type B. The plan shall
20 incorporate the health and religious exemptions in section
21 139.9, subsections 3 and 4. The plan shall be submitted to
22 the governor and general assembly by October 1, 1998.

23 Sec. 3. RULES -- APPLICABILITY. Section 1 of this Act,
24 requiring evidence of hepatitis type B immunization, shall
25 first be applicable to enrollments for the 1999-2000 school
26 year. The Iowa department of public health shall adopt rules
27 on or before October 1, 1998, to implement the provisions of
28 section 1 of this Act.

29 Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of
30 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

31 EXPLANATION

32 This bill relates to hepatitis type B immunizations of
33 children and requires the Iowa department of public health to
34 develop a plan for protecting persons against hepatitis type B
35 and requiring hepatitis type B immunizations of children. The

1 plan is to be submitted to the governor and general assembly
2 by October 1, 1998.

3 The bill requires evidence of hepatitis type B immunization
4 for children enrolling in school in kindergarten or in any
5 grade level. The requirement is first applicable to children
6 enrolling for the 1999-2000 school year. Existing provisions
7 for health and religious exemptions are applicable.

8 This bill may include a state mandate as defined in Code
9 section 25B.3. This bill makes inapplicable Code section
10 25B.2, subsection 3, which would relieve a political
11 subdivision from complying with a state mandate if funding for
12 the cost of the state mandate is not provided or specified.
13 Therefore, political subdivisions are required to comply with
14 any state mandate included in this bill.

15 The bill takes effect upon enactment.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 139.9, subsection 2, Code 1997, is amended to read as follows:

2. a. A person shall not be enrolled in any licensed child care center, elementary or secondary school in Iowa without evidence of adequate immunization against diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, poliomyelitis, rubeola, and rubella.

b. Evidence of adequate immunization against haemophilus influenza b shall be required prior to enrollment in any licensed child care center.

c. Evidence of hepatitis type B immunization shall be required of a child born on or after July 1, 1994, prior to enrollment in school in kindergarten or in any grade.

d. Immunizations shall be provided according to recommendations provided by the Iowa department of public health subject to the provisions of subsections 3 and 4.

Sec. 2. HEPATITIS TYPE B -- PLAN. The Iowa department of public health shall develop a plan for protecting Iowans against hepatitis type B and requiring that minor children be adequately immunized against hepatitis type B. The plan shall incorporate the health and religious exemptions in section 139.9, subsections 3 and 4. The plan shall be submitted to the governor and general assembly by October 1, 1998.

Sec. 3. RULES -- APPLICABILITY. Section 1 of this Act, requiring evidence of hepatitis type B immunization, shall first be applicable to enrollments for the 1999-2000 school year. The Iowa department of public health shall adopt rules

on or before October 1, 1998, to implement the provisions of section 1 of this Act.

Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.
