A BILL FOR

1 An Act appropriating federal funds made available from federal
2 block grants and other federal grants, allocating portions of
3 federal block grants, and providing procedures if federal
4 funds are more or less than anticipated or if federal block
5 grants are more or less than anticipated.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. SUBSTANCE ABUSE APPROPRIATION.

2 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
3 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal
4 fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September
5 30, 2000, the following amount:

6 \$ 11,945,086

7 a. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the
8 anticipated funds to be received from the federal government
9 for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C.,
10 chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the substance
11 abuse prevention and treatment block grant. The department
12 shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as
13 provided in the federal law making the funds available and in
14 conformance with chapter 17A.

15 b. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount
16 not exceeding 5 percent shall be used by the department for
17 administrative expenses.

18 c. The department shall expend no less than an amount
19 equal to the amount expended for treatment services in state
20 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, for pregnant women and
21 women with dependent children.

22 d. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount
23 not exceeding \$ 24,585 shall be used for audits.

24 2. The funds remaining from the appropriation made in
25 subsection 1 shall be allocated as follows:

26 a. At least 20 percent of the allocation shall be for
27 prevention programs.

28 b. At least 35 percent of the allocation shall be spent on
29 drug treatment and prevention activities.

30 c. At least 35 percent of the allocation shall be spent on
31 alcohol treatment and prevention activities.

32 3. The substance abuse block grant funds received from the
33 federal government in excess of the amount of the anticipated
34 federal fiscal year 1999-2000 award appropriated in subsection
35 1 shall be distributed at least 50 percent to treatment

1 programs and 50 percent to prevention programs except that,
2 based upon federal guidelines, the total amount of the excess
3 awarded to prevention programs shall not exceed \$ 1,000,000.

4 Sec. 2. COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATION.

5 1. a. There is appropriated from the fund created by
6 section 8.41 to the Iowa department of human services for the
7 federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, and ending
8 September 30, 2000, the following amount:

9 \$ 2,740,750

10 b. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the
11 anticipated funds to be received from the federal government
12 for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C.,
13 chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the community
14 mental health services block grant. The department shall
15 expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided
16 in the federal law making the funds available and in
17 conformance with chapter 17A.

18 c. The administrator of the division of mental health and
19 developmental disabilities of the department of human services
20 shall allocate not less than 95 percent of the amount of the
21 block grant to eligible community mental health services
22 providers for carrying out the plan submitted to and approved
23 by the federal substance abuse and mental health services
24 administration for the fiscal year involved.

25 2. An amount not exceeding 5 percent of the funds
26 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department
27 of human services for administrative expenses. From the funds
28 set aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the
29 division of mental health and developmental disabilities shall
30 pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the
31 cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's
32 portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The
33 auditor of state shall bill the division of mental health and
34 developmental disabilities for the costs of the audits.

35 Sec. 3. MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

1 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
2 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal
3 fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September
4 30, 2000, the following amount:

5 \$ 6,969,580

6 The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
7 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
8 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 7,
9 subchapter V, which provides for the maternal and child health
10 services block grant. The department shall expend the funds
11 appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law
12 making the funds available and in conformance with chapter
13 17A.

14 Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not
15 exceeding \$ 45,700 shall be used for audits.

16 Funds appropriated in this subsection shall not be used by
17 the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics for indirect
18 costs.

19 2. An amount not exceeding \$ 150,000 of the funds
20 appropriated in subsection 1 to the Iowa department of public
21 health shall be used by the Iowa department of public health
22 for administrative expenses in addition to the amount to be
23 used for audits in subsection 1.

24 The departments of public health, human services, and
25 education and the university of Iowa's mobile and regional
26 child health specialty clinics shall continue to pursue to the
27 maximum extent feasible the coordination and integration of
28 services to women and children.

29 3. a. Sixty-three percent of the remaining funds
30 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to supplement
31 appropriations for maternal and child health programs within
32 the Iowa department of public health. Of these funds, \$
33 284,548 shall be set aside for the statewide perinatal care
34 program.

