A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations for agriculture and
2 natural resources and providing effective dates.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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DIVISION I

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP

Section 1. GENERAL DEPARTMENT APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

1. ADMINISTRATIVE DIVISION

a. For salaries, support, maintenance, the support of the state 4-H foundation, support of the statistics bureau, and miscellaneous purposes, and for the salaries and support of not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

.....	FTEs	47.88

(1) Of the amount appropriated and full-time equivalent positions authorized in this paragraph "a", \$282,975 and 6.00 FTEs shall be used to support horticulture.

(2) Of the amount appropriated in this paragraph "a", \$55,000 shall be allocated to the state 4-H foundation to foster the development of Iowa's youth and to encourage them to study the subject of agriculture.

(3) Of the amount appropriated and full-time equivalent positions authorized in this paragraph "a", \$227,489 and 7.00 FTEs shall be allocated to the statistics bureau to provide county-by-county information on land in farms, production by crop, acres by crop, and county prices by crop. This information shall be made available to the department of revenue and finance for use in the productivity formula for valuing and equalizing the values of agricultural land.

(4) Of the amount appropriated in this paragraph "a", \$12,000 shall be used by the agricultural statistics bureau for purposes of collecting, summarizing, and publishing marketing information on a monthly basis, regarding finished cattle in cooperation with the Iowa cattlemen's association,

1 including unfinished cattle for market, cattle placed on feed,
2 and cattle on hand under marketing arrangements.

3 (5) Of the amount appropriated in this paragraph "a",
4 \$24,000 shall be used by the domestic marketing bureau through
5 an existing federal and state cooperative agreement to develop
6 accurate, reliable market information regarding segregated
7 early-weaned pigs and alternate feeder pigs marketing systems.

8 (6) Of the amount appropriated and the number of full-time
9 equivalent positions authorized in this paragraph "a", at
10 least \$61,500 shall be used for livestock market news
11 reporting.

12 (7) Of the amount appropriated in this paragraph "a",
13 \$24,939 shall be used to support 1.00 FTE on contract basis
14 for six part-time staff to perform functions related to
15 livestock market news reporting.

16 (8) Of the amount appropriated in this paragraph "a",
17 \$21,757 shall be used to support 1.00 FTE to operate the
18 switchboard and perform other clerical duties within the feed
19 bureau.

20 b. For deposit in the international travel fund created in
21 section 159.21 of this Act to carry out the purposes of that
22 fund:

23 \$ 20,151

24 c. For the purpose of performing commercial feed audits:

25 \$ 70,774

26 d. For the purpose of performing fertilizer audits:

27 \$ 70,775

28 2. REGULATORY DIVISION

29 a. For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
30 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time
31 equivalent positions:

32 \$ 4,254,450

33 FTEs 122.00

34 (1) Of the amount appropriated in this paragraph "a",
35 \$10,000 shall be used by the regulatory division for purposes

1 of inspecting livestock exhibited at the Iowa state fair, with
2 particular attention to the inspection of livestock for club-
3 lamb fungus.

4 (2) If Senate File 2312 or House File 2490 is enacted by
5 the Seventy-eighth General Assembly, 2000 Session, the amount
6 appropriated from the general fund pursuant to this paragraph
7 "a" shall be increased by \$200,000 and the number of full-time
8 equivalent positions authorized pursuant to this paragraph "a"
9 shall be increased by 4.00 FTEs.

10 b. For the costs of inspection, sampling, analysis, and
11 other expenses necessary for the administration of chapters
12 192, 194, and 195:

13 \$ 708,859

14 3. LABORATORY DIVISION

15 a. For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
16 purposes, including the administration of the gypsy moth
17 program, and for not more than the following full-time
18 equivalent positions:

19 \$ 951,666

20 FTEs 82.00

21 (1) Of the amount appropriated and the number of full-time
22 equivalent positions authorized in this paragraph "a",
23 \$150,000 shall be allocated and 4.93 FTEs shall be supported
24 from the allocation to administer a program relating to the
25 detection, surveillance, and eradication of the gypsy moth.
26 The department shall use the allocation made in this
27 subparagraph before other moneys.

