A BILL FOR

1 An Act making appropriations from and to the rebuild Iowa
2 infrastructure fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
3 1998, to the department of agriculture and land stewardship
4 for deposit in the Loess Hills development and conservation
5 fund; department of corrections for renovation of the power
6 plant and improvements to the water system at the Iowa
7 correctional institution for women, for the construction of an
8 additional cellblock at the Fort Dodge correctional facility,
9 and for the construction of a 200-bed facility at the Iowa
10 state penitentiary at Fort Madison; department of cultural
11 affairs for the creation of a historical site preservation
12 grant program; department of economic development for a
13 welcome center at Hamburg, to be deposited in the physical
14 infrastructure assistance fund, and for deposit in the rural
15 enterprise fund to be used for a dry fire hydrant and rural
16 water supply education and demonstration project; department
17 of education for infrastructure improvements to the community
18 colleges; department of general services for major renovation
19 needs for state-owned buildings and facilities, for critical
20 and deferred maintenance at Terrace Hill, for relocation of
21 offices and other transitions costs associated with the
22 renovation of the Lucas state office building and the old

1 historical building, for renovation of the Lucas state office
2 building, for developing a master plan for the capitol
3 complex, for planning and design of a parking structure
4 located at the northwest corner of the capitol complex, and
5 for capitol interior restoration; department of public defense
6 for maintenance and repair of national guard armories and
7 facilities; department of public safety for construction of a
8 new patrol post in district 1; department of natural resources
9 for the purpose of funding capital projects from marine fuel
10 tax receipts for expenditures for local cost-share grants to
11 be used not necessarily for capital expenditures to local
12 governmental units for boating accessibility, for the
13 construction of the Elinor Bedell state park and wildlife
14 conservation area, for a recreational grant matching program,
15 for the blufflands protection revolving fund, and for the
16 dredging of lakes; department of transportation for capital
17 improvements at all 10 of the commercial air service airports;
18 for the Iowa state fair foundation for renovation,
19 restoration, and improvement of the cattle barn and horse barn
20 at the state fairgrounds and for county fair infrastructure
21 improvements; judicial department for capital projects at the
22 capitol building and for design and development of a new
23 judicial building; and state board of regents for capital
24 projects at the Iowa school for the deaf and the Iowa braille
25 and sight saving school; making appropriations of the marine
26 fuel tax receipts from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund;
27 providing a reversion date to funds appropriated to the
28 department of revenue and finance in the fiscal year beginning
29 July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1998; making statutory
30 changes relating to appropriations by establishing the
31 blufflands protection program and revolving fund, by reducing
32 the overall appropriation for the restore outdoors program for
33 the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30,
34 2001, as a result of the governor's item veto, by providing
35 for coordination of vertical infrastructure databases, by

36 eliminating a matching contribution requirement on certain
37 funds appropriated to the department of cultural affairs for
38 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1997, by extending the
39 allowable time to enter into contracts to provide alternative
40 drainage outlets, by allocating part of the funds derived from
41 the excise tax on the sale of motor fuel used in watercraft
42 from the general fund to the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund;
43 and providing effective dates.

44 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

CAPITAL PROJECTS
DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
AND LAND STEWARDSHIP

Section 1. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund, notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c", to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30, 1999, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

For deposit in the Loess Hills development and conservation fund created in section 161D.2 and shall be used for the purposes specified in section 161D.1:

..... \$ 1,000,000

Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated funds remaining on June 30, 2000, from the funds appropriated in this section shall revert to the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund on August 31, 2000.

DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS

Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the department of corrections for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30, 1999, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

1. For renovation of the power plant and improvements to the water system at the Iowa correctional institution for women:

..... \$ 1,400,000

2. For the construction of an additional cellblock at the Fort Dodge correctional facility:

..... \$ 5,000,000

3. For construction of a 200-bed facility at the Iowa state penitentiary at Fort Madison:

..... \$ 6,500,000

Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated funds remaining on June 30, 2001, from the funds appropriated

1 in this section shall revert to the rebuild Iowa
2 infrastructure fund on August 31, 2001.