35 b. Thirty-seven percent of the remaining funds

1 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to the
2 university of Iowa hospitals and clinics under the control of
3 the state board of regents for mobile and regional child
4 health specialty clinics. The university of Iowa hospitals
5 and clinics shall not receive an allocation for indirect costs
6 from the funds for this program. Priority shall be given to
7 establishment and maintenance of a statewide system of mobile
8 and regional child health specialty clinics.

9 4. The Iowa department of public health shall administer
10 the statewide maternal and child health program and the
11 crippled children's program by conducting mobile and regional
12 child health specialty clinics and conducting other activities
13 to improve the health of low-income women and children and to
14 promote the welfare of children with actual or potential
15 handicapping conditions and chronic illnesses in accordance
16 with the requirements of Title V of the federal Social
17 Security Act.

18 Sec. 4. PREVENTIVE HEALTH AND HEALTH SERVICES
19 APPROPRIATIONS.

20 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
21 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal
22 fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September
23 30, 2000, the following amount:

24 \$ 2,128,352

25 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
26 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
27 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 6A,
28 subchapter XVII, which provides for the preventive health and
29 health services block grant. The department shall expend the
30 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
31 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
32 chapter 17A.

33 Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not
34 exceeding \$ 5,522 shall be used for audits.

35 2. Of the funds appropriated in subsection 1, the specific

1 amount of funds stipulated by the notice of block grant award
2 shall be allocated for services to victims of sex offenses and
3 for rape prevention education.

4 3. An amount not exceeding \$ 94,670 of the remaining
5 funds appropriated in subsections 1 and 2 shall be used by the
6 Iowa department of public health for administrative expenses
7 in addition to the amount to be used for audits in subsection
8 1.

9 4. After deducting the funds allocated in subsections 1,
10 2, and 3, the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1
11 shall be used by the department for healthy people 2000 and
12 2010/healthy Iowans 2000 and 2010 program objectives,
13 preventive health advisory committee, and risk reduction
14 services, including nutrition programs, health incentive
15 programs, chronic disease services, emergency medical
16 services, monitoring of the fluoridation program and start-up
17 fluoridation grants, and acquired immune deficiency syndrome
18 services. The moneys specified in this subsection shall not
19 be used by the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics or by
20 the state hygienic laboratory for the funding of indirect
21 costs. Of the funds used by the department under this
22 subsection, an amount not exceeding \$ 90,000 shall be used
23 for the monitoring of the fluoridation program and for start-
24 up fluoridation grants to public water systems, and at least \$
25 50,000 shall be used to provide chlamydia testing.

26 Sec. 5. DRUG CONTROL AND SYSTEM IMPROVEMENT GRANT PROGRAM
27 APPROPRIATION.

28 1. There is appropriated from the fund created in section
29 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug enforcement
30 and abuse prevention coordinator for the federal fiscal year
31 beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September 30, 2000, the
32 following amount:

33 \$ 5,865,000

34 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated
35 funds to be received from the federal government for the

1 designated fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 46, subchapter
2 V, which provides for the drug control and system improvement
3 grant program. The drug enforcement and abuse prevention
4 coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in this
5 subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds
6 available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

7 2. An amount not exceeding 7 percent of the funds
8 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the drug
9 enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for
10 administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this
11 subsection for administrative expenses, the drug enforcement
12 and abuse prevention coordinator shall pay to the auditor of
13 state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use
14 and administration of the state's portion of the funds
15 appropriated in subsection 1.