28 (2) If Senate File 466 is enacted by the Seventy-eighth
29 General Assembly, 2000 Session, the number of full-time
30 equivalent positions authorized pursuant to this paragraph "a"
31 shall be increased by 4.00 FTEs.

32 b. For the operations of the commercial feed programs:

33 \$ 786,763

34 c. For the operations of the pesticide programs:

35 \$ 1,285,638

1 (1) Of the amount appropriated in this paragraph "c",
2 \$200,000 shall be allocated to Iowa state university of
3 science and technology for purposes of training commercial
4 pesticide applicators.

5 (2) Of the amount appropriated in this paragraph "c",
6 \$13,247 shall be used to support 1.00 FTE in a temporary
7 employment position to assist with the administration of
8 pesticide certification examinations.

9 d. For the operations of the fertilizer programs:

10 \$ 679,406

11 4. SOIL CONSERVATION DIVISION

12 a. For salaries, support, maintenance, assistance to soil
13 conservation districts, and miscellaneous purposes, and for
14 not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

15 \$ 6,985,526

16 FTEs 192.98

17 (1) Of the amount appropriated in this paragraph "a",
18 \$418,376 shall be used to reimburse commissioners of soil and
19 water conservation districts for administrative expenses,
20 including, but not limited to, travel expenses and technical
21 training. Moneys used for the payment of meeting dues by
22 counties shall be matched on a dollar-for-dollar basis by the
23 soil conservation division.

24 (2) Of the number of full-time equivalent positions
25 authorized in this paragraph "a", 20.00 FTEs shall be
26 supported from allocations made pursuant to § 319 of the
27 federal Water Quality Act of 1987, as codified in 33 U.S.C. §
28 1329, and from appropriations to the department from the Iowa
29 resources enhancement and protection fund.

30 b. To provide financial incentives for soil conservation
31 practices under chapter 161A:

32 \$ 5,500,850

33 c. The following requirements apply to the moneys
34 appropriated in paragraph "b":

35 (1) Not more than 5 percent of the moneys appropriated in

1 paragraph "b" may be allocated by the department for cost-
2 sharing to abate complaints filed under section 161A.47.

3 (2) Of the moneys appropriated in paragraph "b", 5 percent
4 shall be allocated for financial incentives to establish
5 practices to protect watersheds above publicly owned lakes of
6 the state from soil erosion and sediment as provided in
7 section 161A.73.

8 (3) Not more than 30 percent of a district's allocation of
9 moneys as financial incentives may be provided for the purpose
10 of establishing management practices to control soil erosion
11 on land that is row-cropped, including but not limited to no-
12 till planting, ridge-till planting, contouring, and contour
13 strip-cropping as provided in section 161A.73.

14 (4) The state soil conservation committee created in
15 section 161A.4 may allocate moneys appropriated in paragraph
16 "b" to conduct research and demonstration projects to promote
17 conservation tillage and nonpoint source pollution control
18 practices.

19 (5) The financial incentive payments may be used in
20 combination with department of natural resources moneys.

21 d. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
22 paragraph "b" that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
23 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
24 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until
25 the close of the fiscal year that begins July 1, 2003.

26 Sec. 2. FARMERS' MARKET COUPON PROGRAM. There is
27 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
28 department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal
29 year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the
30 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
31 used for the purposes designated:

32 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
33 purposes, to be used by the department to continue and expand
34 the farmers' market coupon program by providing federal
35 special supplemental food program recipients with coupons

1 redeemable at farmers' markets, and for not more than the
2 following full-time equivalent positions:

5 DIVISION II

6 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

7 GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS

8 Sec. 3. GENERAL DEPARTMENT APPROPRIATION. There is
9 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
10 department of natural resources for the fiscal year beginning
11 July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amounts,
12 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
13 purposes designated:

14 1. ADMINISTRATIVE AND SUPPORT SERVICES

15 a. For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
16 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time
17 equivalent positions:

20 b. Of the amount appropriated in paragraph "a", \$12,000
21 shall be allocated to pay dues for membership in the upper
22 Mississippi, Illinois, and Missouri river basin commission.