3 DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS

4 Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
5 infrastructure fund to the department of cultural affairs for
6 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30,
7 1999, the following amount, or so much thereof as is
8 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

9 For the creation of a historical site preservation grant
10 program, to be used as provided in this section for the
11 restoration, preservation, and development of historical
12 sites:

13 \$ 2,425,000

14 1. Of the amount appropriated in this section, not more
15 than \$600,000 may be used to fund a state contribution toward
16 the restoration and renovation of the Salisbury house in Des
17 Moines.

18 2. Of the amount appropriated in this section, not more
19 than \$100,000 may be used to fund the planning phase for the
20 design and construction of an Iowa hall of pride.

21 3. Of the amount appropriated in this section, not more
22 than \$16,000 may be used to fund a state contribution toward
23 the restoration of Iowa monuments located at Shiloh national
24 military park in Tennessee.

25 The department shall adopt administrative rules pursuant to
26 chapter 17A to administer the disbursement of funds.

27 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated
28 funds remaining on June 30, 2001, from the funds appropriated
29 in this section shall revert to the rebuild Iowa
30 infrastructure fund on August 31, 2001.

31 DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

32 Sec. 4. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
33 infrastructure fund to the department of economic development
34 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June
35 30, 1999, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is

1 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

2 1. For a welcome center at Hamburg:

3 \$ 250,000

4 2. To be deposited in the physical infrastructure
5 assistance fund created in section 15E.175, notwithstanding
6 section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":

7 \$ 5,000,000

8 The department shall maximize the funds appropriated in
9 this subsection for vertical infrastructure projects and the
10 department shall report to the general assembly on the amount
11 of funds provided for vertical infrastructure and shall report
12 any indirect vertical infrastructure projects that resulted
13 from this appropriation.

14 3. For deposit in the rural enterprise fund to be used for
15 the project specified in this subsection, notwithstanding
16 section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":

17 \$ 100,000

18 The moneys appropriated in this subsection shall be used by
19 the department of economic development for a dry fire hydrant
20 and rural water supply education and demonstration project.

21 The project shall provide both collaborative and technical
22 education to fire departments and provide grants for
23 demonstration installations on a shared basis. The project
24 shall utilize, to the extent possible, resources from the fire
25 service institute at Iowa state university of science and
26 technology, United States department of agriculture rural
27 development, Iowa department of economic development, and
28 rural conservation development areas. The department of
29 economic development shall create a panel to review
30 applications for project grants. The department shall invite
31 each of the following to designate a member for the panel:

- 32 the Iowa firemen's association and other members of the Iowa
- 33 joint council of fire service organizations, the fire service
- 34 institute at Iowa state university of science and technology,
- 35 the Iowa league of cities, state fire marshal, and the

1 department of economic development. The panel shall review
2 each application and make a recommendation to the department
3 for selection of applications.

4 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated
5 funds remaining on June 30, 2001, from the funds appropriated
6 in this section shall revert to the rebuild Iowa
7 infrastructure fund on August 31, 2001.

8 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

9 Sec. 5. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
10 infrastructure fund, to the department of education for the
11 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30, 1999,
12 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to
13 be used for the purpose designated:

14 For vertical infrastructure improvements to the community
15 colleges to be distributed to each community college in the
16 proportion that the allocation to that community college in
17 1997 Iowa Acts, chapter 212, section 7, subsection 17, bears
18 to the total appropriation made in 1997 Iowa Acts, chapter
19 212, section 7, subsection 17:

20 \$ 2,000,000

21 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated
22 funds remaining on June 30, 2000, from the funds appropriated
23 in this section shall revert to the rebuild Iowa
24 infrastructure fund on August 31, 2000.