16 Sec. 6. STOP VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN GRANT PROGRAM
17 APPROPRIATION.

18 1. There is appropriated from the fund created in section
19 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug enforcement
20 and abuse prevention coordinator for the federal fiscal year
21 beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September 30, 2000, the
22 following amount:

23 \$ 1,647,000

24 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated
25 funds to be received from the federal government for the
26 designated fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 46, subchapter
27 XII-H, which provides for grants to combat violent crimes
28 against women. The drug enforcement and abuse prevention
29 coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in this
30 subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds
31 available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

32 2. An amount not exceeding 5 percent of the funds
33 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the drug
34 enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for
35 administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this

1 subsection for administrative expenses, the drug enforcement
2 and abuse prevention coordinator shall pay to the auditor of
3 the state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the
4 use and administration of the state's portion of the funds
5 appropriated in subsection 1.

6 Sec. 7. LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT BLOCK GRANT APPROPRIATION.

7 1. There is appropriated from the fund created in section
8 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug enforcement
9 and abuse prevention coordinator for the federal fiscal year
10 beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September 30, 2000, the
11 following amount:

12 \$ 322,049

13 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
14 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
15 designated federal fiscal year under annual federal
16 appropriations which provide for grants to reduce crime and
17 improve public safety. The drug enforcement and abuse
18 prevention coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in
19 this subsection as provided in the federal law making the
20 funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

21 2. An amount not exceeding 3 percent of the funds
22 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the drug
23 enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for
24 administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this
25 subsection for administrative expenses, the drug enforcement
26 and abuse prevention coordinator shall pay to the auditor of
27 state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use
28 and administration of the state's portion of the funds
29 appropriated in subsection 1.

30 Sec. 8. RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT FOR STATE
31 PRISONERS FORMULA GRANT PROGRAM. There is appropriated from
32 the fund created in section 8.41 to the office of the governor
33 for the drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for
34 the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, and ending
35 September 30, 2000, the following amount:

1 \$ 514,497

2 Funds appropriated in this section are the funds
3 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
4 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 136,
5 which provides grants for substance abuse treatment programs
6 in state and local correctional facilities. The drug
7 enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator shall expend the
8 funds appropriated in this section as provided in the federal
9 law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter
10 17A.

11 Sec. 9. COMMUNITY SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

12 1. a. There is appropriated from the fund created by
13 section 8.41 to the division of community action agencies of
14 the department of human rights for the federal fiscal year
15 beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September 30, 2000, the
16 following amount:

17 \$ 5,378,447

18 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
19 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
20 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 106,
21 which provides for the community services block grant. The
22 division of community action agencies of the department of
23 human rights shall expend the funds appropriated in this
24 subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds
25 available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

26 b. The administrator of the division of community action
27 agencies of the department of human rights shall allocate not
28 less than 96 percent of the amount of the block grant to
29 eligible community action agencies for programs benefiting
30 low-income persons. Each eligible agency shall receive a
31 minimum allocation of not less than \$ 100,000. The minimum
32 allocation shall be achieved by redistributing increased funds
33 from agencies experiencing a greater share of available funds.
34 The funds shall be distributed on the basis of the poverty-
35 level population in the area represented by the community

1 action areas compared to the size of the poverty-level
2 population in the state.

3 2. An amount not exceeding 4 percent of the funds
4 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the division of
5 community action agencies of the department of human rights
6 for administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this
7 subsection for administrative expenses, the division of
8 community action agencies of the department of human rights
9 shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay
10 the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's
11 portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The
12 auditor of state shall bill the division of community action
13 agencies for the costs of the audits.

14 Sec. 10. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT APPROPRIATIONS.

15 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
16 8.41 to the department of economic development for the federal
17 fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September
18 30, 2000, the following amount:

19 \$ 29,939,000

20 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
21 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
22 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 69,
23 which provides for community development block grants. The
24 department of economic development shall expend the funds
25 appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law
26 making the funds available and in conformance with chapter
27 17A.