23 c. Of the amount appropriated and the number of full-time
24 equivalent positions authorized in paragraph "a", at least
25 \$150,000 and 3.00 FTEs shall be used by administrative and
26 support services to support a compliance and permit assistance
27 team to facilitate cooperation between the department and
28 persons regulated by the department in order to ensure
29 efficient compliance with applicable legal requirements.

30 d. Of the amount appropriated and the number of full-time
31 equivalent positions authorized in paragraph "a", not less
32 than \$34,000 and 1.00 FTE shall be used by administrative and
33 support services to support the inspection and oversight of
34 manure management plans associated with confinement feeding
35 operations regulated by the department.

1 2. PARKS AND PRESERVES DIVISION

2 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
3 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time
4 equivalent positions:

6 FTEs 195.73

7 Of the amount appropriated in this subsection 2, at least
8 \$50,000 shall be allocated for the replacement of maintenance
9 equipment used by the division.

10 3. FORESTS AND FORESTRY DIVISION

11 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,
12 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent
13 positions:

16 4. ENERGY AND GEOLOGICAL RESOURCES DIVISION

17 a. For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
18 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time

22 b. Of the amount appropriated and the number of full-time
23 equivalent positions authorized in paragraph "a", not less
24 than \$76,000 and 2.00 FTEs shall be used by the energy and
25 geological resources division to review soil and hydrology
26 data for construction permits and manure management plans
27 associated with confinement feeding operations regulated by
28 the department.

29 5. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION DIVISION

30 a. For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous
31 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time
32 equivalent positions:

33 \$ 3,897,600
34 FTEs 246.50

35 b. Of the amount appropriated in paragraph "a", at least

1 \$1,350,000 shall be used by the department to carry out the
2 provisions of the federal Clean Air Act, including amendments
3 to the Act, and regulations adopted pursuant to the Act by the
4 United States environmental protection agency.

5 c. Of the amount appropriated and the number of full-time
6 equivalent positions authorized in paragraph "a", at least
7 \$424,600 and 9.00 FTEs shall be primarily used to support the
8 regulation of animal feeding operations.

9 d. Of the amount appropriated and the number of full-time
10 equivalent positions authorized in paragraph "a", at least
11 \$370,000 and 9.00 FTEs shall be used to support on-site
12 inspections and the oversight of manure management plans
13 associated with confinement feeding operations regulated by
14 the department. It is the intent of the general assembly that
15 3.00 FTEs and moneys used to support those full-time
16 equivalent positions not be available after June 30, 2002.

17 e. Of the amount appropriated in paragraph "a", \$105,564
18 shall be used to contract with persons to process manure
19 management plans as required by the department.

20 f. Of the amount appropriated and the number of full-time
21 equivalent positions authorized in paragraph "a", at least
22 \$700,467 and 10.00 FTEs shall be used to support the
23 regulation of wastewater treatment systems, including issuing
24 permits and conducting inspections.

25 6. WATER QUALITY PROTECTION FUND

26 a. For deposit in the administration account of the water
27 quality protection fund administered by the department, to
28 carry out the purpose of that account:

29 \$ 729,000

30 b. Of the number of full-time equivalent positions
31 authorized for the environmental protection division in
32 subsection 5, paragraph "a", 32.50 FTEs shall be dedicated to
33 carrying out relevant Code provisions relating to the
34 administration, regulation, and enforcement of the federal
35 Safe Drinking Water Act and to support the program to assist

1 water supply systems. However, the limitation on full-time
2 equivalent positions provided in subsection 5, paragraph "a",
3 shall not limit the number of additional full-time equivalent
4 positions supported by moneys deposited in the water quality
5 protection fund in order to carry out Code provisions relating
6 to the administration, regulation, and enforcement of the
7 federal Safe Drinking Water Act, and the administration of the
8 program to assist water supply systems.