25 DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES

26 Sec. 6. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
27 infrastructure fund to the department of general services for
28 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30,
29 1999, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is
30 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

31 1. For major renovation needs including health, life, and
32 fire safety, for compliance with the federal Americans With
33 Disabilities Act for state-owned buildings and facilities:

34 \$ 7,000,000

35 Notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c",

1 of the amount appropriated in this subsection, up to \$600,000
2 may be used by the department for maintenance needs for the
3 capitol complex.

4 2. For critical and deferred maintenance at Terrace Hill:
5 \$ 700,000

6 3. For relocation of offices and other transition costs
7 associated with renovation of the Lucas state office building
8 and the old historical building:
9\$ 1,300,000

10 4. For renovation of the Lucas state office building:
11 \$ 4,500,000

12 5. For developing a master plan for the capitol complex,
13 including planning for the capitol terrace project and design
14 costs for underground parking on the capitol complex:
15 \$ 390,000

16 It is the intent of the general assembly that the
17 department coordinate with the city of Des Moines on
18 construction projects located at the capitol complex and
19 surrounding areas.

20 6. Planning and design of a parking structure located at
21 the northwest corner of the capitol complex:
22 \$ 820,000

23 7. For capitol interior restoration:
24 \$ 1,027,600

25 Notwithstanding section 3.33, unencumbered or unobligated
26 funds remaining on June 30, 2002, from the funds appropriated
27 in this section, shall revert to the rebuild Iowa
28 infrastructure fund on August 31, 2002.

29 IOWA STATE FAIR FOUNDATION

30 Sec. 7. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
31 infrastructure fund of the state to the Iowa state fair
32 foundation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and
33 ending June 30, 1999, the following amounts, or so much
34 thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
35 designated:

1 1. For renovation, restoration, and improvement of the
2 cattle barn and horse barn at the state fairgrounds:
3 \$ 4,360,000

4 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated
5 funds remaining on June 30, 2001, from the funds appropriated
6 in this subsection shall revert to the rebuild Iowa
7 infrastructure fund on August 31, 2001.

8 2. For county fair infrastructure improvements for
9 distribution in accordance with chapter 174 to qualified fairs
10 which belong to the association of Iowa fairs:

11 \$ 1,040,000

12 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated
13 funds remaining on June 30, 1999, from the funds appropriated
14 in this subsection shall revert to the rebuild Iowa
15 infrastructure fund on August 31, 1999.

16 JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT

17 Sec. 8. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
18 infrastructure fund to the judicial department for the fiscal
19 year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30, 1999, the
20 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
21 used for the purpose designated:

22 For capital projects at the capitol building:
23 \$ 250,000

24 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated
25 funds remaining on June 30, 2000, from the funds appropriated
26 in this section shall revert to the rebuild Iowa
27 infrastructure fund on August 31, 2000.

28 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

29 Sec. 9. There is appropriated from the marine fuel tax
30 receipts deposited in the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to
31 the department of natural resources for the fiscal year
32 beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30, 1999, the
33 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
34 used for the purposes designated:

35 For the purpose of funding capital projects from marine

1 fuel tax receipts for the purposes specified in section
2 452A.79, and notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5,
3 paragraph "c", for expenditures for local cost share grants to
4 be used for capital expenditures to local governmental units
5 for boating accessibility:

6 \$ 2,288,689

7 Of the amount appropriated in this section, up to \$200,000
8 may be used for expenditure purposes for local cost share
9 grants to local governmental units for boating accessibility.

10 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated
11 funds remaining on June 30, 2000, and shall revert to the
12 rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund on August 31, 2000.

13 Sec. 10. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
14 infrastructure fund to the department of natural resources for
15 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30,
16 1999, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is
17 necessary, to be used for the purposes indicated:

18 1. For the construction of the Elinor Bedell state park
19 and wildlife conservation area:

20 \$ 430,000

21 It is the intent of the general assembly to fund the
22 remaining costs to construct the Elinor Bedell state park in
23 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30,
24 2000, in the amount of \$278,000 and in the fiscal year
25 beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, in the
26 amount of \$50,000.