28 2. An amount not exceeding \$ 1,397,560 for the federal
29 fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, shall be used by the
30 department of economic development for administrative expenses
31 for the community development block grant. The total amount
32 used for administrative expenses includes \$ 698,780 for the
33 federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, of funds
34 appropriated in subsection 1 and a matching contribution from
35 the state equal to \$ 698,780 from the appropriation of state

1 funds for the community development block grant and state
 2 appropriations for related activities of the department of
 3 economic development. From the funds set aside for
 4 administrative expenses by this subsection, the department of
 5 economic development shall pay to the auditor of state an
 6 amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and
 7 administration of the state's portion of the funds
 8 appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state shall bill
 9 the department for the costs of the audit.

10 Sec. 11. LOW-INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE APPROPRIATIONS.

11 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
 12 8.41 to the division of community action agencies of the
 13 department of human rights for the federal fiscal year
 14 beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September 30, 2000, the
 15 following amount:

16 \$ 19,951,229

17 The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
 18 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
 19 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 94,
 20 subchapter II, which provides for the low-income home energy
 21 assistance block grants. The division of community action
 22 agencies of the department of human rights shall expend the
 23 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
 24 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
 25 chapter 17A.

26 2. An amount not exceeding \$ 1,995,122 or 10 percent of
 27 the funds appropriated in subsection 1, whichever is less, may
 28 be used for administrative expenses for the low-income home
 29 energy assistance program. Not more than \$ 290,000 shall be
 30 used for administrative expenses of the division of community
 31 action agencies of the department of human rights. From the
 32 total funds set aside in this subsection for administrative
 33 expenses for the low-income home energy assistance program, an
 34 amount sufficient to pay the cost of an audit of the use and
 35 administration of the state's portion of the funds

1 appropriated is allocated for that purpose. The auditor of
2 state shall bill the division of community action agencies for
3 the costs of the audits.

4 3. The remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall
5 be allocated to help eligible households, as defined under 42
6 U.S.C., chapter 94, subchapter II, to meet the costs of home
7 energy. After reserving a reasonable portion of the remaining
8 funds not to exceed 10 percent of the funds appropriated in
9 subsection 1, to carry forward into the federal fiscal year
10 beginning October 1, 2000, at least 15 percent of the funds
11 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used for low-income
12 residential weatherization or other related home repairs for
13 low-income households. Of this amount, an amount not
14 exceeding 10 percent may be used for administrative expenses.

15 4. An eligible household must be willing to allow
16 residential weatherization or other related home repairs in
17 order to receive home energy assistance. If the eligible
18 household resides in rental property, the unwillingness of the
19 landlord to allow residential weatherization or other related
20 home repairs shall not prevent the household from receiving
21 home energy assistance.

22 5. Not more than 5 percent of the funds appropriated in
23 subsection 1 shall be used for assessment and resolution of
24 energy problems.

25 Sec. 12. SOCIAL SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

26 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
27 8.41 to the department of human services for the federal
28 fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September
29 30, 2000, the following amount:

30 \$ 20,408,465

31 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
32 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
33 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 7,
34 subchapter XX, which provides for the social services block
35 grant. The department of human services shall expend the

1 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
2 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
3 chapter 17A.

4 2. Not more than \$ 1,297,725 of the funds appropriated in
5 subsection 1 shall be used by the department of human services
6 for general administration. From the funds set aside in this
7 subsection for general administration, the department of human
8 services shall pay to the auditor of state an amount
9 sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and
10 administration of the state's portion of the funds
11 appropriated in subsection 1.

12 3. In addition to the allocation for general
13 administration in subsection 2, the remaining funds
14 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated in the
15 following amounts to supplement appropriations for the federal
16 fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, for the following
17 programs within the department of human services:

31 Sec. 13. SOCIAL SERVICES BLOCK GRANT PLAN. The department
32 of human services during each state fiscal year shall develop
33 a plan for the use of federal social services block grant
34 funds for the subsequent state fiscal year.

35 The proposed plan shall include all programs and services

1 at the state level which the department proposes to fund with
2 federal social services block grant funds, and shall identify
3 state and other funds which the department proposes to use to
4 fund the state programs and services.