9 c. In providing assistance to water supply systems, the
10 department shall give priority to water supply systems serving
11 a population of 7,000 or less. At least 2.00 FTEs shall be
12 allocated by the department to provide assistance to systems
13 serving a population of 7,000 or less.

14 d. Of the amount appropriated in paragraph "a", \$300,000
15 shall be allocated to the environmental protection division of
16 the department of natural resources for salaries, support,
17 maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes relating to the
18 administration of the division.

19 7. FISH AND WILDLIFE DIVISION

20 For not more than the following full-time equivalent

27 Sec. 4. STATE FISH AND GAME PROTECTION FUND --

28 APPROPRIATION TO THE DIVISION OF FISH AND WILDLIFE.

29 1. a. There is appropriated from the state fish and game
30 protection fund to the division of fish and wildlife of the
31 department of natural resources for the fiscal year beginning
32 July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amount,
33 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
34 purposes designated:

35 For administrative support, and for salaries, support,

1 maintenance, equipment, and miscellaneous purposes:

3 b. Of the amount appropriated in paragraph "a", \$250,000
4 may be used for purposes of providing compensation to
5 conservation peace officers employed in a protection

7 2. The department shall not expend more moneys from the
8 fish and game protection fund than provided in this section,
9 unless the expenditure derives from contributions made by a
10 private entity, or a grant or moneys received from the federal
11 government, and is approved by the natural resource
12 commission. The department of natural resources shall
13 promptly notify the legislative fiscal bureau and the
14 chairpersons and ranking members of the joint appropriations
15 subcommittee on agriculture and natural resources concerning
16 the commission's approval.

10 beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the
11 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
12 used for the purpose designated:

13 For the purpose of depositing the moneys in the
14 agrichemical remediation fund created under section 161.8, if
15 enacted in Senate File 466 by the Seventy-eighth General
16 Assembly, 2000 Session:

18 2. The moneys appropriated in this section shall be used
19 prior to moneys appropriated to the department of natural
20 resources to develop and implement demonstration projects for
21 landfill alternatives to solid waste disposal including

11 following additional full-time staff members to reduce the
12 department's floodplain permit backlog:

14 Sec. 14. IMPLEMENTATION OF THE FEDERAL TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY
15 LOAD PROGRAM. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of state
16 law, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending

18 additional funds available to the department from stormwater

2 EXPLANATION

3 This bill relates to agriculture and natural resources by
4 making appropriations to support related entities, including
5 the department of agriculture and land stewardship, the
6 department of natural resources, and Iowa state university of
7 science and technology.

8 The bill appropriates moneys to the department of
9 agriculture and land stewardship and the department of natural
10 resources. The appropriations are made to support
11 administration of those departments. The bill also provides
12 moneys for specific programs administered by those
13 departments. The bill appropriates moneys from a number of
14 sources, including the general fund of the state, the
15 groundwater protection fund, and the organic nutrient
16 management fund.

17 For the department of agriculture and land stewardship
18 moneys are appropriated in order to support the state 4-H
19 foundation, support international travel, support livestock
20 market reporting, administer the farmers' market coupon
21 program, support the eradication of gypsy moth infestations,
22 support training of commercial pesticide applicators, and
23 support soil conservation cost-share programs.

24 For the department of natural resources, moneys are
25 appropriated for the administration of programs to provide
26 safe drinking water and clean air, and for the regulation of
27 confinement feeding operations.

28 The bill appropriates moneys to support a program
29 administered by Iowa state university of science and
30 technology for the eradication of pseudorabies in swine and
31 Johne's disease in cattle. The bill appropriates moneys to
32 the university from the general fund in order to support the
33 Iowa concern hotline in providing stress counseling to farm
34 families.

35 The bill appropriates moneys from the general fund to the

1 department of natural resources for the purpose of supporting
2 sick leave retirement payouts for the current fiscal year.

