**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to the graduated driver's licensing system's  
2 requirements for full driver's licenses.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. Section 321.180B, subsections 3 and 4, Code  
2 2001, are amended to read as follows:

3 3. REMEDIAL DRIVER IMPROVEMENT ACTION OR SUSPENSION OF  
4 PERMIT OR INTERMEDIATE LICENSE. A person who has been issued  
5 an instruction permit or an intermediate license under this  
6 section, upon conviction of a moving traffic violation or  
7 involvement in a motor vehicle accident which occurred during  
8 the term of the instruction permit or intermediate license,  
9 shall be subject to remedial driver improvement action or  
10 suspension of the permit or license. A person possessing an  
11 instruction permit who has been convicted of a moving traffic  
12 violation or has been involved in an accident shall not be  
13 issued an intermediate license until the person has completed  
14 the remedial driver improvement action and has been accident  
15 and conviction free continuously for the six-month period  
16 immediately preceding the application for the intermediate  
17 license. A person possessing an intermediate license who has  
18 been convicted of a moving traffic violation or has been  
19 involved in an accident shall not be issued a full driver's  
20 license until the person has completed the remedial driver  
21 improvement action and has been accident and conviction free  
22 continuously for ~~the twelve-month-period-immediately-preceding~~  
23 ~~the-application-for-a-full-driver's-license~~ twelve months.

24 4. FULL DRIVER'S LICENSE. A full driver's license may be  
25 issued to a person seventeen years of age who possesses an  
26 intermediate license issued under subsection 2 or a comparable  
27 intermediate license issued by another state for a minimum of  
28 twelve months immediately preceding application, and who  
29 presents an affidavit signed by a parent or guardian on a form  
30 to be provided by the department that the intermediate  
31 licensee has accumulated a total of ten hours of street or  
32 highway driving of which two hours were conducted after sunset  
33 and before sunrise and the street or highway driving was with  
34 the licensee's parent, guardian, instructor, a person  
35 certified by the department, or a person at least twenty-five

1 years of age who had written permission from a parent or  
 2 guardian to accompany the licensee, whose driving privileges  
 3 have not been suspended, revoked, or barred under this chapter  
 4 or chapter 321J during the twelve-month period immediately  
 5 preceding the application for a full driver's license, and who  
 6 has been accident and conviction free continuously for ~~7~~-the  
 7 ~~twelve-month-period-immediately-preceding-the-application-for~~  
 8 ~~a-full-driver's-license~~ twelve months, and who has paid the  
 9 required fee.

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EXPLANATION

11 This bill amends the graduated driver's license provisions  
 12 in Code section 321.180B to provide that a 17-year-old  
 13 intermediate driver's licensee who applies for a full driver's  
 14 license may still receive a full driver's license if the  
 15 person was accident and conviction free continuously for 12  
 16 months. Currently, such a licensee is required to be accident  
 17 and conviction free continuously for the 12-month period  
 18 immediately preceding the person's application for a full  
 19 driver's license.

2 1. Page 1, by inserting after line 23, the  
3 following:  
4 "A person who has been issued an intermediate  
5 license and whose intermediate license is suspended,  
6 revoked, or barred under this chapter or chapter 321J  
7 may be issued a temporary restricted license for  
8 travel to and from work upon application to the  
9 department, under conditions provided by the  
10 department. However, notwithstanding any provision of  
11 this section or this chapter to the contrary, a person  
12 issued such a temporary restricted license who is  
13 convicted of a moving traffic violation or is involved  
14 in a contributive accident that occurred while the  
15 person was operating a motor vehicle pursuant to the  
16 temporary restricted license shall not be issued a  
17 full driver's license until the person reaches  
18 nineteen years of age."