5 The proposed plan shall also include all local programs and
6 services which are eligible to be funded with federal social
7 services block grant funds, the total amount of federal social
8 services block grant funds available for the local programs
9 and services, and the manner of distribution of the federal
10 social services block grant funds to the counties. The
11 proposed plan shall identify state and local funds which will
12 be used to fund the local programs and services.

13 The proposed plan shall be submitted with the department's
14 budget requests to the governor and the general assembly.

15 Sec. 14. PROJECTS FOR ASSISTANCE IN TRANSITION FROM
16 HOMELESSNESS. Upon receipt of the minimum formula grant from
17 the federal alcohol, drug abuse, and mental health
18 administration to provide mental health services for the
19 homeless, the division of mental health and developmental
20 disabilities of the department of human services shall assure
21 that a project which receives funds under the formula grant
22 from either the federal or local match share of 25 percent in
23 order to provide outreach services to persons who are
24 chronically mentally ill and homeless or who are subject to a
25 significant probability of becoming homeless shall do all of
26 the following:

- 27 1. Provide community mental health services, diagnostic
28 services, crisis intervention services, and habilitation and
29 rehabilitation services.
- 30 2. Refer clients to medical facilities for necessary
31 hospital services, and to entities that provide primary health
32 services and substance abuse services.
- 33 3. Provide appropriate training to persons who provide
34 services to persons targeted by the grant.
- 35 4. Provide case management to homeless persons.

1 5. Provide supportive and supervisory services to certain
2 homeless persons living in residential settings which are not
3 otherwise supported.

4 6. Projects may expend funds for housing services
5 including minor renovation, expansion and repair of housing,
6 security deposits, planning of housing, technical assistance
7 in applying for housing, improving the coordination of housing
8 services, the costs associated with matching eligible homeless
9 individuals with appropriate housing, and one-time rental
10 payments to prevent eviction.

11 Sec. 15. CHILD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT FUND. There is
12 appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the
13 department of human services for the federal fiscal year
14 beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September 30, 2000, the
15 following amount:

16 \$ 27,142,057

17 Funds appropriated in this section are the funds
18 anticipated to be received from the federal government under
19 42 U.S.C., chapter 105, subchapter II-B, which provides for
20 the child care and development fund. The department shall
21 expend the funds appropriated in this section as provided in
22 the federal law making the funds available and in conformance
23 with chapter 17A.

24 Sec. 16. PROCEDURE FOR REDUCED FEDERAL FUNDS.

25 1. If the funds received from the federal government for
26 the block grants specified in this Act are less than the
27 amounts appropriated, the funds actually received shall be
28 prorated by the governor for the various programs, other than
29 for the services to victims of sex offenses and for rape
30 prevention education under section 4, subsection 2, of this
31 Act, for which each block grant is available according to the
32 percentages that each program is to receive as specified in
33 this Act. However, if the governor determines that the funds
34 allocated by the percentages will not be sufficient to effect
35 the purposes of a particular program, or if the appropriation

1 is not allocated by percentage, the governor may allocate the
2 funds in a manner which will effect to the greatest extent
3 possible the purposes of the various programs for which the
4 block grants are available.

5 2. Before the governor implements the actions provided for
6 in subsection 1, the following procedures shall be taken:

7 a. The chairpersons and ranking members of the senate and
8 house standing committees on appropriations, the appropriate
9 chairpersons and ranking members of subcommittees of those
10 committees, the director of the legislative service bureau,
11 and the director of the legislative fiscal bureau shall be
12 notified of the proposed action.

13 b. The notice shall include the proposed allocations, and
14 information on the reasons why particular percentages or
15 amounts of funds are allocated to the individual programs, the
16 departments and programs affected, and other information
17 deemed useful. Chairpersons notified shall be allowed at
18 least two weeks to review and comment on the proposed action
19 before the action is taken.

20 3. If the amount of moneys received from the federal
21 government for a specific grant number specified in this Act
22 is less than the amount appropriated, the amount appropriated
23 shall be reduced accordingly. An annual report listing any
24 such appropriation reduction shall be submitted to the fiscal
25 committee of the legislative council.