3 The bill makes appropriations from other funds and
4 accounts. The bill makes an appropriation from moneys
5 transferred to the state fish and game protection fund to
6 support snowmobile programs and enforce state navigation laws
7 administered by the department of natural resources.

8 The bill appropriates moneys from various accounts of the
9 groundwater protection fund to support the department of
10 natural resources.

11 An appropriation is made from the unassigned revenue fund
12 administered by the Iowa comprehensive underground storage
13 tank fund board to the department of natural resources for
14 administration and expenses of the underground storage tank
15 section.

16 The bill provides that the department of natural resources
17 may use additional funds for staffing two additional full-time
18 staff members to reduce the department's floodplain permit
19 backlog.

20 The bill codifies provisions that appeared in last year's
21 appropriation bill, including a provision requiring that the
22 department of agriculture and land stewardship and the
23 department of natural resources must notify the chairpersons,
24 vice chairpersons, and ranking members of the joint
25 appropriations subcommittee on agriculture and natural
26 resources for the previous fiscal quarter of any transfer of
27 moneys for full-time equivalent positions made by either
28 department that is not authorized in the bill. It codifies a
29 provision requiring the department of agriculture and land
30 stewardship to publicize the availability of farm programs to
31 women and minority persons. It also codifies a provision
32 establishing an international travel fund within the
33 department of agriculture and land stewardship.

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP

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Section 1. GENERAL DEPARTMENT APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

18 agriculture and land stewardship and the department of natural
19 resources. The appropriations are made to support
20 administration of those departments. The bill also provides
21 moneys for specific programs administered by those
22 departments. The bill appropriates moneys from a number of
23 sources, including the general fund of the state, the
24 groundwater protection fund, and the organic nutrient
25 management fund.

26 For the department of agriculture and land stewardship
27 moneys are appropriated in order to support the state 4-H
28 foundation, support international travel, support livestock
29 market reporting, administer the farmers' market coupon
30 program, support the eradication of gypsy moth infestations,
31 support training of commercial pesticide applicators, and
32 support soil conservation cost-share programs.

33 For the department of natural resources, moneys are
34 appropriated for the administration of programs to provide
35 safe drinking water and clean air, and for the regulation of

1 confinement feeding operations.

2 The bill appropriates moneys to support a program
3 administered by Iowa state university of science and
4 technology for the eradication of pseudorabies in swine and
5 Johne's disease in cattle. The bill appropriates moneys to
6 the university from the general fund in order to support the
7 Iowa concern hotline in providing stress counseling to farm
8 families.

9 The bill appropriates moneys from the general fund to the
10 department of natural resources for the purpose of supporting
11 sick leave retirement payouts for the current fiscal year.

12 The bill makes appropriations from other funds and
13 accounts. The bill makes an appropriation from moneys
14 transferred to the state fish and game protection fund to
15 support snowmobile programs and enforce state navigation laws
16 administered by the department of natural resources.

17 The bill appropriates moneys from various accounts of the
18 groundwater protection fund to support the department of
19 natural resources.

20 An appropriation is made from the unassigned revenue fund
21 administered by the Iowa comprehensive underground storage
22 tank fund board to the department of natural resources for
23 administration and expenses of the underground storage tank
24 section.

25 The bill provides that the department of natural resources
26 may use additional funds for staffing two additional full-time
27 staff members to reduce the department's floodplain permit
28 backlog. It provides that the department may use additional
29 funds available from stormwater discharge permit fees for
30 staffing required to implement the federal maximum daily load
31 program.

32 The bill codifies provisions that appeared in last year's
33 appropriation bill, including a provision requiring that the
34 department of agriculture and land stewardship and the
35 department of natural resources must notify the chairpersons,

1 vice chairpersons, and ranking members of the joint
2 appropriations subcommittee on agriculture and natural
3 resources for the previous fiscal quarter of any transfer of
4 moneys for full-time equivalent positions made by either
5 department that is not authorized in the bill. It codifies a
6 provision requiring the department of agriculture and land
7 stewardship to publicize the availability of farm programs to
8 women and minority persons. It also codifies a provision
9 establishing an international relations fund within the
10 department of agriculture and land stewardship.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

DIVISION I

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP

Section 1. GENERAL DEPARTMENT APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

training. Moneys used for the payment of meeting dues by counties shall be matched on a dollar-for-dollar basis by the soil conservation division.