27 2. For a recreational grant matching program:

28 \$ 2,500,000

29 The department shall adopt administrative rules pursuant to
30 chapter 17A to administer the disbursement of funds. Matching
31 grants are to be awarded only to communities, organizations,
32 and associations for the restoration or construction of
33 recreational complexes or facilities. Each applicant shall be
34 awarded a matching grant of one dollar for every two dollars
35 the applicant has raised. Each grant shall not exceed

1 \$100,000 per project.

2 3. For the blufflands protection revolving fund created in
3 section 161A.80, notwithstanding section 8.57, section 5,
4 paragraph "c":

5 \$ 500,000

6 4. For the dredging of lakes in accordance with the
7 department's classification of Iowa lakes restoration report,
8 notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":

9 \$ 2,000,000

10 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated
11 funds remaining on June 30, 2001, from the funds appropriated
12 in this section shall revert to the rebuild Iowa
13 infrastructure fund on August 31, 2001.

14 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC DEFENSE

15 Sec. 11. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
16 infrastructure fund to the department of public defense for
17 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30,
18 1999, the following amount, or so much thereof as is
19 necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

20 For maintenance and repair of national guard armories and
21 facilities:

22 \$ 680,000

23 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated
24 funds remaining on June 30, 2000, from the funds appropriated
25 in this section shall revert to the rebuild Iowa
26 infrastructure fund on August 31, 2000.

27 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

28 Sec. 12. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
29 infrastructure fund to the department of public safety for the
30 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30, 1999,
31 the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to
32 be used for the purposes designated:

33 For construction of a new patrol post in District 1:

34 \$ 1,700,000

35 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated

1 funds remaining on June 30, 2001, from the funds appropriated
2 in this section shall revert to the rebuild Iowa
3 infrastructure fund on August 31, 2001.

4 STATE BOARD OF REGENTS

5 Sec. 13. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
6 infrastructure fund of the state to the state board of regents
7 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June
8 30, 1999, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is
9 necessary, to be used for the projects designated:

10 For capital projects at the Iowa school for the deaf and
11 the Iowa braille and sight saving school as approved by the
12 state board of regents:

13 \$ 335,000

14 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated
15 funds remaining on June 30, 2001, from the funds appropriated
16 in this section shall revert to the rebuild Iowa
17 infrastructure fund on August 31, 2001.

18 STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

19 Sec. 14. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
20 infrastructure fund to the state department of transportation
21 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June
22 30, 1999, the following amount, or so much thereof as is
23 necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

24 For improvements at all 10 of the commercial air service
25 airports within the state:

26 \$ 1,000,000

27 One-half of the funds appropriated in this section shall be
28 allocated equally between each commercial service airport and
29 one-half of the funds shall be allocated based on the
30 percentage enplaned passengers at each commercial service
31 airport bears to the total enplaned passengers in the state
32 during the previous fiscal year. In order for a commercial
33 service airport to receive funding under this section, the
34 airport shall be required to submit applications for funding
35 of specific projects to the department for approval by the

1 transportation commission. The department shall adopt rules
2 pursuant to chapter 17A to establish application eligibility
3 criteria.

4 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated
5 funds remaining on June 30, 2001, from the funds appropriated
6 in this section shall revert to the rebuild Iowa
7 infrastructure fund on August 31, 2001.

8 Sec. 15. NEW SECTION. 18.24 COORDINATION OF VERTICAL
9 INFRASTRUCTURE DATABASES.

10 1. The director shall establish by administrative rule,
11 and as part of a survey conducted regarding the condition of
12 state-owned property, a uniform system for evaluating and
13 rating vertical infrastructure needs in the state so that the
14 vertical infrastructure needs of each state entity and
15 proposed vertical infrastructure projects, including the state
16 board of regents, can be compared. The director shall consult
17 with state entities which already have databases regarding
18 their vertical infrastructure needs and shall seek input from
19 individuals or organizations with expertise in public vertical
20 infrastructure assessment in drafting proposed rules.