26 Sec. 17. PROCEDURE FOR INCREASED FEDERAL FUNDS.

27 1. If funds received from the federal government in the
28 form of block grants exceed the amounts appropriated in

APPROPRIATING FEDERAL FUNDS MADE AVAILABLE FROM FEDERAL BLOCK GRANTS AND OTHER FEDERAL GRANTS, ALLOCATING PORTIONS OF FEDERAL BLOCK GRANTS, AND PROVIDING PROCEDURES IF FEDERAL FUNDS ARE MORE OR LESS THAN ANTICIPATED OR IF FEDERAL BLOCK GRANTS ARE MORE OR LESS THAN ANTICIPATED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. SUBSTANCE ABUSE APPROPRIATION.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September 30, 2000, the following amount:

..... \$ 11,945,086

a. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated funds to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the substance abuse prevention and treatment block grant. The department

shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

b. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding 5 percent shall be used by the department for administrative expenses.

c. The department shall expend no less than an amount equal to the amount expended for treatment services in the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, for pregnant women and women with dependent children.

d. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding \$24,585 shall be used for audits.

2. The funds remaining from the appropriation made in subsection 1 shall be allocated as follows:

a. At least 20 percent of the allocation shall be for prevention programs.

b. At least 35 percent of the allocation shall be spent on drug treatment and prevention activities.

c. At least 35 percent of the allocation shall be spent on alcohol treatment and prevention activities.

3. The substance abuse block grant funds received from the federal government in excess of the amount of the anticipated federal fiscal year 1999-2000 award appropriated in subsection 1 shall be distributed at least 50 percent to treatment programs and 50 percent to prevention programs except that, based upon federal guidelines, the total amount of the excess awarded to prevention programs shall not exceed \$1,000,000.

b. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated funds to be received from the federal government

c. 2. An amount not exceeding 5 percent of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department of human services for administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the division of mental health and developmental disabilities shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state shall bill the division of mental health and developmental disabilities for the costs of the audits.

Sec. 3. MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September 30, 2000, the following amount:

..... \$ 6,969,580

The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 7, subchapter V, which provides for the maternal and child health services block grant. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law

making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding \$45,700 shall be used for audits.

Funds appropriated in this subsection shall not be used by the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics for indirect costs.

2. An amount not exceeding \$150,000 of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 to the Iowa department of public health shall be used by the Iowa department of public health for administrative expenses in addition to the amount to be used for audits in subsection 1.

The departments of public health, human services, and education and the university of Iowa's mobile and regional child health specialty clinics shall continue to pursue to the maximum extent feasible the coordination and integration of services to women and children.

3. a. Sixty-three percent of the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to supplement appropriations for maternal and child health programs within the Iowa department of public health. Of these funds, \$284,548 shall be set aside for the statewide perinatal care program.

b. Thirty-seven percent of the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics under the control of the state board of regents for mobile and regional child health specialty clinics. The university of Iowa hospitals and clinics shall not receive an allocation for indirect costs from the funds for this program. Priority shall be given to establishment and maintenance of a statewide system of mobile and regional child health specialty clinics.

4. The Iowa department of public health shall administer the statewide maternal and child health program and the crippled children's program by conducting mobile and regional

child health specialty clinics and conducting other activities to improve the health of low-income women and children and to promote the welfare of children with actual or potential handicapping conditions and chronic illnesses in accordance with the requirements of Title V of the federal Social Security Act.

Sec. 4. PREVENTIVE HEALTH AND HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September 30, 2000, the following amount:

Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the preventive health and health services block grant. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding \$5,522 shall be used for audits.

2. Of the funds appropriated in subsection 1, the specific amount of funds stipulated by the notice of block grant award shall be allocated for services to victims of sex offenses and for rape prevention education.

3. An amount not exceeding \$94,670 of the remaining funds appropriated in subsections 1 and 2 shall be used by the Iowa department of public health for administrative expenses in addition to the amount to be used for audits in subsection 1.