(2) Of the number of full-time equivalent positions authorized in this paragraph "a", 20.00 FTEs shall be supported from allocations made pursuant to § 319 of the federal Water Quality Act of 1987, as codified in 33 U.S.C. § 1329, and from appropriations to the department from the Iowa resources enhancement and protection fund.

(3) Of the number of full-time equivalent positions authorized pursuant to this paragraph "a", 2.00 FTEs shall be used to support the conservation reserve enhancement program.

There is appropriated from the unassigned revenue fund administered by the Iowa comprehensive underground storage tank fund board, to the department of natural resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

Sec. 10. ORGANIC NUTRIENT MANAGEMENT FUND -- AGRICHEMICAL REMEDIATION. Notwithstanding section 161C.5, the unencumbered and unobligated balance of the organic nutrient management fund, as of July 1, 2000, is appropriated to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for deposit by the department into the agrichemical remediation fund established in chapter 161, if enacted in 2000 Iowa Acts, Senate File 466.

Sec. 11. FLOODPLAIN PERMIT BACKLOG. Notwithstanding any provision of state law, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the department of natural resources may use additional funds available to the department from stormwater discharge permit fees for the staffing of the following additional full-time staff members to reduce the department's floodplain permit backlog:

Sec. 12. IMPLEMENTATION OF THE FEDERAL TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOAD PROGRAM. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of state law, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the department of natural resources may use additional funds available to the department from stormwater discharge permit fees, for the staffing of the following additional full-time equivalent positions for implementation of the federal total maximum daily load program:

ANIMAL HEALTH AND INDUSTRY

Sec. 13. HORSE AND DOG RACING. There is appropriated from the moneys available under section 99D.13 to the regulatory division of the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes for the administration of section 99D.22:
..... \$ 271,307

Sec. 14. PSEUDORABIES ERADICATION PROGRAM.

1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

For support of the pseudorabies eradication program:
..... \$ 900,700

2. Persons, including organizations interested in swine production in this state and in the promotion of Iowa pork products who contribute support to the program, are encouraged to increase financial support for purposes of ensuring the program's effective continuation.

Sec. 15. JOHNE'S DISEASE. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the livestock disease research fund created in section 267.8 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

For the purpose of supporting research and to evaluate procedures and tests by Iowa state university of science and technology to accurately diagnose Johnes disease:
..... \$ 100,000

1. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close of the fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund of the state but shall remain available for expenditure for the purpose designated in this section until the close of the fiscal year that begins July 1, 2002.

2. Moneys appropriated in this section shall only be used as provided in this section. No portion of the appropriation shall be used to support administrative costs incurred by Iowa state university of science and technology or the livestock health advisory council.

3. Moneys appropriated in this section shall be expended in accordance with the direction of the livestock health advisory council established pursuant to section 267.2.

OTHER APPROPRIATIONS

Sec. 16. REGENTS -- COOPERATIVE EXTENSION. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the state board of regents for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000, the following amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

To Iowa state university of science and technology, cooperative extension service in agriculture and home economics, to support the Iowa concern hotline in providing stress counseling, information, and referral to farm families facing financial distress:

In addition to any allocation of full-time equivalent positions authorized by the Seventy-eighth General Assembly during the 2000 Session for the state fire marshal's office, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, 1.00 additional FTE position is authorized for the office for inspections of aboveground petroleum storage tanks.

DIVISION IV
MISCELLANEOUS

Sec. 18. PILOT PROJECT FOR REFUND OF APPLICATION FEES BY THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES.