21 2. As used in this section, "vertical infrastructure" has
22 the same meaning as in section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph
23 "c".

24 Sec. 16. NEW SECTION. 161A.80 BLUFFLANDS PROTECTION
25 PROGRAM -- REVOLVING FUND.

26 1. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise
27 requires:

28 a. For purposes of this section only, "bluffland" means a
29 cliff, headland, or hill with a broad, steep face along the
30 channel or floodplain of the Missouri or Mississippi river and
31 their tributaries.

32 b. "Conservation organization" means a nonprofit
33 corporation incorporated in Iowa or an entity organized and
34 operated primarily to enhance and protect natural resources in
35 this state.

1 2. A blufflands protection revolving fund is created in
2 the state treasury. All proceeds shall be divided into two
3 equal accounts. One account shall be used for the purchase of
4 blufflands along the Mississippi river and its tributaries and
5 the other account shall be used for the purchase of blufflands
6 along the Missouri river and its tributaries. The proceeds of
7 the revolving fund are appropriated to make loans to
8 conservation organizations which agree to purchase bluffland
9 properties adjacent to state parks. The administrative
10 director of the division of soil conservation shall administer
11 the revolving fund. Notwithstanding section 12C.7, interest
12 or earnings on investments made pursuant to this section or as
13 provided in section 12B.10 shall be credited to the blufflands
14 protection revolving fund. Notwithstanding section 8.33,
15 unobligated or unencumbered funds credited to the blufflands
16 protection revolving fund shall not revert at the close of a
17 fiscal year. However, the maximum balance in the blufflands
18 protection fund shall not exceed two million five hundred
19 thousand dollars. Any funds in excess of two million five
20 hundred thousand dollars shall be credited to the rebuild Iowa
21 infrastructure fund.

22 3. The commissioners of each soil and water conservation
23 district which includes blufflands shall cooperate with and
24 assist the director in administering the blufflands protection
25 program within their respective districts. The director shall
26 provide, by rule, for a uniform application form, the content
27 of the form, provisions for a loan agreement and minimum
28 qualifications of conservation organizations which are
29 eligible to participate in the blufflands protection program.
30 The administrative director shall specify the eligible purpose
31 for which a loan authorized under this section can be
32 expended. The payment of administrative costs is not an
33 eligible purpose.

34 4. An applicant for a loan from the blufflands protection
35 revolving fund shall apply to the soil and water conservation

1 district of the county in which the bluffland is located. The
2 application shall be on forms prepared by the division and
3 shall include the information required by rule of the
4 division. Each conservation organization which applies for a
5 loan under this section shall demonstrate its financial
6 capability to qualify for a loan to the commissioners and its
7 commitment to natural resource protection and appropriate
8 development. The application shall be reviewed and
9 feasibility of the proposed project shall be investigated by
10 the commissioners of the district and its report and
11 recommendation shall be sent to the administrative director
12 and the committee for approval.

13 5. Each loan made under this section shall be for a period
14 not to exceed five years, shall bear no interest for the first
15 year, and shall be repayable to the blufflands protection
16 revolving fund. After the first year and for each subsequent
17 year that the principal remains unpaid, interest shall be
18 charged against any unpaid balance of the loan. The interest
19 rate shall be set at the prevailing market rate for similar
20 real estate in the county as determined by the director. All
21 interest payments shall be credited to the blufflands
22 protection revolving fund. Each loan shall be repaid as
23 provided in the loan agreement. However, interest on the
24 principal of a loan shall be due and payable thirty days after
25 the conclusion of the second year and each subsequent year
26 that the principal or a part of the principal remains unpaid.