4. After deducting the funds allocated in subsections 1, 2, and 3, the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department for healthy people 2000 and 2010/healthy Iowans 2000 and 2010 program objectives,

preventive health advisory committee, and risk reduction services, including nutrition programs, health incentive programs, chronic disease services, emergency medical services, monitoring of the fluoridation program and start-up fluoridation grants, and acquired immune deficiency syndrome services. From the funds set aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1.

Sec. 8. RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT FOR STATE PRISONERS FORMULA GRANT PROGRAM. There is appropriated from the fund created in section 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September 30, 2000, the following amount:

Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 106, which provides for the community services block grant. The division of community action agencies of the department of human rights shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

b. The administrator of the division of community action agencies of the department of human rights shall allocate not less than 96 percent of the amount of the block grant to eligible community action agencies for programs benefiting low-income persons. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 69, which provides for community development block grants. The department of economic development shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

2. An amount not exceeding \$1,397,560 for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, shall be used by the department of economic development for administrative expenses for the community development block grant. The total amount used for administrative expenses includes \$698,780 for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, of funds appropriated in subsection 1 and a matching contribution from the state equal to \$698,780 from the appropriation of state funds for the community development block grant and state appropriations for related activities of the department of economic development. The division of community action agencies of the department of human rights shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

2. An amount not exceeding \$1,995,122 or 10 percent of the funds appropriated in subsection 1, whichever is less, may be used for administrative expenses for the low-income home energy assistance program. Not more than \$290,000 shall be used for administrative expenses of the division of community action agencies of the department of human rights. From the total funds set aside in this subsection for administrative expenses for the low-income home energy assistance program, an amount sufficient to pay the cost of an audit of the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated is allocated for that purpose. Sec. 13. SOCIAL SERVICES BLOCK GRANT PLAN. The department of human services during each state fiscal year shall develop a plan for the use of federal social services block grant funds for the subsequent state fiscal year.

The proposed plan shall include all programs and services at the state level which the department proposes to fund with federal social services block grant funds, and shall identify state and other funds which the department proposes to use to fund the state programs and services.

The proposed plan shall also include all local programs and services which are eligible to be funded with federal social services block grant funds, the total amount of federal social services block grant funds available for the local programs and services, and the manner of distribution of the federal social services block grant funds to the counties. The proposed plan shall identify state and local funds which will be used to fund the local programs and services.

The proposed plan shall be submitted with the department's budget requests to the governor and the general assembly.

Sec. 14. PROJECTS FOR ASSISTANCE IN TRANSITION FROM HOMELESSNESS. Upon receipt of the minimum formula grant from the federal alcohol, drug abuse, and mental health administration to provide mental health services for the homeless, the division of mental health and developmental disabilities of the department of human services shall assure that a project which receives funds under the formula grant from either the federal or local match share of 25 percent in order to provide outreach services to persons who are chronically mentally ill and homeless or who are subject to a significant probability of becoming homeless shall do all of the following:

1. Provide community mental health services, diagnostic services, crisis intervention services, and habilitation and rehabilitation services.
2. Refer clients to medical facilities for necessary hospital services, and to entities that provide primary health services and substance abuse services.
3. Provide appropriate training to persons who provide services to persons targeted by the grant.
4. Provide case management to homeless persons.
5. Provide supportive and supervisory services to certain homeless persons living in residential settings which are not otherwise supported.
6. Projects may expend funds for housing services including minor renovation, expansion and repair of housing, security deposits, planning of housing, technical assistance in applying for housing, improving the coordination of housing services, the costs associated with matching eligible homeless individuals with appropriate housing, and one-time rental payments to prevent eviction.

Sec. 15. CHILD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT FUND. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the

department of human services for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September 30, 2000, the following amount:

Funds appropriated in this section are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government under 42 U.S.C., chapter 105, subchapter II-B, which provides for the child care and development fund. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this section as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

Sec. 16. PROCEDURE FOR REDUCED FEDERAL FUNDS.