1. The department of natural resources may establish a pilot project for the refund of all or a portion of fees required to be paid to the department for issuing a stormwater discharge permit pursuant to section 455B.103A, if the department fails to issue the permit in a manner and within a period of time customary for issuing such permits. However, the department is not required to refund any amount of a fee if the failure to issue the permit is primarily caused by the

applicant, including the applicant's failure to comply with legal requirements, furnish a completed application or document, or cooperate with the department as required of applicants by the department.

2. The department of natural resources shall adopt rules as necessary in order to establish and administer this section.

3. The department may consider a decision not to issue a refund under this section as a final agency action which is not subject to a contested case proceeding or further agency review under chapter 17A.

Sec. 19. 1999 Iowa Acts, chapter 204, section 15, subsection 4, paragraph a, is amended by striking the paragraph.

Sec. 20. 1999 Iowa Acts, chapter 206, section 3, subsection 6, paragraph d, is amended to read as follows:

d. Of the amount appropriated in paragraph "a", \$300,000 shall be allocated to the department of natural resources for purposes of conducting a study of groundwater and surface water contamination in this state originating from municipal lagoons. The department shall not collect any fee for administering moneys appropriated in this section. The department shall submit interim reports to the general assembly on January ~~10~~ 8, ~~2000~~ 2001, and January ~~8~~ 14, ~~2001~~ 2002. The department shall submit a final report to the general assembly regarding the results of its study not later than January ~~14~~ 13, ~~2002~~ 2003. Unobligated and unencumbered moneys from this allocation remaining on June 30, 2001, shall revert to the water quality protection fund.

Sec. 21. NEW SECTION. 8.39A TRANSFER OF MONEYS OR POSITIONS -- CHANGES IN TABLES OF ORGANIZATION -- NOTIFICATION.

In addition to the requirements of section 8.39, in each fiscal quarter, the department of agriculture and land stewardship and the department of natural resources shall notify the chairpersons, vice chairpersons, and ranking

members of the joint appropriations subcommittee on agriculture and natural resources for the previous fiscal quarter of any transfer of moneys or full-time equivalent positions made by either department which is not authorized by law, or any permanent position added to or deleted from either department's table of organization.

Sec. 22. Section 8.60, subsection 4, Code 1999, is amended by striking the subsection.

Sec. 23. Section 101.22, subsection 4, Code 1999, is amended to read as follows:

4. The registration notice of the owner or operator to the state fire marshal under subsections 1 through 3 shall be accompanied by a fee of ten dollars for each tank included in the notice. All moneys collected shall be deposited-in-the general-fund retained by the department of public safety and are appropriated for the use of the state fire marshal. The annual renewal fee applies to all owners or operators who filed a registration notice with the state fire marshal pursuant to subsections 1 through 3.

Sec. 24. Section 101.24, subsection 1, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 1999, is amended to read as follows:

Inspect and investigate the facilities and records of owners and operators of aboveground petroleum storage tanks with a capacity of fifteen thousand or more gallons, as necessary to determine compliance with this division and the rules adopted pursuant to this division. An inspection or investigation shall be conducted subject to subsection 4. For purposes of developing a rule, maintaining an accurate inventory, or enforcing this division, the department may:

Sec. 25. NEW SECTION. 159.18 PUBLICIZING OF FARM PROGRAMS.

1. As used in this section, "farm programs" includes, but is not limited to, financial incentive programs established within the division of soil conservation of the department of agriculture and land stewardship as provided in section 161A.70 and the beginning farmer loan program administered by

the agricultural development authority as provided in section 175.12.

2. The department shall publicize the availability of farm programs to women and minority persons. The department shall disseminate the information electronically or by publishing printed brochures for distribution to locations and institutions serving farmers, including departmental offices, financial institutions participating in farm programs, and soil and water conservation district offices.

3. The department shall cooperate with private institutions and public agencies in order to carry out this section, including the department of economic development and the United States department of agriculture.

Sec. 26. NEW SECTION. 159.21 INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS FUND.

1. An international relations fund is created in the state treasury under the control of the department. The fund is composed of moneys appropriated by the general assembly, and moneys available to and obtained or accepted by the department from the United States or private sources for placement in the fund.