27 6. The administrative director may:

28 a. Contract, sue and be sued, and adopt administrative
29 rules pursuant to chapter 17A and approved by the committee,
30 necessary to carry out this section, but the administrative
31 director, the committee, or the district commissioners shall
32 not directly or indirectly pledge the credit of the state of
33 Iowa.

34 b. Authorize payment from the blufflands protection
35 revolving fund from any income received by investments of any

1 money in the fund for costs, commissions, attorney fees, and
2 other reasonable expenses related to and necessary for the
3 making and protecting of direct loans under this section, and
4 for recovery of moneys loaned or the management of property
5 acquired in connection with the loans.

6 7. a. This section is repealed on July 1, 2005.

7 b. The principal and interest from any blufflands
8 protection loans outstanding on July 1, 2005, and payable to
9 the blufflands protection revolving fund, shall be paid to the
10 administrative director of the division of soil conservation
11 on or after July 1, 2005, pursuant to the terms of the loan
12 agreement and shall be credited to the rebuild Iowa
13 infrastructure fund.

14 Sec. 17. Section 452A.79, unnumbered paragraph 2, Code
15 1997, is amended to read as follows:

16 ~~All-moneys~~ Annually, the first four hundred eleven thousand
17 three hundred eleven dollars derived from the excise tax on
18 the sale of motor fuel used in watercraft shall be deposited
19 in the general fund of the state. The moneys in excess of
20 four hundred eleven thousand three hundred eleven dollars
21 shall be deposited in the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund.

22 Moneys deposited to the general fund and to the rebuild Iowa
23 infrastructure fund under this section and section 452A.84 are
24 subject to the requirements of section 8.60 and are subject to
25 appropriation by the general assembly to the department of
26 natural resources for use in its recreational boating program,

6 EXPLANATION

7 This bill makes appropriations from and to the rebuild Iowa
8 infrastructure fund.

9 The bill makes appropriations for the fiscal year beginning
10 July 1, 1998, and ending June 30, 1999, for various capital
11 and other projects. These appropriations include capital
12 projects for the departments of agriculture, cultural affairs,
13 corrections, economic development, education, general
14 services, natural resources, public defense, public safety,
15 and transportation, and for the state fair foundation,
16 judicial department, and state board of regents.

17 The bill reduces the overall appropriation for the restore

19 will match \$1 for every \$2 raised by the applicant up to
20 \$100,000.

21 The bill allocates part of the funds derived from the
22 excise tax on the sale of motor fuel used in watercraft from
23 the state general fund to the rebuild Iowa infrastructure
24 fund.

25 The bill provides for coordination of vertical
26 infrastructure databases.

27 The bill eliminates a matching grant requirement on certain
28 funds appropriated to the department of cultural affairs for
29 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1997.

30 The bill extends the allowable time to enter into contracts
31 to provide for alternative drainage outlets.

I hereby transmit Senate File 2381, an act making appropriations from and to the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, to the Division of Soil Conservation for deposit in the Loess Hills development and conservation fund; Department of Corrections for renovation of the power plant and improvements to the water system at the Iowa Correctional Institution for Women, for the construction of two additional cellblocks at the Fort Dodge Correctional Facility, for a prior fiscal year, and for the construction of a 200-bed facility at the Iowa State Penitentiary at Fort Madison, and for the construction and renovation of community-based correctional facilities; Department of Cultural Affairs for the creation of a historical site preservation grant program; Department of Economic Development for a welcome center at Hamburg, to be deposited in the physical infrastructure assistance fund, and for deposit in the rural enterprise fund to be used for a dry fire hydrant and rural water supply education and demonstration project; Department of Education for infrastructure improvements to the community colleges, for completion of the training facility and site development phase of the National Education Center for Agricultural Safety; Department of General Services for major renovation needs for state-owned buildings and facilities, for critical and deferred maintenance at Terrace Hill, for relocation of offices and other transitions costs associated with the renovation of the Lucas State Office Building and the Old Historical Building, for renovation of the Lucas State Office Building, for developing a master plan for the Capitol Complex, for planning and design of a parking structure located at the northwest corner of the Capitol Complex, and for Capitol interior restoration; Department of Public Defense for maintenance and repair of National Guard armories and facilities; Department of Public Safety for construction of a new patrol post in District 1; Department of Natural Resources for the purpose of funding capital projects from marine fuel tax receipts for expenditures for local cost-share grants to be used for capital expenditures to local governmental units for boating accessibility, for the construction of the Elinor Bedell state park and wildlife conservation area, for a recreational grant matching program, creation of a lake rehabilitation pilot program, for the bluffslands protection revolving fund, and for the dredging of lakes; Department of Transportation for capital improvements