1. If the funds received from the federal government for the block grants specified in this Act are less than the amounts appropriated, the funds actually received shall be prorated by the governor for the various programs, other than for the services to victims of sex offenses and for rape prevention education under section 4, subsection 2, of this Act, for which each block grant is available according to the percentages that each program is to receive as specified in this Act. However, if the governor determines that the funds allocated by the percentages will not be sufficient to effect the purposes of a particular program, or if the appropriation is not allocated by percentage, the governor may allocate the funds in a manner which will effect to the greatest extent possible the purposes of the various programs for which the block grants are available.

2. Before the governor implements the actions provided for in subsection 1, the following procedures shall be taken:

a. The chairpersons and ranking members of the senate and house standing committees on appropriations, the appropriate chairpersons and ranking members of subcommittees of those committees, the director of the legislative service bureau, and the director of the legislative fiscal bureau shall be notified of the proposed action.

b. The notice shall include the proposed allocations, and information on the reasons why particular percentages or amounts of funds are allocated to the individual programs, the departments and programs affected, and other information deemed useful. Chairpersons notified shall be allowed at least two weeks to review and comment on the proposed action before the action is taken.

3. If the amount of moneys received from the federal government for a specific grant number specified in this Act is less than the amount appropriated, the amount appropriated shall be reduced accordingly. An annual report listing any such appropriation reduction shall be submitted to the fiscal committee of the legislative council.

Sec. 17. PROCEDURE FOR INCREASED FEDERAL FUNDS.

1. If funds received from the federal government in the form of block grants exceed the amounts appropriated in sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 10, and 12 of this Act, the excess shall be prorated to the appropriate programs according to the percentages specified in those sections, except additional funds shall not be prorated for administrative expenses.

2. If funds received from the federal government from block grants exceed the amount appropriated in section 11 of this Act for the low-income home energy assistance program, 15 percent of the excess shall be allocated to the low-income residential weatherization program.

3. If funds received from the federal government from community services block grants exceed the amount appropriated in section 9 of this Act, 100 percent of the excess is allocated to the community services block grant program.

4. If the amount of moneys received from the federal government for a specific grant number specified in this Act exceeds the amount appropriated, the excess amount is appropriated for the purpose designated in the specific grant's appropriation. An annual report listing any such excess appropriations shall be submitted to the fiscal committee of the legislative council.

Sec. 18. PROCEDURE FOR EXPENDITURE OF ADDITIONAL FEDERAL FUNDS. If other federal grants, receipts, and funds and other nonstate grants, receipts, and funds become available or are awarded which are not available or awarded during the period in which the general assembly is in session, but which require expenditure by the applicable department or agency prior to March 15 of the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000, these grants, receipts, and funds are appropriated to the extent necessary, provided that the fiscal committee of the legislative council is notified within thirty days of receipt of the grants, receipts, or funds and the fiscal committee of the legislative council has an opportunity to comment on the expenditure of the grants, receipts, or funds.

Sec. 58. LIHEAP FUNDING -- DISCONNECTION PROHIBITION. It is the intent of the general assembly that if the governor determines federal funds are insufficient to adequately provide for certification of eligibility for the low-income home energy assistance program by the community action agencies during the federal fiscal year which commences October 1, 1999, the Iowa utilities board shall issue an order prohibiting disconnection of service from November 1 through April 1 by a regulated public utility furnishing gas or electricity to households whose income falls at or below one hundred fifty percent of the federal poverty level as established by the United States office of management and budget. The board shall promptly adopt rules in accordance

with section 17A.4, subsection 2, and section 17A.5, subsection 2, paragraph "b", to implement this requirement. The energy assistance bureau of the department of human rights, in consultation with the community action agencies, shall certify to the utilities, households that are eligible for moratorium protection utilizing the agency's existing electronic database. Rules adopted under this section shall also be published as a notice of intended action as provided in section 17A.4.