2. Moneys in the fund are subject to an annual audit by the auditor of state. The fund is subject to warrants written by the director of revenue and finance, drawn upon the written requisition of the department.

3. Moneys in the fund are appropriated exclusively to support costs incurred by the department related to promoting the sale of Iowa agricultural commodities and agricultural products to government officials and business leaders of other nations. The department may use moneys in the fund to support travel, including international travel, for the secretary of agriculture or the secretary's designee, and hosting or attending trade missions, functions, or events.

4. Section 8.33 shall not apply to moneys in the fund. Notwithstanding section 12C.7, moneys earned as income or interest from the fund shall remain in the fund until expended as provided in this section.

Sec. 27. Section 214A.1, Code 1999, is amended by adding the following new subsections:

NEW SUBSECTION. 2A. "Motor vehicle fuel storage tank" means an aboveground or belowground container that is a fixture, used to keep an accumulation of motor vehicle fuel.

NEW SUBSECTION. 2B. "MTBE" means methyl tertiary butyl ether.

NEW SUBSECTION. 4A. "Sell" means to sell or to offer for sale.

Sec. 28. Section 214A.2, subsection 4, Code Supplement 1999, is amended to read as follows:

4. Gasoline Motor vehicle fuel shall not contain methanol without an equal amount of cosolvent, and shall not contain more than five percent methanol more than trace amounts of MTBE, as provided in section 214A.18.

Sec. 29. Section 214A.16, Code 1999, is amended to read as follows:

214A.16 NOTICE OF BLENDED FUEL -- DECAL.

All if motor vehicle fuel kept, offered, or exposed for sale, or sold at retail containing over one percent ethanol, methanol, or any combination of oxygenate octane enhancers shall be identified as "with either ethanol, methanol, ethanol/methanol, or similar wording on containing a renewable fuel is sold from a motor vehicle fuel pump, the pump shall have affixed a decal identifying the name of the renewable fuel. All diesel fuel kept, offered, or exposed for sale, or sold at retail containing over one percent soybean oil by volume shall be identified as "with soydiesel" or similar wording on a decal. The decal may be different based on the type of renewable fuel used. The design and location of the decal decal shall be prescribed by rules adopted by the department. The department shall adopt the rules to be effective by January 17, 1995. A decal identifying a renewable fuel shall be consistent with standards adopted pursuant to section 159A.6. Until the department establishes standards for decals, the wording shall be on a white adhesive decal

~~with black letters at least one-half inch high and at least one-quarter inch wide placed between thirty and forty inches above the driveway level on the front sides of any container or pump from which the motor fuel is sold.~~ The department may approve an application to place a decal in a special location on a pump or container or use a decal with special lettering or colors, if the decal appears clear and conspicuous to the consumer. The application shall be made in writing pursuant to procedures adopted by the department. ~~Signs for a decal identifying a renewable fuel shall be consistent with standards adopted pursuant to section 159A.6.~~

Sec. 30. NEW SECTION. 214A.18 MTBE PROHIBITION.

1. A person shall not do any of the following:

- a. Sell motor vehicle fuel containing more than trace amounts of MTBE in this state.
- b. Store motor vehicle fuel containing more than trace amounts of MTBE in a motor vehicle fuel storage tank located in this state.

2. As used in this section, "trace amounts" means not more than one-half of one percent by volume.

DIVISION V
EFFECTIVE DATE

Sec. 31. EFFECTIVE DATE. The following provisions of this Act, being deemed of immediate importance, take effect upon enactment:

1. Section 7, relating to department of natural resources general fund sick leave payout.
2. Section 16, relating to supporting Iowa state university of science and technology, cooperative extension service in agriculture and home economics, in providing assistance to farm families.
3. Section 20, relating to a study conducted by the department of natural resources relating to water contamination in this state.

Sec. 32. CONTINGENT EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 22 of this Act, amending section 8.60, subsection 4, takes effect only if

chapter 192A is repealed by the Seventy-eighth General Assembly during its 2000 regular session.