at all ten of the commercial air service airports and for an automated weather observation system; for the Iowa State Fair foundation for renovation, restoration, and improvement of the cattle barn and horse barn at the State Fairgrounds and for county fair infrastructure improvements; judicial department for capital projects at the Capitol Building; and State Board of Regents for capital projects at the Iowa School for the Deaf and the Iowa Braille and Sight Saving School; making appropriations of the marine fuel tax receipts from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund; providing a reversion date to funds appropriated to the Department of Revenue and Finance in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1998; making statutory changes relating to appropriations by establishing the blufflands protection program and revolving fund, by reducing the overall appropriation for the restore outdoors program for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 2001, as a result of the Governor's item veto, by providing for coordination of vertical infrastructure databases, by eliminating a matching contribution requirement on certain funds appropriated to the Department of Cultural Affairs for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1997, by extending the allowable time to enter into contracts to provide alternative drainage outlets, by allocating part of the funds derived from the excise tax on the sale of motor fuel used in watercraft from the general fund to the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund, by reallocating certain funds to design and construct new or replacement buildings at the state training school; and providing effective dates.

Senate File 2381 is, therefore, approved on this date with the following exceptions, which I hereby disapprove.

I am unable to approve the designated portion of Section 2, subsection 4. This item appropriates \$1.5 million for improvements at the facilities of the judicial districts. This item was added late in the legislative session without full benefit of discussion and evaluation.

I am unable to approve the item designated as Section 5, subsection 1, in its entirety. This item appropriates \$2.0 million for improvements at the facilities of the community colleges. While I continue to support additional technology funding for community colleges, capital funding should remain a responsibility of the community college district, not the state.

I am unable to approve the item designated as Section 15, in its entirety. This item would require the Department of General Services to establish a system for comparative evaluation and rating of all state vertical infrastructure needs, including the Board of Regents' institutions. I am disappointed the legislature chose not to establish a citizen board as I recommended, and failed to provide adequate staffing and support to allow the state to become more systematic in its approach to prioritizing infrastructure needs. I believe the board and the additional staffing are necessary to developing a comparative evaluation methodology.

Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated funds remaining on June 30, 2000, from the funds appropriated in this section shall revert to the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund on August 31, 2000.

There is appropriated from the marine fuel tax receipts deposited in the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the department of natural resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30, 1999, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A to administer the disbursement of funds. Notwithstanding section 12C.7, interest or earnings on investments made pursuant to this section or as provided in section 12B.10 shall be credited to the blufflands protection revolving fund. Notwithstanding section 8.33, unobligated or unencumbered funds credited to the blufflands protection revolving fund shall not revert at the close of a fiscal year. However, the maximum balance in

the blufflands protection fund shall not exceed two million five hundred thousand dollars. Any funds in excess of two million five hundred thousand dollars shall be credited to the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund.

a. This section is repealed on July 1, 2005.

b. The principal and interest from any blufflands protection loan outstanding on July 1, 2005, and payable to the blufflands protection revolving fund, shall be paid to the administrative director of the division of soil conservation on or after July 1, 2005, pursuant to the terms of the loan agreement and shall be credited to the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund.

Sec. 18. Section 452A.79, unnumbered paragraph 2, Code 1997, is amended to read as follows:
